An overview of the news

• The Embassy of India, Paris, France, in association with the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), the Mouvement des entreprises de France(MEDEF) and the Indo French Chamber of Commerce and Industry(IFCCI), organised the India – France Business Summit.

- Critical and Emerging Technologies: The New Strategic Frontier
- Defence Cooperation: Securing a Shared Future Through Atmanirbhar Bharat
- France and India: Springboard to Europe and Indo-Pacific
- CEOs Roundtable

Trade between India and France

- Bilateral trade with France has reached US\$ 10.75 billion in the last decade and has shown steady growth. Both sides have taken forward the discussions on the India-EU Trade and Investment Agreement.
- Agreements worth **about \$16 billion** have been signed at the trade summit.
- Nearly **1,000 French companies** are present in India while over a hundred Indian businesses have established a presence in France.

India, France bilateral relations

- France is the first country with which India started a **strategic dialogue after its 1998 nuclear tests.**
- Both sides recognized the importance of discussing the India-EU Trade and Investment Agreement.
- In 2005, an agreement was signed to build **six Scorpene submarines** in India with the help of France.
- There has been an agreement between the Government of France and India for 36 Rafale aircraft.

3. Piyush Goyal's two-day visit to Italy (April 14, 2023)

Piyush Goyal's two-day visit to Italy

Union Minister of Commerce and Industry **Piyush Goyal** was visiting **Rome** on 12 April 2023 on a two-day visit to **Italy.**

An Overview of the News:

- Shri Goyal met **Antonio Tajani, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs,** Government of Italy to review all aspects of bilateral trade and economic relations.
- Both the Ministers exchanged views on leveraging the India-Italy trade and economic partnership for development in various sectors.
- After the state visit of Italian **Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni** to India on 2 March 2023, efforts were made to elevate the bilateral relationship to the level of a strategic partnership.

Suggestion for formation of Joint Working Group:

• Tajani suggested setting up of a joint working group in strategic areas such as space, technology, defence, agriculture etc. to keep abreast of important developments in these areas.

Bilateral trade with Italy:

- Bilateral trade between India and Italy to be around **US\$ 16 billion** in 2022.
- Shri Goyal briefed about the progress made in India-EU FTA negotiations. Both the Ministers underlined the importance of a free, balanced and fair **Free Trade Agreement** and hoped that it would be concluded soon.

An Overview of the News:

- The **Tulsi Ghat Renovation Project** is an initiative aimed at enhancing the aesthetic appeal of **Varanasi**, the oldest inhabited city in the world.
- Uganda was supported to chair the Non-Aligned Movement from Africa for the period from 2022 to 2025. The position of chair of NAM rotates every three years during the summits.

An overview of the news

- According to the information given by the Ministry, the First Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine **Emin Zhaparova** will be on an official visit to India from 9 to 12 April.
- Jhaparova held talks with **Sanjay Verma**, Secretary (West) in the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA). In which the two sides are expected to discuss bilateral relations, exchange views on the current situation in Ukraine and global issues of mutual interest.
- In India, Jhaparova will also meet Minister of State for External Affairs and Culture Meenakshi Lekhi and Deputy National Security Advisor Vikram Misri.
- In the context of the Russia-Ukraine conflict, India has urged both sides to find a peaceful solution to the disputes.

An overview of the news:

• According to the Union Ministry of External Affairs, the External Affairs Minister will be on a visit to Uganda from 10 to 12 April. During this he will hold delegation level talks with Ugandan Foreign Minister General JJ Odongo.

S Jaishankar is also expected to meet prominent leaders of the country Uganda and other ministers.

- He is also likely to meet the country's leadership and other ministers.
- The External Affairs Minister will inaugurate the transit campus of the **National Forensic Science University (NFSU)** to be set up in collaboration with India.
 - This will be the first campus of this university outside India. Jaishankar will also address a group of Ugandan businessmen and industrialists.
- During this, MoU is also expected to be signed between India and Uganda for setting up the first campus of NFSU outside India.

- He also invited Japanese defence industries to **explore investment opportunities in India** under the '**Make in India' initiative**.
- Both sides agreed to diversify cooperation in new and emerging domains such as the **defence sector and cyber.**
- India and Japan reiterated their commitment to a strong defence partnership and agreed to explore opportunities to further enhance bilateral cooperation.
- **Defense Policy Dialogue is an institutional mechanism** between India and Japan to discuss bilateral defence cooperation.

- The 'Strategic Water Partnership' was launched during a virtual meeting between the Prime Ministers of India and the Netherlands in April 2021.
- The partnership provides the necessary impetus to expand bilateral water cooperation.
- The Netherlands is associated with various states and municipalities, including Uttar Pradesh, Delhi, Gujarat, Punjab, West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, Kerala and Maharashtra, in various water resources projects.
- River-city alliance between the two countries for river-sensitive cities and technologically driven nature-based solutions for river rejuvenation.

India-Netherlands Relations

- India and the Netherlands enjoy long-standing warm and friendly relations based on shared values of democracy, rule of law, human rights and historical bonds of friendship.
- Both countries share common ideals of democracy, pluralism and rule of law.
