1. National Nutrition Week (Sept. 1, 2022)

National Nutrition Week is observed every year from **1st September to 7th September** by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.

IMPORTANT FACTS

- It is an annual nutrition program launched by the Food and Nutrition Board, Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India.
- The main objective of celebrating Nutrition Week is to raise awareness on the importance of nutrition for better health, which has an impact on growth, productivity, economic growth and ultimately national development.
- The theme of National Nutrition Week 2022 is 'Celebrate World of Flavour' by the Government of India.

Background :

- National Nutrition Week was first organised in March 1975 by members of the American Dietetic Association, now known as the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics, to raise public awareness of the need for nutrition education as well as to promote the profession of dietitians.
- After this, in the year 1982, India adopted this new mode and decided to start National Nutrition Week every year from 1 to 7 September.

National Nutrition Mission (Poshan Abhiyaan) :

- It was launched in 2018 by the Government of India with the aim of tackling the malnutrition problem prevalent in India.
- Its objective is to reduce the level of under-nutrition and also enhance the nutritional status of children in the country.
- Its goal is to remove malnutrition from the country by 2022.
- It improves nutritional outcomes for children, pregnant women and lactating mothers.

Aims :

- To reduce stunting and wasting by 2% a year (total 6% until 2022) among children.
- to reduce anaemia by 3% a year (total 9%) among children, adolescent girls and pregnant women and lactating mothers.

2. Arvind Kejriwal Launches Country's First Virtual School for Classes 9 to 12 (Sept. 1, 2022)

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has announced the launch of the **country's first virtual school in Delhi**.

IMPORTANT FACTS -

- The name of this school will be '**Delhi Model Virtual School**'.
- The classes in this virtual school will be completely online and the students will be able to complete the classes from their home.
- There will be no option of physical classes in the school. All classes will be online only which will also be recorded so that students can view the recorded classes later.
- In the initial phase, classes from class 9 to 12 will be held in it.
- Children from any state across the country will be able to take admission in this virtual school.
- This school with online classes will also have a digital library for the students.
- Happiness Classes, Patriotic Courses, Sports University, Skill University, Army Preparatory etc. have also been established by the Delhi Government.

Education Ministry refutes Delhi Government's claim :

4. India's first indigenously developed vaccine for cervical cancer launched (Sept. 1, 2022)

India's first indigenously developed **quadrivalent Human Papilloma Virus (HPV)** vaccine for the prevention of cervical cancer launched by Union Minister of Science and Technology **Jitendra Singh** in Delhi on 1 September.

IMPORTANT FACTS -

- The name of the vaccine is **CERVAVAC**.
- The Drug Controller General of India (DCGI) has given market authorization to Serum Institute of India (SII) to manufacture indigenously developed vaccine against cervical cancer.
- Cervical cancer is the second most frequent cancer in women in the age group of 15 to 44 years in India.

About CERVAVAC :

- Vaccine CERVAVAC has demonstrated robust antibody response that is approximately 1,000-fold higher based on all targeted HPV types and age groups.
- This vaccine protects women from cervical cancer.
- It has been developed by the **Serum Institute of India (SII)**.
- This vaccine will ensure the prevention of cancer caused by human papillomavirus (types 6, 11, 16 and 18).

About Cervical Cancer :

- It is a sexually transmitted infection.
- It occurs in the cells of the **cervix** (the lower part of the uterus) that connects to the vagina.
- It is mostly caused by long-term infection with **HPV**.
- It is the **second most prevalent cancer** form and the second leading cause of cancer death among women **aged 15-44**.
- Women who have HIV are six times more likely to develop cervical cancer than normal women.

Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI) :

- It comes under the **Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation (CDSCO)**.
- It is responsible for approval of licences of specified categories of drugs like blood and blood products, vaccines, IV fluids and sera in India.
- It sets the standards and quality of the manufacture, sale, import and distribution of drugs in India.

7. PM Modi to unveil new naval ensign (Aug. 31, 2022)

The Prime Minister will unveil the new naval ensign (flag) for the Indian Navy in Kochi on the sidelines of the commissioning of India's first indigenous aircraft carrier INS Vikrant at Cochin Shipyard Limited on 2 September.

IMPORTANT FACTS -

- The new Navy flag will be far from the colonial past and full of Indian heritage.
- The new naval ensign will replace the present ensign that carries the Saint George Cross with the Tricolour in the canton (top left corner of flag).

- This flag will essentially replace the pre-independence flag of the Indian Navy, which had a red George Cross on a white background with the Union Jack of the United Kingdom at the top left corner.
- The design of the new flag has not been made public yet.

What is a Naval Ensign?

- It is a maritime flag used by naval ships of different countries to denote their nationality.
- It may be similar to the national flag of the country or it may be different from it.
- In the case of India, the naval flag used by the Indian Navy is different from the national flag.

Indian Navy has changed its flag several times :

- This was changed during the pre-colonial era and after independence.
- The Indian Navy got its first flag during the colonial period under British rule.
- In 1928, the white flag of the Royal Navy was used by the Royal Indian Navy (1934 to 1950) along with the St. George's Cross and the Union Jack flag.
- After independence, on 26 January 1950, the Royal Indian Navy was renamed the Indian Navy, with the crest and flag "Indianised".
- Accordingly, the Union Jack on the earlier flag was replaced by the tricolor or national flag of India in the canton (upper left corner of the flag).
- In 2001, the flag of the Indian Navy was changed once again to distinguish it from the pre-colonial era.
- A blue spire of the Indian Navy was installed on a white background.
- The government decided to re-adopt St. George's Cross.
- In 2014, another change was made to the flag with the inclusion of the Indian national motto: Satyameva Jayate below the national emblem in Devanagari script.

What is the Saint George's Cross ?

- The red cross on white background is known as the Saint George's Cross.
- It is named after a Christian Warrior Saint who is believed to have been a crusader during the third crusade.
- This cross also serves as the flag of England which is a constituent of the United Kingdom.
- The flag was adopted by England and the City of London in 1190 to identify English ships entering the Mediterranean Sea.

8. G20 Digital Innovation Network event organised at Bali, Indonesia (Aug. 31, 2022)

The G20 Digital Innovation Network event will be held from **September 2-4** at the **Bali International Convention Centre, Bali, Indonesia.**

IMPORTANT FACTS -

- Startups based on Artificial Intelligence (AI) will participate in this program.
- Telangana AI Mission (T-AIM) has announced that four startups from Telangana AI Mission have been selected by MeitY to represent India in the G20 Digital Innovation Network (DIN).
- T-AIM is a state government initiative supported by NASSCOM.
- The four startups representing India in the G20 Digital Innovation Network are Aarficus, EduBooks, Unimart and MayaMD.
- All these are supported by the Revv Up program of Telangana Government.

Goal of the G20 Digital Innovation Network :

- The forum aims to find 100 most promising startups in 5 priority areas (Healthcare, Renewable Energy, Smart Society, Financial Inclusion and Supply Chain).

Theme of G20 Digital Innovation Network 2022 :

- The theme of this year's event is 'The Rise of Digital Economy: Post-Pandemic Recovery and Beyond'.

G20 Digital Innovation Network program launched :

- This forum was started by Italy in the year 2021 by selecting the ten best startups in the name of G20 Digital Innovation League.
- This year it has been renamed the G20 Digital Innovation Network.

About Telangana AI Mission (T-AIM) :

- Telangana AI Mission (T-AIM) Mission is an AI mission run by the Government of Telangana, which is operated by NASSCOM.
- Under T-AIM, a program called "Revv Up" is also run to enable AI startup. Which helps in providing a global platform to these startup groups for emerging technologies.
- Revv Up is a free-of-equity-or-cost acceleration program by T-AIM specifically designed for early-stage AI startups.
