3. RBI approves the reappointment of Sandeep Bakshi as MD & CEO of ICICI Bank (Sept. 12, 2023)

4. Dennis Austin, co-creator of Microsoft PowerPoint, dies at 76 (Sept. 12, 2023)

Dennis Austin, one of the co-creators of Microsoft PowerPoint, has died at the age of 76.

An Overview of the News

- Dennis Austin, along with Robert Gaskins, developed PowerPoint and introduced it in 1987.
- Austin and Gaskins were both part of the software company Forethought, which was later acquired by Microsoft for \$14 million shortly after the launch of PowerPoint, which was originally named Presenter.
- Initially, PowerPoint was available exclusively for the Macintosh platform.

About Dennis R. Austin's career:

- Dennis R. Austin was the lead software developer of PowerPoint from 1985 to 1996, focusing on versions for Apple Macintosh computers.
- He began his career in the computer division of General Electric in Arizona, followed by positions at Honeywell in Massachusetts and Burroughs in California.
- In late 1984 Forethought, Inc. He became a software developer for Gavilon Computer.
- At Forethought, Robert Gaskins initiated the development of graphical presentation software that later became PowerPoint, with Austin as the lead developer.
- Tom Rudkin joined the PowerPoint project and made significant programming contributions along with Austin.

Microsoft acquired Forethought in 1987, and Austin remained as the lead developer of PowerPoint until 1996.

5. Parliament of Vanuatu elects Sato Kilman as the new Prime Minister (Sept. 10.2023)

Vanuatu Parliament elects Sato Kilman as Prime Minister amid political change.

An Overview of the News

- The decision came after a court upheld a no-confidence motion against Kilman's predecessor.
- Former Prime Minister and People's Progressive Party leader Sato Kilman took the position with 27 votes in favor.
- In the secret ballot, his rival Kalsakau got 23 votes.
- Kilman, 65, held the post of deputy prime minister in Kalasakau's government before he was ousted in May.

About Vanuatu

- It is an archipelago consisting of 83 islands, 16 of which are inhabited.
- Its largest islands include Espiritu Santo, Malacula, Efate, Eromango, Ambrym, Tanna, Pentecost, Apé, Ambe (also known as Aoba), Gaua, Vanua Lava, Maevo, Malo, and Anitium (or Anatome).
- Its capital is Port Vila, located on the island of Efate.
- Its other important cities include Luganville on Espiritu Santo and Isangel on Tanna.
- Vanuatu has three official languages: Bislama, English and French.
- Bislama is a Creole language spoken by the majority of the population of Vanuatu.
- The official currency used in Vanuatu is the vatu (VUV), which is pegged to the Australian dollar, resulting in a relatively stable exchange rate.

6. SPG Chief Arun Kumar Sinha responsible for PM Modi's security passed away (Sept. 7, 2023)

Arun Kumar Sinha, director of the Special Protection Group (SPG), responsible for the security of Prime Minister Modi, died at the age of 61 in Gurugram.

- Arun Kumar Sinha was an Indian Police Service (IPS) officer of the 1987 Kerala cadre.
- He assumed the role of Director of SPG in March 2016 and was initially appointed on a contract basis, with a tenure of up to May 31, 2024, in the rank and compensation of Director General of Police.

- May 31, underlining his commitment to the role.
- Arun Kumar Sinha had a varied career, serving in various positions in his home cadre state Kerala, and in the Border Security Force (BSF) at the Centre.

Role of SPG:-

- The Special Protection Group (SPG) was **established in 1985.**
- Its primary mission is to protect the Prime Minister of India.
- SPG has a strength of around 3,000 personnel.
- It remains a central force in ensuring the security of the country's highest office.

7. Hindustani classical singer Malini Rajurkar passed away at the age of 82 (Sept. 7, 2023)

Renowned Hindustani classical singer Malini Rajurkar has passed away at the age of 82.

- Malini Rajurkar was known for her simplicity and deep artistry in music.
- He was a notable presence in India's major music festivals including **Gunidas** Sammelan (Mumbai), Tansen Samaroh (Gwalior), Sawai Gandharva Mahotsav (Pune) and Shankar Lal Mahotsav (Delhi).
- Malini Rajurkar was highly regarded for her expertise in Tappa and Tarana styles of music.
- He also ventured into light music and gained popularity for rendering Marathi Natyageet and other compositions.
- Born in 1941 in Ajmer, Rajasthan, she received her musical education at Ajmer Sangeet College under the guidance of Govindrao Rajurkar and Vasantrao Rajurkar, who later became her husband.
- She was an exponent of the **Gwalior Gharana** and was known for her mastery of the **'Khayal' and 'Tappa'** styles in Hindustani classical music.

Differences in Classical Music in India: Hindustani and Carnatic Traditions

- In India, there is a historical perspective that music was unified by the **13th century AD.**
- After this period, it began to split into two distinct forms: **Hindustani** and **Carnatic** classical music.
- The Government of India officially recognizes these two classical music traditions.
- Carnatic classical music is mainly practiced in the southern Indian states of Kerala, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh and Telangana.

- Renowned Carnatic singer M.S. Subbalakshmi comes from this tradition.
- In the rest of India, classical music is called Hindustani music.

8. Neeraj Mittal appointed as Secretary, Department of Telecommunications (DoT) (Sept. 7, 2023)

Neeraj Mittal was appointed as Secretary in the Department of Telecommunications (DoT) by the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC).

- Neeraj Mittal is a 1992-batch Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officer.
- He is currently serving as the Principal Secretary in the Department of Information Technology, Tamil Nadu.

10. ISRO condoles the death of Valarmathi, the famous voice behind the Chandrayaan-3 countdown (Sept. 6, 2023)

Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) scientist N Valarmathi died due to a cardiac arrest.

- N Valarmathi was known for her key role in providing countdown announcements for rocket launches held in Sriharikota.
