In Tennis, Serbian Novak Djokovic won the French Open 2023 men's singles final, clinching his 23rd Grand Slam title.

- Novak Djokovic has become the first man to reach the 23rd Grand Slam title.
- He won the title by defeating **Casper Rudd** in straight sets.
- The win gives Djokovic his third French Open title and surpasses Rafael Nadal's record for most title wins.
- He overtook Rafael Nadal as the oldest Roland Garros champion at the age of 36 years and 20 days.
- He also became the first person to win all **four Grand Slam** events at least three times.
