1. PM Modi to attend to third edition of Quad leaders' summit in Tokyo (May 20, 2022)

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will attend the Quad Leaders Summit in Tokyo on May 24 at the invitation of Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida.

- US President Joe Biden, Australian Prime Minister Scott Morrison and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida will attend the summit.
- The summit in Tokyo is the fourth meeting of the Quad Leaders since the first virtual meeting in March last year.
- During the visit, Modi will participate in business programs with Japanese business leaders.
- He will also address and interact with the Indian community in Japan.
- He will also hold a bilateral meeting with US President Joe Biden.
- The two leaders will review the India-US Strategic Partnership and act on discussions held during the bilateral meeting of the Prime Minister of India with the US President last September.
- Modi is also likely to hold bilateral talks with his Australian counterpart.
- **Purpose of the meeting**
 - To review progress of Quad Initiatives and Working Groups, identify new areas of cooperation and provide strategic guidance and vision for future collaborations.
 - The meeting will provide an opportunity to both the leaders to take forward the mutual dialogue after the 14th India Japan Annual Summit held in New Delhi in March this year.
- **About Quad**
 - This is known as the 'Quadrilateral Security Dialogue' (QSD).
 - It is an informal strategic forum comprising four nations - United States of America (USA), India, Australia and Japan.
 - It aims to work for a free, open, prosperous and inclusive Indo-Pacific region.
 - The first meeting of the Quad was held in 2007 on the sidelines of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN).
 - The Quad Summit provides an opportunity for leaders to exchange views on the development of the Indo-Pacific region and current global issues of mutual interest.
 - Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe was the first to consider the formation of the Quad in 2007.

2. Second phase of wellness mother campaign begins (May 19, 2022)

Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla launched the second phase of Suposhit Maa Abhiyan in Kota to keep pregnant women of the Kota Bundi region well-nourished.

- Under the campaign, a target has been set to nourish three thousand pregnant women, so that 2,000 women in Kota and 1 thousand in Bundi will get the benefit of the campaign.
- Under this campaign, nutrition kits will be provided to pregnant women for 9 months.
- In the year 2020, Suposhit Maa Abhiyan was started by identifying 1000 pregnant women with the goal of removing nutritional deficiency among women.
- Nutrition kit has been prepared by Hans Foundation for the beneficiary women and health cards were also provided to the women for monitoring.

- **Other efforts currently being made**

- **Nutrition campaign**

- Under POSHAN Abhiyaan (erstwhile National Nutrition Mission), all districts in 36 States/UTs have been covered in a phased manner.
- It is an integrated multi-ministerial mission to ensure the achievement of malnutrition free India by the year 2022.
- The main objective of POSHAN Abhiyaan is to reduce stunting in identified districts of India by improving access and quality of Anganwadi services. In addition, to ensure holistic development and adequate nutrition for pregnant women and post-delivery mothers and their children.

- **Goals of National Nutrition Mission 2022**

- To reduce low birth weight by 2% per annum from 2017 to 2022.
- Reducing stunting to the level of 25% by the year 2022.
- To reduce the level of anaemia existing in children below 5 years of age and women in the age group of 15-49 years by 3% annually from 2017 to 2022.

3. Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal inaugurates India-UAE Economic Partnership Summit (May 14, 2022)

Union Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal and UAE Economy Minister Abdullah bin Touq Al Marie inaugurated the India-UAE Economic Partnership Summit in Mumbai on 13 May.

- The two leaders also launched the India-UAE Start-up Bridge to boost the economy.
- The summit was organised by Confederation of Indian Industry.

- India and UAE have immense potential to work together and the Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) will open a lot of doors to markets across the world.

- **Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA)**

- The Comprehensive Trade Agreement between India and the United Arab Emirates will help generate employment opportunities and boost the growth of the domestic economy.
- The Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) is expected to increase bilateral trade in goods to over US\$100 billion and trade in services to over US\$15 billion within five years.
- The agreement paves the way for several sectors, especially labour intensive sectors such as textiles, gems and jewellery, pharmaceuticals and agriculture.
- The agreement will open doors not only for Indian and UAE businesses but also for other countries as the UAE is a transit point for large parts of Africa, CIS (Commonwealth of Independent States) countries and the Gulf region.
- CIS countries include Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Moldova, Russia, and Tajikistan.
- Indian pharma products will get immediate access to the UAE market.
- Bilateral trade will reach at least US\$ 100 billion in the near future.

4. Skill India International Centre to be set up at Varanasi (May 12, 2022)

NSDC International (NSDCI) and the Indian unit of DP World, Hindustan Ports Private Limited has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to develop a Skill India International Centre at Varanasi to skill Indian youth for pursuing overseas employment opportunities in logistics, port operations.

- The Skill India International Centre in Varanasi will provide skills as per international standards and will prepare candidates for global markets.
- Skill India International Centres aims to provide high quality training to Indian youth.
- The centres would host training facilities, providing skills as per the demand of international employers in countries like the United Arab Emirates (UAE), Canada, Australia and other countries.
- It will also have a wide network of partner organisations and foreign recruiters to facilitate the supply of skilled and certified workforce to other countries.
- These partnering organisations will work with NSDCI for aggregating demand from overseas markets.

5. Supreme Court stays on sedition law (May 12, 2022)

The Supreme Court suspended pending criminal trials and court proceedings under Section 124A (sedition) of the Indian Penal Code and allowed the British-era law to be reconsidered.

- The Supreme Court also restrained the Centre and the states from filing FRs, continuing investigations or taking punitive action under Section 124A.
- **About Sedition Law**
- Section 124A of the Indian Penal Code provides for the punishment of sedition.
- The IPC was enacted in 1860, under the British Raj.
- The then British government in India feared that religious preachers from the Indian subcontinent would wage war against the government.
- The need for such a law was felt after the successful suppression of the Wahhabi movement by the British.
- This section was used by the British to suppress activists in favour of national independence, including Tilak and Mahatma Gandhi, both of whom were found guilty and imprisoned.
- **Sedition as a cognizable offence**
- It was made a cognizable offence for the first time in history in India during the tenure of Prime Minister Indira Gandhi in 1973.
- A cognizable offence means arrest without a warrant.
- Two High Courts of India found it unconstitutional after independence, as it violates freedom of speech and expression.

6. Monkeypox virus case confirmed in U.K. (May 10, 2022)

A case of monkeypox virus has been reported in Britain, a person who returned after travelling to Nigeria has been confirmed with monkeypox virus.

- Monkeypox was first discovered in 1958.
- According to the World Health Organisation, the first case of monkeypox was reported in humans in the year 1970.
- **What is monkeypox virus ?**
- Monkeypox is a disease caused by a virus that is transmitted mostly from rats and monkeys to humans.
- The disease belongs to the orthopoxvirus genus, which includes variola virus, vaccinia virus, and cowpox virus.
- Monkeypox is a zoonosis, meaning it is a disease that spreads from an infected animal to humans.
- **Symptoms of monkeypox**
- Dark red spots on the body.
- Red rash on the skin.
- flu symptoms.
- symptoms of pneumonia.
- Fever and headache.
- Muscle pain.
- To get cold
- **treatment**
- There is no cure available for this disease. But smallpox vaccines, antivirals and VIG can be used to prevent this disease.

7. Pulitzer Prize 2022: India's Amit Dave, Danish Siddiqui get Pulitzer Prize (May 10, 2022)

The Pulitzer Prize 2022 in different fields of journalism, book, drama and music were announced on 9 May.

- The award winners include Indian journalists Adnan Abidi, Sana Irshad Mattoo, Amit Dave along with The Washington Post.
- The late Danish Siddiqui of Reuters photographer has been given this award posthumously.
- He was assassinated during a conflict between the Taliban and the Afghan army.

- **About Pulitzer Prize**
 - It was established in 1917.
 - It is administered by Columbia University and the Pulitzer Prize Board.
 - The award is named after Joseph Pulitzer.
 - He was a newspaper publisher who gave money in his will to Columbia University to launch a journalism school and establish the Prize.
 - Each winner receives a certificate and a US\$15,000 cash prize.
 - A gold medal is awarded to the winner in the Public Service category.

8. next census will be fully digital with 100 % accuracy; Birth and death register to be linked with census (May 10, 2022)

Home Minister Amit Shah has said that the next census will be completely digital with 100 percent accuracy.

- The birth and death register will be linked to the census.
- With the electronic process and enumeration of people, the census will be updated automatically after every birth and death in the country.
- Shah was inaugurating the new office building of the Directorate of Census Operations in Assam at Amingaon in Kamrup district on 9th May.
- The digital census will shape the 'policies of the country for the next 25 years'.
- The 2021 census was delayed due to the Covid pandemic and will be completed by 2024.
- The new software will have multiple uses as it will be linked to registration of births and deaths.
- As soon as someone is born, his/her details will be updated in the software.
- Once that person turns 18, his name will be registered in the voter list from the census office itself.
- Details like change of residence of people will also be updated through the software.

- **About Census**

- Census involves the process of collecting, compiling, analyzing, evaluating, publishing and disseminating statistical data about a population and its characteristics.
- The decennial census is conducted by the Office of the Registrar General and the Census Commissioner, Ministry of Home Affairs.
- It is conducted under the provisions of the Census Act, 1948.
- Census is a union subject under Article 246 of the Constitution of India.
- The first non-synchronous census in India was conducted in 1872 during the reign of Governor-General Lord Mayo.
- The first synchronous census was taken under British rule in February 1881, by W C Plowden (Census Commissioner of India).
- Since then, the census has been carried out uninterruptedly every ten years.
- Census 2011 was the 15th National Census of the country since 1872.
- This was the seventh census after independence.

9. Arvind Kejriwal announces startup policy for Delhi (May 9, 2022)

The cabinet chaired by Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal approved the proposal related to the Delhi Startup Policy-2021 of the Industries Department.

- Under this policy, the Delhi government aims to encourage, facilitate and support 15,000 startups by 2030.

- A Startup Policy Monitoring Committee will be constituted to oversee this policy, which will be headed by the Finance Minister of Delhi Government.
- Through the Startup Policy-2021, the Delhi government will also provide loans and other facilities to the people starting their enterprise without guarantee.

- **Incentives under Start Up Policy**

- Reimbursement of up to 50% on lease rentals. This can be up to a maximum of Rs 5 lakh every year.
- Reimbursement grants up to one lakh rupees (in India) and three lakh rupees (abroad) for making patents, trademarks, copyrights, industrial designs.
- Reimbursement of cost of exhibition stall or rent once in a year up to Rs.5 lakh or up to Rs.5 lakh for 100 percent for women, disadvantaged class or persons with disabilities and 50 per cent for others.
- 30 thousand per month as monthly allowance for operation or employee for one year.

10. NASA Climate Research Scientist Cynthia Rosenzweig Wins World Food Prize 2022 (May 9, 2022)

Recently the World Food Prize Foundation announced the name of Dr. Cynthia Rosenzweig from the United States of America as the winner of the World Food Prize 2022.

- Rosenzweig was awarded this prize for his research 'Understanding the relationship between climate and food systems and how both will change and forecast in the future'.
- The purpose of the World Food Prize is to recognize the achievements of individuals who have advanced human development by improving the quality, quantity or availability of food in the world.
- In the year 2021, the award was won by Dr. Shakuntala Harak Singh Thilstad, a leading nutritionist and in the year 2020, the award was won by Dr. Ratan Lal, an Indian American soil scientist.

- **About World Food Prize**

- The World Food Prize Prize was conceived in 1970 by Nobel Peace Prize winner Dr. Norman E. Borlaug for his work in global agriculture.
- The World Food Prize was instituted in 1986.
- It is also known as the "Nobel Prize for Food and Agriculture".
- Dr. M.S. Swaminathan who is known as the father of Green Revolution in India was the first person to receive this award in the year 1987.
- The award is presented each year in October on or around United Nations World Food Day (16 October).
- The prize winner is presented with a sculpture designed by renowned artist and designer, Saul Bass, in addition to a cash prize of US\$ 250,000.
- The World Food Prize Foundation is located in Des Moines, USA.
