1. Manipur Pledges to Combat Drug Menace on International Drug Day (June 26, 2024)

The International Day against Drug Abuse & Illicit Trafficking was observed across Manipur.

An Overview of the News

- Theme: "The Evidence is Clear: Invest in Prevention."
- Manipur, bordering Myanmar, has struggled with drug abuse for many years.
- A pledge to eradicate the drug menace was made during the observance.

State Government and Police Actions:

3. Assam Secretariat Becomes India's First Eco-Friendly State HQ (June 20, 2024)

The Assam secretariat has made history as India's first eco-friendly state government headquarters, inaugurating a 2.5 Megawatt (MW) solar power project on the Janata Bhawan campus in Dispur, Guwahati, Assam.

An Overview of the News

• Costing Rs 12.5 crore, this grid-connected rooftop solar plant enables the entire complex to operate solely on solar energy.

Financial and Environmental Impact

- Implementation of the solar power project is projected to save Rs 30 lakh per month in electricity costs.
- This initiative underscores Assam's commitment to sustainable practices and reducing carbon footprint.

Energy Efficiency Measures

- Automatic disconnection facilities for power are scheduled from 8-9 pm, with exceptions for critical areas like the home, finance, and Chief Minister's secretariat.
- This measure aims to optimize energy usage and promote responsible electricity consumption.

Policy Changes

- Effective July 2024, ministers and officials residing in official quarters will assume responsibility for their electricity bills, ending a long-standing practice.
- This policy shift aligns with efforts to enhance fiscal discipline and promote accountability in energy consumption.

Consumer Benefits

- The Assam Power Distribution Company Ltd (APDCL) plans to reduce power tariffs by Re 1 per unit starting April 1, 2025.
- This reduction is expected to benefit consumers across the state, making electricity more affordable and accessible.

4. Assam CM Inaugurates Janata Bhawan Solar Project (June 17, 2024)

On 16 June, Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma inaugurated the Janata Bhawan Solar Project in Guwahati.

An Overview of the News

• This project features a 2.5-MW power generation capacity with a grid-connected rooftop and ground-mounted solar PV system.

Financial and Energy Details

- Electricity Generation: The system is expected to yield an average of 3 lakh units of electricity monthly.
- Investment: The project required an investment of 12.56 crore rupees.
- Payback Period: The investment is projected to be recovered within 4 years.
- Savings: Monthly savings are estimated at approximately 30 lakh rupees.

Environmental Impact

- Carbon Emissions: The solar plant will reduce carbon emissions by 3,060 metric tonnes annually.
- Lifespan: The solar plant has a lifespan of 25 years.

Significance

• First in India: The Assam Secretariat Complex becomes the first-ever civil secretariat in the country to rely entirely on solar-generated electricity.

6. Indian diplomat Abhay Thakur appointed as the next envoy to Myanmar (March 27, 2024)

Senior Indian diplomat Abhay Thakur has been appointed the next Ambassador to Myanmar and the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) announced the appointment on March 26.

An Overview of the News

- Thakur, a 1992-batch officer of the Indian Foreign Service (IFS), is currently serving as an Officer on Special Duty in the Ministry of External Affairs.
- He previously held the position of **Sous-Sherpa** (deputy representative) for the G20 process during India's chairmanship.
- Thakur's appointment underlines India's diplomatic engagement with Myanmar.

Important times for India-Myanmar relations:

- Timing of appointment: Given the current circumstances, Thakur's selection as India's envoy to Myanmar is significant.
- Political unrest: Mass violent protests are taking place in Myanmar following the military coup on February 1, 2021, advocating for the restoration of democracy.
- India's stand: India advocates restoring "inclusive federal democracy" in Myanmar through dialogue and constructive engagement among all stakeholders.

Strategic Neighborhood Bond:

- Geographical proximity: Myanmar shares a 1,640-km-long border with several northeastern Indian states, including Nagaland and Manipur.
- Strategic Importance: Myanmar holds strategic importance as one of the neighboring countries of India.

Engagement in Global Diplomacy:

• Participation: Thakur participated in the G20 Development Working Group meeting in Brasilia as an Officer on Special Duty (G20).

7. Champawat and Pithoragarh districts included in the Swadesh Darshan 2.0 scheme to promote tourism (Sept. 23, 2023)

- As part of the Swadesh Darshan scheme, Gunji, a place in Pithoragarh district, is set to take up development work in the tourism sector, with an allocated budget of Rs 75 crore.

Swadesh Darshan Scheme:

- Swadesh Darshan Scheme is a central sector scheme launched by the Ministry of Tourism. Government of India.
- It aims to develop theme-based tourism circuits while enhancing the potential of India's tourism sector.
- The scheme is aligned with other national programs such as Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Skill India, and Make in India to harness the potential of tourism for employment generation and economic growth.

15 theme-based circuits under Swadesh Darshan:

- 1. Buddha Circuit: Covers important Buddhist pilgrimage sites in states like Madhya Pradesh, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat and Andhra Pradesh.
- 2. Coastal Circuit: It aims to promote India as a "Sun, Sea and Surf" destination covering the states along the coastline.
- 3. Desert Circuit: Focuses on showcasing the deserts of India including the Thar Desert, Kutch and areas like Ladakh and Himachal Pradesh.
- 4. Eco Circuit: Develops eco-friendly and natural destinations in states like Kerala, Uttarakhand, Madhya Pradesh, Telangana, Mizoram and Jharkhand.
- 5. Heritage Circuit: Preserves and promotes cultural heritage at UNESCO World Heritage sites in many states.
- 6. North East Circuit: Promotes tourism development in the North Eastern states.
- 7. Himalayan Circuit: Extends to the northern border states including Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand and the North-East region.
- 8. Sufi Circuit: Celebrates Sufi practices and cultural heritage.

About the Ministry of Civil Aviation
