1. PM Modi conferred with highest civilian honours by Fiji, Papua New Guinea (May 22, 2023)

Narendra Modi

Prime Minister**Narendra Modi** was conferred with the **highest honor by Fiji and Papua New Guinea** on 21 May.

An overview of the news

- PM Modi was honored with the island nation's highest civilian award during his visit to Papua New Guinea to attend the 3rd India-Pacific Islands Cooperation (FIPIC) summit.
- PM Modi was awarded "The Companion of the Order of Fiji" by his Fijian counterpart Sitweni Rabuka for his global leadership, a rare honor for a non-Fijian.
- Papua New Guinea conferred its highest civilian honour, Grand Companion of the Order of Loghu (GCL) on PM Modi for his efforts towards unity of the Pacific island nation.

2. Mahatma Gandhi Scholarships awarded to 300 students in Sri Lanka (May 21, 2023)

Recently three hundred school students from all 25 districts of Sri Lanka have received the prestigious Mahatma Gandhi Scholarship.

An overview of the news

- Indian High Commissioner to Sri Lanka Gopal Baglay, Sri Lankan Education Minister Dr. Sushil Premjayantha and Minister of State for Education A.K. Arvind Kumar provided scholarships to the students.
- The scholarship provides **2500 Sri Lankan Rupees per student per month** to the top six students from each district based on merit.
- This year, two batches of scholarships were awarded simultaneously to compensate for the disruptions caused by **COVID-19** during the period 2021-2022.
- During the ceremony, the High Commissioner emphasized the importance of bilateral cooperation in the education sector for the bright future of the youth in Sri Lanka and India.
- Drawing parallels between the philosophies of **Mahatma Gandhi and Buddha**, he said Gandhi's ideals remain relevant even in a rapidly changing world.

- Mahatma Gandhi Scholarship plays a vital role in promoting educational opportunities for students in Sri Lanka.
- By providing financial support, these scholarships enable students to pursue their academic aspirations and fulfill their potential.
- In addition to the Mahatma Gandhi Scholarship, the Government of India offers about 210 scholarships annually to Sri Lankan students in fields such as engineering, technology, arts, science and indigenous medicine.
- The Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation Scheme offers over 400 scholarships to Sri Lankan government officials to enhance their domain knowledge.
- Furthermore, there are thousands of seats available for Sri Lankan students in India under the Study in India program.

3. Cochin Port bags Sagar Shreshta award 2023 (May 13, 2023)

- Tennis player Carlos Alcaraz, who won the 2022 U S Open and rose to number one in the ATP rankings, was named the Laureus World Breakthrough of the Year.
- Christian Eriksen, who recovered from the cardiac arrest received the Laureus World Comeback of the Year Award.

- The nominees for the Laureus World Sports Awards are selected by the global media, while the winners are determined by the 71 members of the Laureus World Sports Academy.
- The award was instituted in the **year 2000** and is presented annually.

6. Three jailed Iranian women journalists win UN press freedom prizes (May 3, 2023)

Three jailed Iranian women journalists win UN press freedom prizes

The **United Nations** announced on 2nd May that its **premier prize for press freedom** has been awarded to **three imprisoned Iranian female journalists "for their commitment to truth and accountability."**

An overview of the news

- Award winners include Niloufer Hamidi, Elaheh Mohammadi and Nargis Mohammadi.
- Neelofer had informed people about **22-year-old Mahsa Amini**, who had died in September last year, through a news item.
- Amini was arrested by the ethics police for not wearing a headscarf properly.
- Elaheh wrote about Amini's funeral.
- · Amini's death triggered months of protests in Iran's cities.
- The third winner, Nargis Mohammadi, worked for many years as a journalist and is one of Iran's most prominent activists.

UNESCO World Press Freedom Prize

- This award was started in 1997.
- The award is given to a person, organization or institution who, at the risk of life, has made an outstanding contribution to the defense and, or promotion of freedom of the press, anywhere in the world.
- The award was established at the initiative of the Executive Board of UNESCO.
- The award is formally presented by UNESCO on the occasion of World Press Freedom Day on 3 May.
- The award is named in honor of **Guillermo Cano Isaza**, a **Colombian journalist** who was **assassinated** on 17 December 1986 in front of the office of his newspaper **El Espectador in Bogotá, Colombia.**

7. British-Indian Meera Syal to be awarded BAFTA TV fellowship (May 2, 2023)

Meera Syal, who starred in the hit BBC comedy, Goodness Gracious Me and The Kumars at No 42, will be honored at the BAFTA (British Academy of Film and Television Arts) Television Awards on May 14 at the Royal Festival Hall.

An overview of the news

- It is the highest honor given to an individual for **outstanding and extraordinary** contribution in the field of film, sports or television.
- Sanya is best known for her performances in 'Goodness Gracious Me' and 'The Kumars at No 42'.
- As part of the fellowship, she will inspire and support interested candidates through **BAFTA's year-long programmes**.
- She will appear in two new flagship series this autumn The Wheel of Time and Mrs. Sidhu Investigates.
- Born to **Punjabi parents from New Delhi**, Syal's cross-cultural stories and performances have been instrumental in showcasing **positive representations of British-Asian stories and talent on screen.**
- Her work has garnered several **BAFTA nominations and wins.**
- Syal has been awarded the **Women in Film and TV Award for Creative Innovation, Honorary Doctorates from SOS**, Manchester and Birmingham Universities.

8. Russian poetess Maria Stepanova wins Leipzig Book Prize 2023 (May 2, 2023)

Russian poetess Maria Stepanova wins Leipzig Book Prize 2023

Maria Stepanova, a Russian author currently living in Berlin, has won the prestigious Leipzig Book Prize for European Understanding in 2023.

An Overview of the News

- Stepanova's novel, In **Memory of Memory**, which explores themes of **Stalinism and the collapse of the Soviet Union**, has earned her a nomination for the **Booker Prize in 2021**.
- The Leipzig Book Prize was awarded to Stepanova for her poetry collection '**Girls Without Clothes**', which sensitively addresses the issue of power dynamics that fuel violence and oppression against women.
- The award ceremony was held on 25 April 2023 at the 30th Leipzig Book Fair.
- The Leipzig Book Prize has been presented since 1994 for "Progress of Reconciliation" in Europe.
- Stepanova, born in Moscow in 1972, is a Russian-Jewish poet, novelist and journalist who has been an outspoken critic of Vladimir Putin's administration.

- Stepanova has expressed her admiration for Ukraine's resistance to the invasion,
- describing it as a battle of "good versus evil" in an interview with German public broadcaster RBB.

About the Leipzig Book Prize

- The Leipzig Book Prize for European Understanding is a **prestigious literary prize** awarded annually since 1994.
- The prize aims to promote greater understanding between **European cultures** by recognizing outstanding works of **fiction, non-fiction and poetry that contribute** to this goal.
- The prize is awarded as part of the **Leipzig Book Fair** in **Germany** and is presented in three categories: **fiction, non-fiction and translation.** The winner in each category receives a **cash prize and a bronze statuette.**
- The jury for the Leipzig Book Prize is made up of **literary scholars**, **critics and journalists** from all over **Europe**. They evaluate works from different European countries and languages to select the winners.

- The honour was created on 14 February 1975 by Elizabeth II, the Queen of Australia, after a recommendation to the Australian Government.
- The Order of Australia has various levels including companion (AC), officer (AO), member (AM), medal (OAM) and honorary award.
- The Order of Australia also has a motto, which is "Do what you can," and it encourages individuals to strive for excellence in their respective fields.
