1. World Brain Day - 22 July (July 23, 2023)

World Brain Day, also known as International Brain Day, is an annual health care event observed around the world on 22 July.

An Overview of the News

- Recognizing the importance of raising awareness of brain health and neurological disorders, the WFN's Board of Trustees approved the concept during its meeting held in February 2014.
- Since its inception, "World Brain Day" has served as a platform to educate the public, health care professionals, and policy makers about neurological issues, research advances, and the importance of brain health globally.

- The first national park of India is **Jim Corbett National Park** (Uttarakhand), which was established in 1936.
- **Cheetah** was introduced to **Kuno National Park** in India for the first time after independence.
- The maximum number of tigers in India is located in Madhya Pradesh, followed by Karnataka.
- The maximum number of 11 national parks in India is in the state of Madhya Pradesh, where there are a total of 11 national parks.

3. World International Justice Day - July 17 (July 17, 2023)

- Every year on July 10, Fish Farmers Day is celebrated in the country to mark this contribution of scientists.

Beginning of National Fish Farmers Day:

- July 10, 2001 was designated as National Fisheries Day by the Government of India.
- After this, in 2001, the Indian Council of Agricultural Research organized the country's first National Fish Farmer's Day function. Along with this, the leading institute in the field of fisheries education Central Institute of Fisheries Education also joined.
- The day aims to raise awareness of the need to change the way the country manages its fisheries resources to ensure sustainable fisheries stocks and robust ecosystems.

Organization of National Fish Farmers Day 2023:

• An exhibition of 30 extraordinary startups from across the country will be organized to showcase the best of the fisheries innovators in the country at the National Fish Farmers Day 2023 celebration event at **Mahabalipuram** on July 10, 2023.

Important facts related to fishing industry:

- According to the statistics of the National Fisheries Development Board, the export revenue of Rs 334.41 billion has been received from the fisheries industry alone.
- The fisheries industry contributes 7% to India's gross domestic product (GDP).
- India is the second major aquaculture working country in the world.

- India is the third largest producer of fish in the world.
- Gujarat ranks first in the production of marine fish in the country.

8. Dharma Chakra Day - 3rd July (July 5, 2023)

About Dharma Chakra Day

- Dharma Chakra Day is celebrated to commemorate Buddha's first teaching after attaining enlightenment.
- It is observed on the full moon day of Asadha in the Indian sun calendar. It is also observed as Guru Purnima.
- Organized by Ministry of Culture in partnership with the International Buddhist Confederation (IBC)
- **Significance** Second most sacred day for Buddhists after Buddha Poornima (Vesak)
- The day marks the beginning of the Rainy Season retreat for monks and nuns.
- Other Names Asadha Poornima (India); Esala Poya (Sri Lanka); Asanha Bucha (Thailand)
- **Guru Purnima** Falls on a full-moon day in the Hindu month of Ashadh. Dedicated to Maharshi Veda Vyasa, editor of the Vedas and creator of Hindu scriptures.

9. International Day of Cooperatives - 1st July (July 4, 2023)
