4. World Blood Donor Day - 14 June (June 14, 2023)

- English physician **Richard Lower** contributed significantly to blood donation.
- Lower's book, '**Tractatus de Cordae**', documented his important work on blood transfusion and the functioning of the cardiopulmonary system.

5. International Albinism Awareness Day - 13 June (June 13, 2023)

International Albinism Awareness Day - 13 June

International Color Blindness (Albinism) Awareness Day is observed annually on **13 June.**

An Overview of the News

- The day aims to create awareness about albinism, a genetic skin condition.
- It seeks to promote the rights and regulation of persons with albinism globally.
- The theme for the International **Albinism** Awareness Day 2023 is "Inclusion is Power."
- The theme is based on the previous year's 2022 theme "**United in making our voices heard**".

History of International Albinism Awareness Day

- In 2013, the United Nations Human Rights Council recognized albinism as a human rights issue.
- The resolution condemns global violence and discrimination against persons with albinism.
- On 18 December 2014, the United Nations General Assembly designated 13 June as the International Color Blindness Awareness Day.
- The National Organization for Albinism and Hypopigmentation (NOAH) actively participated in a United Nations program following the adoption of the resolution.

Albinism:

- Albinism is a group of heritable conditions associated with decreased or absent melanin in ectoderm-derived tissues (most notably the skin, hair, and eyes), yielding a characteristic decrease in skin pigmentation.
- Patients with albinism are particularly susceptible to solar damage, and these patients must utilise lifelong sun protection precautions.
- These patients should be educated on avoidance of prolonged UV light exposure and avoidance of medications that increase photosensitivity.
- This activity reviews the evaluation and management of albinism and highlights the role of the interprofessional team in the recognition and management of this condition.

6. World Day Against Child Labour - 12 June (June 12, 2023)

World Day Against Child Labour is celebrated every year on **12th June**.

An Overview of the News

- The day aims **to inspire a global movement against child labour**.
- The theme for World Day Against Child Labour 2023 is "**Social Justice for All. End Child Labour!**"
- The International Labour Organization launched this program in 2002 to **address the issue of child labour at the international level**.
- The day aims to inspire individuals, organizations and governments to combat child labour and work towards its permanent elimination.

- It is a global initiative established by the **International Laboratory Accreditation Cooperation (ILAC)** and the **International Accreditation Forum (IAF)**.
- 2023 Theme: "**Accreditation: Supporting the Future of Global Business.**"
- **Objective:** To raise awareness of the value and importance of recognition.
- Promotes the quality, safety and reliability of products, services and systems.
- Lowers trade barriers and promotes innovation.

- The ILAC/IAF mutual recognition arrangement enhances supply chain efficiency.
- Accreditation confirms that conformity assessment bodies (CABs) meet standards.
- CABs provide services such as testing, inspection and certification.

History of World Accreditation Day:

- World Accreditation Day (WAD) was **established in 2008** by the **International Accreditation Forum (IAF)** and the **International Laboratory Accreditation Cooperation (ILAC)**.
- WAD aims **to raise awareness of the importance of accreditation** in ensuring quality, safety and reliability.
- It is observed annually on 9 June, which marks the anniversary of the signing of the **ILAC Mutual Recognition Arrangement (MRA)** in 1994.
- ILAC is an agreement between MRA accreditation bodies that enables mutual recognition of accreditation across countries.
- ILAC facilitates international trade by fostering trust and confidence in MRA conformity assessment results.
- The WAD serves as a forum for activities and initiatives to increase public understanding of recognition.

8. World Oceans Day - 8 June (June 8, 2023)

World Oceans Day is celebrated annually on **8 June**.

An Overview of the News

- It serves as a global reminder of the important role the oceans play in sustaining life on Earth.
- Recognized by the United Nations, it promotes ocean awareness and encourages action to protect the marine environment.

- The inaugural World Food Safety Day was observed on **June 7, 2019**, marking an important milestone in global efforts to address food security challenges.
- The establishment of this day strengthens global efforts to maintain food security and ensure the consumption of safe food.
