- Dr. Kalam joined the 'Indian Space Research Organization' in the year 1962 and there he got the credit of making India's first indigenous satellite (SLV-III) missile as the project director.
- Abdul Kalam is considered the father of India's missile program.
- The United Nations (UN) designated 15 October as World Students' Day in the year 2010, marking Dr. Kalam's birthday.
- Dr. Kalam was awarded honorary doctorates by 48 universities and institutions in India and abroad.

- He also served as the Chief Scientific Adviser to the Prime Minister from 1992 to 1999.
- Dr. Kalam was awarded the Padma Bhushan in the year 1981, the Padma Vibhushan in the year 1990 and the 'Bharat Ratna' in the year 1997.
- He died of cardiac arrest on 27 July 2015 during a program at the Indian Institute of Management Shillong.
