1. Telangana formation day (June 2, 2022)

Telangana Formation Day is celebrated every year on 2nd June as Telangana emerged as the 29th state of India on 2nd June 2014.

- This day remembers the sacrifice and cooperation of all those people who laid down their lives in making this separate state.
- **History of State**
 - Telangana was divided from the erstwhile Madras on 1 November 1956 and the Telugu speaking people merged with Andhra Pradesh.
 - In 1969, there was a protest and agitation for a new state in the Telangana region.
 - After protests, a separate new state was formed in 1972 in the form of Andhra Pradesh.
 - After nearly 40 years of opposition, the Telangana Bill was passed in the Lok Sabha by the Congress Working Committee and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in February 2014.
 - The bill was introduced in the Indian Parliament in 2014 and the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act got its nod in the same year.
 - According to the bill, Telangana was formed by ten districts of north-western Andhra Pradesh.

2. World No Tobacco Day (June 1, 2022)

World No Tobacco Day is celebrated every year on 31 May with the aim of making people aware about the harmful effects of tobacco consumption.

- The theme of the year 2022 is "Protect the Environment".
- The World Health Organisation honours governments, organisations and individuals every year for their efforts and contributions to prevent tobacco use.
- This year, Jharkhand has been selected for the World No Tobacco Day (WNTD) Award-2022 by WHO.

• History of the day

- The World No Tobacco Day initiative was adopted by WHO in 1987.
- After this, resolution WHA 42.19 was passed in 1988, in which 31 May was issued as 'World No Tobacco Day'.
- Recently the Global Burden of Disease has published a study on the number of smokers around the world.

• Smokers in india

- According to this study, there were around 20 million smokers in the age group of 15-24 in India in 2019. This is the second largest number of tobacco smokers worldwide.

• Global scenario

- According to this study, the number of smokers increased to 1 billion in 2019.
- Tobacco use killed 7 million people.
- Among new smokers, 89% had become addicted by the age of 25.
- There are 155 million smokers worldwide aged 15-24.

• Top 10 countries with the highest number of smokers

- The top 10 countries are China, India, Indonesia, USA, Russia, Bangladesh, Japan, Turkey, Vietnam and Philippines.

3. World Milk Day (June 1, 2022)

Every year 1 June is celebrated as World Milk Day to draw attention to the activities related to the dairy sector.

- The day is celebrated to recognize milk as a global food and to celebrate the dairy industry.
- The World Milk Day 2022 theme is 'Dairy Net Zero'.
- It is celebrated every year on 1 June as World Milk Day since 2001 by the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) of the United Nations.
- 26 November is celebrated as National Milk Day, the birth anniversary of Varghese Kurien, father of white revolution and father of milk production in India.
- **Some other facts related to milk and milk products**
- India is the largest milk producer in the world accounting for 22 per cent of the global production. Next come the United States, China, Pakistan and Brazil.
- Uttar Pradesh is the largest milk producing state in India and accounts for more than 17% of the total milk production in India.
- The availability of milk in India is 406 grams per person per day.
- Ordinary milk consists of 85 percent water and the remaining part consists of solid elements i.e. minerals and fats.
- Milk is rich in protein, calcium and riboflavin (Vitamin B-2).
- Milk also contains vitamins A, D, K and E, including phosphorus, magnesium, iodine, and many minerals and fats and energy.
- The purity of milk is measured by a lactometer.
- National Milk Research Institute is located in Karnal (Haryana).
- An organic compound called lactose is found in milk.
- Fresh milk has a pH of 6, when milk turns into curd, its pH becomes less than 6.
- Lactobacillus bacteria help in curdling from milk.

4. World Thyroid Day (May 26, 2022)

World Thyroid Day is celebrated every year on 25 May.

- This day is celebrated with the aim of spreading awareness about thyroid and to know about the prevention and treatment of thyroid diseases.

- World Thyroid Day was first celebrated in the year 2008 by the American Thyroid Association (ATA) and the European Thyroid Association (ETA) with the aim of creating awareness about thyroid.

- **What is thyroid?**

- The thyroid is a small butterfly-shaped gland. It is located in the front of the neck.
- This gland produces tetraiodothyronine (T4) and triiodothyronine (T3) hormones in the body.
- Both these hormones released from the thyroid gland help all the cells of the body to function properly and both these hormones also contribute in controlling the process of metabolism.
- Thyroid problems arise when the thyroid gland produces more or less hormones, and due to this, every cell of the body starts getting affected.
- Hypothyroidism (sudden weight gain) is caused by a deficiency of thyroid hormones.
- An increase in thyroid hormones causes hyperthyroidism.
- Women are more prone to this disease than men.

5. International Day of Biodiversity- 22 May (May 23, 2022)

International Day of Biodiversity is celebrated every year on 22 May to raise awareness about the significant reduction in biological diversity caused by human activities.

- **Biodiversity** - It refers to the variety of flora and fauna that make up an ecosystem. Conservation of ecosystems is important for natural balance and human survival.
- India is included in the 10 countries with the most biodiversity in the world.
- **Purpose of the day**
 - (i) To increase understanding and awareness about the issues of biodiversity.
 - (ii) To make people aware about the importance of biodiversity on the one hand and its unprecedented loss on the other.
- **The theme of 2022** is "Building a shared Future for All Life".
- **History of the day**
 - The idea was to celebrate this day at the Biodiversity Conference on December 29, 1992 in Nairobi, Kenya.
 - Biodiversity Day was celebrated on 29th December till 2000, after that from the year 2001 it is celebrated on 22nd May.

6. 250th Birth Anniversary of Raja Ram Mohan Roy (May 21, 2022)

The Ministry of Culture is celebrating the 250th birth anniversary of Raja Ram Mohan Roy from 22 May 2022 to 22 May 2023 under the aegis of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav'.

- The opening ceremony will be held at Raja Ram Mohan Roy Library Foundation, Salt Lake, Kolkata and Science City Auditorium, Kolkata.
- During the event, a statue of Raja Ram Mohan Roy will be unveiled by the Minister of Culture, G Kishan Reddy at the Raja Ram Mohan Roy Library Foundation, Kolkata.

• About Raja Ram Mohan Roy

- Born - 22 May 1772 in a Hindu Brahmin family in Radhanagar village in West Bengal's Murshidabad district, Bengal.
- Gopal Krishna Gokhale called him the 'Father of Modern India'.
- He was one of the pioneers of the Indian Renaissance.
- He was awarded the title of Raja by the Mughal Emperor Akbar II.
- He opposed customs such as Sati, polygamy, child marriage, the rigidity of the caste system.
- He formed Atmiya Sabha (Friendly Society) In 1814. It was for the religious reforms in the society.
- In 1828 he founded the Brahmo Samaj.
- The Brahmo Samaj was a reformist movement of Hinduism that aimed to fight the social evils prevalent in the society.
- As a result of hard work in fighting the practice of Sati, the Governor of Bengal Presidency Lord William Bentinck banned the practice of Sati in the year 1829.
- He died of meningitis on September 27, 1833, at Stapleton, near Bristol, while on a visit to Britain.

7. Anti-Terrorism Day (May 21, 2022)

Anti-Terrorism Day is observed on 21st of May every year.

- It is observed on the death anniversary of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi.
- In 1991, he was assassinated in a suicide bombing, by Liberation of Tamil Tigers Eelam (LTTE) terrorist troop while campaigning at Sriperumbudur in Tamil Nadu.
- He served as the Prime Minister of India from 1984 to 1989.

- The Center decided to observe May 21 as Anti-Terrorism Day by the government of the then VP Singh.
- Anti-terrorism pledge is taken on this day in all government offices, public sector undertakings, other public institutions etc.
- Last year, the MHA had proposed that officers take an 'anti-terrorism oath' in their rooms/offices to avoid public gatherings during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- **Aim of the Day**
 - Raising awareness of terrorism and violence and how it affects the general public.
 - To demonstrate how harmful terrorism is to the country.

8. World Bee Day (May 20, 2022)

World Bee Day is celebrated every year on 20 May across the world.

- The day is observed to raise awareness about the essential roles played by bees in supporting people and the environment.
- Bees are known to be one of the hardest working organisms on the planet and bring immense benefits to the people and the natural ecosystem around them.
- Bees carry pollen grains from flower to flower and help with the production of fruits, nuts and seeds, which contribute significantly to food security and nutrition.
- **Theme of the year 2022**
 - 'Bee Engaged: Celebrating the diversity of bees and beekeeping systems'.
 - It is organised by the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO).
 - The event will focus on highlighting the importance of honeybees and sustainable beekeeping systems.
- **History and Significance of the day**
 - World Bee Day is celebrated on the birth anniversary of Slovenian beekeeper Anton Jansa, the pioneer of modern beekeeping.
 - He was born on 20 May 1734.
 - In 2016, Slovenia proposed celebrating World Bee Day on 20 May each year.
 - The first World Bee Day was observed on 20 May 2018.
 - Bees play a major role in maintaining the balance between humans, plants, animals and the environment.

9. International Museum Day 18 May (May 18, 2022)

International Museum Day is celebrated on 18 May across the world to raise awareness about how important museums are in the development of society.

• Background

- International Museum Day was established in 1977 by the International Council of Museums.
- The day aims to raise awareness of museums as an important means of cultural exchange, promotion of cultures and development of mutual understanding, cooperation and peace between peoples.

• About International Council of Museums (ICOM)

- It is the main and only organisation of museums and museum professionals with a global scope, committed to the promotion and protection of natural and cultural heritage, present and future, tangible and intangible heritage.
- It serves as a network of museum professionals (35,000 members in 137 countries) dealing in a wide range of museum and heritage-related disciplines.
- It was established in 1946 and is headquartered in Paris, France.

10. Sikkim Statehood Day 2022 (May 16, 2022)

The Prime Minister Narendra Modi has greeted the people of Sikkim on their Statehood Day, 16 May.

• Sikkim Statehood Day

- On May 16, 2022, Sikkim officially completed 47 years of becoming a state of India.

• About Sikkim

- Location - northeastern part of the country
- Capital - Gangtok
- Borders - Tibet Autonomous Region of China, Bhutan, West Bengal and Nepal
- Established - as 22nd state of India on 16th May 1975
- Ruler - Namgyal dynasty ruled Sikkim until 1975
- India's highest peak and the world's third highest mountain - Mount Kanchenjunga lies in Sikkim
- Rivers - Teesta river and its tributaries such as the Rangit, Lhonak, Talung and Lachung.

- Chief Minister - Prem Singh Tamang
- Governor - Ganga Prasad
