1. Paralympics-IPC suspends Russian, Belarusian committees with immediate effect (Nov. 18, 2022)

Paralympics-IPC suspends Russian, Belarusian

The **International Paralympic Committee** has suspended the National Paralympic Committees (NPCs) of **Russia** and **Belarus** with immediate effect on November 17, 2022, dashing the hopes of para-athletes competing in the 2024 Paralympics.

Important facts

- Earlier athletes from both countries were barred from competing in the **Beijing 2022 Winter Paralympics** in March.
- Russia's suspension was passed by 64 votes against 39 at the IPC's Extraordinary General Assembly in Berlin.
- The suspension of the NPC of Belarus passed by 54 votes against 45.
- Both NPCs have been suspended for "inability to comply with their membership obligations under the IPC constitution".
- Due to the suspension, NPC Russia and NPC Belarus lose all rights and privileges of IPC membership, as per the IPC constitution.
- The Russian team was also banned from the **Rio Paralympics in 2016** over doping.
- NPC Russia and NPC Belarus have the right to appeal against this decision.

3. Carlos Alcaraz of Spain to end 2022 as the youngest ever world No. 1 ATP Player (Nov. 18, 2022)

Carlos Alcaraz of Spain to end 2022

Carlos Alcaraz of Spain has become the **youngest person** to be ranked No.1 on the ATP (Association of Tennis Professional) ranking since the .ATP started the ranking system in 1973 He will be **19 years, 214 days** on December 5, the 2022 year-end ranking date. He has broken the record held by **Lleyton Hewitt** of Australia who was 20 years, 275 days of age in 2001.

Carlos Alcaraz started the 2022 year as the 32nd ranked player on ATP ranking. This year he became the **second youngest male player** to win the US open Grand Slam title after Pete Sampras.

He becomes the first player outside of the Big Four of Novak Djokovic, Roger Federer, Andy Murray and Rafael Nadal to top the final rankings since Andy Roddick in 2003.

Association of Tennis Professional (ATP)

It was set up in 1972 as a body of the Men's professional Tennis players. .

It conducts various tournaments for professional men's tennis players worldwide.

It organises three types of tournaments or tours based on their importance.

The top ranked events are included in the **ATP tour**. The second ranked events are organised as the **ATP Challenger Tour** and its third ranked tournament are called the **ITF Men's Tennis tour**.

It Introduced the ranking system for players in **1973** and the **first no.1 ranked player was Ilie Nastase of Romania**.

In **2021** the no.1 ranked player was Serbian **Novak Djokovic**.

The Headquarters of ATP is in **London**, United Kingdom.

4. Sharath Kamal becomes the first Indian athlete to be elected to the ITTF Athletes' Commission (Nov. 17, 2022)

Sharath Kamal elected to the ITTF Athletes' Commission

Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna 2022 awardee Sharath Kamal has become the **first Indian player** to be elected in the International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) Athletes' Commission. The online elections took place between 7 to 13 November 2022

10 athletes were elected for the **ITTF Athletes' Commission** for a four-year term from 2022 to 2026.

Eight athletes were elected from Asia, Africa, Europe, South America, North America, and Oceania region and two were highest-voted para-athletes.

Amongst all elected players Sharath Kamal got the **second highest votes** after 2012 table tennis World Cup silver medallist Elizabeta Samara of Romania. Sharath Kamal was also recently elected as the member of the [Athletes' Commission](#) of the Indian Olympic Association (IOA).

International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF)

It is the governing body of Table Tennis in the world which was set up in 1926.

It is responsible for the organization of International Table Tennis tournaments including World Cups.

6. India's basketball legend Abbas Moontasir dead (Nov. 17, 2022)

India's basketball legend Abbas Moontasir dead

Former India basketball captain and Arjuna awardee **Ghulam Abbas Muntasir** passed away on November 16, 2022 in Mumbai after prolonged illness. He was 80.

Important facts

- He was born in **Mumbai in 1942**. He started playing in Nagpada by the American missionaries, later he started getting inclined towards basketball.
- His basketball debut came in **1960** in an exhibition game against Australia.
- He captained the national team in the 1969 and 1975 **Asian Basketball Championships in Bangkok**.
- He was part of the Indian team at the **1970 Asian Games**, which finished sixth after topping a group that also contained China, Thailand and Malaysia.
- In the same year, Muntasir was selected in the Asian All-Star team and received the **Arjuna Award**, the first basketball player to receive this honour.
- He was suspended for three years due to constant bickering with referees and officials in the country.
- He was also among the country's sports icons who shot for the 1987 film '**Freedom Run**' to promote national integration.

7. Mary Kom, PV Sindhu, Mirabai Chanu and Gagan Narang elected in IOA Athletes Commission (Nov. 15, 2022)

Olympic medalists **MC Mary Kom, PV Sindhu, Mirabai Chanu and Gagan Narang** are among 10 eminent sports persons selected as members of the **Indian Olympic Association's (IOA) Athletes Commission** on November 14, 2022.

Important facts

- The other seven members of the apex body are - Tokyo Olympics silver medallist weightlifter **Mirabai Chanu**, 2012 Olympics bronze winner shooter **Gagan Narang**, veteran table tennis player **Achanta Sharath Kamal**, hockey player **Rani Rampal**, cyclist **Bhavani Devi**, rower **Bajrang Lal** and former shot putter **OP Karhana**.
- All the 10 elected members of the apex body, five men and five women, were elected unopposed in the election.
- India's first Olympic individual gold medalist shooter **Abhinav Bindra** and former hockey captain **Sardar Singh** will join the commission as members of the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and the Asian Olympic Council (OCA), both with voting rights.

- **Bindra** was elected a member of the IOC Athletes Commission for **eight years in 2018** while **Sardar Singh** became a member of the OCA Athletes Commission for four years in **2019**.
- Under the new constitution of the Indian Olympic Association, the commission should have an equal number of female and male representatives.
- Two members of the commission will be in the IOA Executive Council whose election is to be held on December 10.

Olympic medalists **MC Mary Kom, PV Sindhu, Mirabai Chanu and Gagan Narang** are among 10 eminent sports persons selected as members of the **Indian Olympic Association's (IOA) Athletes Commission** on November 14, 2022.

Important facts

- The other seven members of the apex body are - Tokyo Olympics silver medallist weightlifter **Mirabai Chanu**, 2012 Olympics bronze winner shooter **Gagan Narang**, veteran table tennis player **Achanta Sharath Kamal**, hockey player **Rani Rampal**, cyclist **Bhavani Devi**, rower **Bajrang Lal** and former shot putter **OP Karhana**.
- All the 10 elected members of the apex body, five men and five women, were elected unopposed in the election.

Indian Sports Award

Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna Award

- It is the highest sporting award for a sports person in India. The Khel Ratna is awarded for outstanding performances in sports for over a period of four years.
- It was earlier called as **Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna** and its name was changed to Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna in **2021**.
- The award was started in 1991 -92 and the **first** sports person to be awarded was the legendary Chess player **Vishwanathan Anand**.
- Pistol shooter **Abhinav Bindra**, who won the first-ever individual gold medal for India at the Olympics at Beijing 2008, is the **youngest sports person to win the Khel Ratna**. He was 18 years old when he got the award.
- **Karnam Malleswari** was the **first Indian woman to receive the Khel Ratna** in 1994-95.

Arjuna Award

It was instituted in 1961. It is given to sportspersons for consistent good performance over a period of four years.

Hockey player **Anna Lumsden** was the first **woman** to win the Arjuna Award. She was conferred the prize in 1961.

Dronacharya Award for Coaches

- It is officially called the **Dronacharya Award for Outstanding Coaches in Sports and Games**, for coaches who help athletes achieve excellence over a period of four years.
- The Dronacharya Award was first given in 1985, and the **first** Dronacharya Award winner was wrestling Coach **Bhalchandra Bhaskar Bhagwat**.
- The **first woman to win the Dronacharya award** was athletics coach **Renu Kohli** in 2002.

Dronacharya Lifetime award

- It was instituted in 2011.
- It is given to coaches who have helped sportspersons achieve excellence over a period of 20 years or more.
- The first recipient(s) of the Dronacharya (Lifetime) Award were athletics coach **Kuntal Roy** and hockey coach **Rajinder Singh** in 2011.

Dhyan Chand Award for Lifetime achievement

It was instituted in 2002. It is given to a sports person for good performance and contribution towards the promotion of sports in an individual capacity.

The first recipients of the Major Dhyan Chand Award were Olympian boxer **Shahuraj Birajdar**, Indian men's hockey team player **Ashok Diwan** and **Aparna Ghosh**, an accomplished player and coach with the Indian women's basketball team.

Maulana Abul Kalam Azad Trophy

- It is the **oldest** National Sports Awards in India which was instituted in 1956-1957.
- The award is given to the University for Top Performance in inter-university tournaments over the last one year.
- **Bombay University was the first winner** of the Maulana Abul Kalam Azad Trophy.
- **Guru Nanak Dev University** from Amritsar, Punjab has won it a record **23 times**.

Rashtriya Khel Protsahan Puruskar

It was instituted in 2009. It is awarded to organisations or corporates (both private and public) and individuals for playing a role in the area of sports promotion and development over the last three years.

Tenzing Norgay National Adventure Award

It was set up in 1994 in the memory of **Tenzing Norgay**. He is an Indian of Nepali origin who along with a New Zealand mountaineer **Edmund Hillary** scaled Mount Everest on **29 May 1953**.

The award is given in adventure sports like mountaineering, skydiving, and open water swimming.

10. Sri Lanka to host U-19 Men's T-20 World Cup 2024 (Nov. 14, 2022)

Sri Lanka to host U-19 Men's T-20 World Cup 2024

The International cricket governing body [International Cricket Council](#) (ICC) on 13 November 2022, announced host countries for U19 events between 2024 and 2027. The name of the host was announced after the Board meeting of the ICC was held at **Melbourne**, Australia on 12 November 2022.

The ICC U19 Men's ODI Cricket World Cup 2024 will be hosted by **Sri Lanka** while the 2026 edition will be staged in **Zimbabwe and Namibia**.

The ICC U19 Women's T20 World Cup 2025 will be held in **Malaysia and Thailand**, and the 2027 event will be jointly hosted by **Bangladesh and Nepal**.

The **first ever** ICC U19 Women's T20 world cup will be held in **South Africa** in January 2023.

ICC also declared the qualification pathway for the 10-team 2024 women's T20 World Cup to be hosted by **Bangladesh**. Eight teams will qualify for the event automatically comprising the top three teams from each group from 2023, T20 World Cup.

The remaining two teams will be identified through the 10-team ICC Women's T20 World Cup Global Qualifier.

The qualification pathway for the 14-team men's World Cup 2027 was also decided with ten teams gaining automatic qualification. The remaining four teams will qualify via the ICC CWC Global Qualifier.

The ICC men's World Cup ODI 2027 will be jointly hosted by **South Africa, Zimbabwe and Namibia**.
