Youth Affairs and Sports Minister **Anurag Singh Thakur** launches the **themes of the Youth 20 summit, logo, and website** in New Delhi on 6 January in the **curtain raiser event** of Y20 Summit India.

An overview of the news

- India is hosting the Y20 summit for the first time.
- In the Youth 20 Engagement Group, India's main focus is to bring together young leaders from around the world to discuss ideas for a better tomorrow and create an agenda for action.
- Activities to be undertaken by **Y20 during India's presidency** will focus on global youth leadership and partnerships.

About Youth 20 (Y20)

- Youth 20 (Y20) is the official youth engagement group of the G20.
- It provides a platform for youth to express their vision and views on **G20 priorities.**
- It is a process that brings together young leaders from around the world to discuss and debate global challenges.
- The list of policy recommendations is known as a communiqué, which is publicly announced at the Y20 summit and presented to world leaders as part of the official G20 summit.

2. India deploys a platoon of women peacekeepers to the UN Mission in Sudan (Jan. 6, 2023)

India deployed a platoon of **women peacekeepers** in the **Abyei region of Sudan** on 6 January as part of the Indian battalion in the **United Nations Interim Security Force** (UNISFA).

An overview of the news

- It is India's largest single contingent of **women peacekeepers** in a UN mission since it deployed its first all-women contingent to **Liberia in 2007.**
- In 2007, **India became the first country** to deploy an entirely women contingent for a **UN peacekeeping mission**.

- Police units formed in Liberia provided 24-hour guard duty, night patrols in the capital
- Monrovia, and helped increase the capacity of the Liberian Police.
- The Indian contingent, comprising **two officers and 25 other ranks**, will form part of an engagement platoon and specialise in community outreach; they will also undertake extensive security work.

United Nations Interim Security Force (UNISFA)

- The United Nations Security Council responded immediately to the deteriorating situation in the **Abyei region of Sudan** by establishing UNISFA by its resolution 1990 of 27 June 2011.
- The UN Security Council was deeply concerned by the violence, rising tensions and population displacement.
- UNISFA was established after the Government of Sudan and the Sudan People's Liberation Movement (SPLM) reached an agreement in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

About UN Peacekeeping

- UN peacekeeping began in **1948** when the UN Security Council authorised the deployment of UN military observers in the Middle East.
- It helps to bring countries from conflict to a difficult path of peace.
- It deploys soldiers and police from all over the world for peacekeeping.
- India is one of the largest military and police contributors to UN peacekeeping operations.
- There are currently more than **5,700 Indian peacekeepers** deployed in **nine of the 12 UN peacekeeping missions.**

3. Government declares The Resistance Front, TRF as a terrorist organisation (Jan. 6, 2023)

Government declares The Resistance Front, TRF as a terrorist organisation

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has declared The Resistance Front (TRF) as a terrorist organisation under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA), 1967.

An overview of the news

- The Home Ministry's notification states that "the activities of the TRF are prejudicial to the national security and sovereignty of India."
- As per the Home Ministry notification, The Resistance Front (TRF) is recruiting youth through online medium for furthering terrorist activities, recruiting terrorists, infiltrating terrorists and smuggling arms and narcotics **from Pakistan into J&K.**

- The ministry also designated **Sheikh Sajjad Gul**, a commander of the TRF, as a
- * terrorist under the Fourth Schedule of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act 1967.
- The government also designated **Mohammad Amin alias Abu Khubaib**, who hails from Jammu and Kashmir but currently lives in Pakistan as a terrorist.
- For some years TRF was behind most of the attacks on civilians including Kashmiri Pandits and migrant workers as well as security forces in Kashmir.

The Resistance Front (TRF)

- TRF came into existence in the **year 2019** as a **proxy organisation of Lashkar-e- Taiba.**
- It is a banned terrorist organisation listed at serial number 5 of the first schedule under UAPA.
- The TRF, an offshoot of the **Lashkar led by Hafiz Saeed**, was formed with the support of the Pakistan Army and the ISI.
- It was formed in response to the abrogation of **Article 370** from Jammu and Kashmir by India.
- It is headed by TRF Commander Sheikh Sajjad Gul.
- A large number of cases have been registered against members/associates of TRF related to planning to kill security force personnel and innocent civilians of J&K.

Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, (UAPA) 1967

- It is a **preventive detention Act** aimed at preventing activities directed against the integrity and sovereignty of India.
- It was enacted by the Parliament in 1967.
- Unlawful activity refers to any action taken by a person or association with the aim of disrupting the territorial integrity and sovereignty of India.

4. India's '2023 Science Vision' (Jan. 6, 2023)

India's '2023 Science Vision'

Briefing the media about the '2023 Science Vision', Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh said, "The future belongs to those who have innovative ideas and out-of-the-box goals, and the conviction and courage to achieve them." He said this on the occasion of the Indian Science Congress.

108th Indian Science Congress

- The 108th Indian Science Congress is being held on **January 3-7, 2023** at **Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj (RTM) Nagpur University** in Nagpur, Maharashtra.
- Prime Minister **Narendra Modi** virtually inaugurated the Indian Science Congress on January 3.
- He talked about the achievements India has acquired in Science and Tech.
- The theme of this year's Indian Science Congress is "Science and Technology for Sustainable Development with Women Empowerment."

2023 Science Vision

- The development of science, technology and innovation is the only way for **sustainable development**.
- The Prime Minister said in ISC 2023, in 2015 India was ranked **81st in the Global Innovation Index** of 130 countries, but has reached **40th position** in 2022.
- Most of the major S&T companies around the world are being headed by people from India.
- India has been a staunch supporter of promoting scientific temper in daily life. "Science, technology and innovation will define **India@100 in 2047.**

5. Ghaziabad-Pt Deen Dayal Upadhyay section becomes the longest fully automatic block signalling section of Indian Railways (Jan. 5, 2023)

Ghaziabad-Pt Deen Dayal Upadhyay section (762 KM) becomes the longest fully automatic block signalling section of Indian Railways.

An overview of the news

- After commissioning of automatic signalling system in Satanraini-Rasulabad-Faizullapur section of Prayagraj division, 762 kilometre long Ghaziabad-Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay section has become fully automated.
- With this it has also become the longest Automatic Block Signalling section of Indian Railways.
- Indian Railways is introducing Automatic Block Signalling on a mission mode.
- ABS has been commissioned on 268 RKM during 2022-23.
- ABS has been provided on **3706 route kms** of Indian Railways till 31st December 2022.

- With the implementation of automatic signalling, there will be an increase in capacity
- resulting in the introduction of more train services.
- Electronic interlocking is being adopted on a large scale to take advantage of digital technologies in train operations and to enhance safety.

What is Automatic Block Signalling (ABS)?

- It is automatic and works in conjunction with track circuiting or other means to detect the presence of a train in a block section.
- To increase line capacity to run more trains on existing high density routes of Indian Railways, Automatic Block Signalling (ABS) is a **cost effective solution.**
- Electronic interlocking systems have been introduced at **347 stations** during 2022-23.
- Electronic interlocking has been provided to **2888 stations** covering 45.5% IR by 31st December 2022.

6. India & France hold 36th Strategic Dialogue in New Delhi (Jan. 5, 2023)

India and France held the **36th Strategic Dialogue** in New Delhi on 5 January. The two sides discussed a wide range of bilateral and global issues.

An overview of the news

- National Security Advisor **Ajit Doval** led the Indian delegation while the French delegation was led by **Emmanuel Bonne**, Diplomatic Advisor to the French President.
- The last edition of the Strategic Dialogue was to be held in **Paris in November 2021.**

India, France bilateral relations

- France is the first country with which India started a strategic dialogue after its 1998 nuclear tests.
- Bilateral trade with France has reached **US\$ 10.75 billion** in the last decade and is showing a steady increase.
- Both sides recognized the importance of discussing the **India-EU Trade and Investment Agreement.**
- There are around **1,000 French companies** present in India while over a hundred Indian businesses have established a presence in France.
- In 2005, an agreement was signed to build six Scorpene submarines in India with the help of France.
- There has been an agreement between the Government of France and India for 36
 Rafale aircraft.

7. Dharmendra Pradhan chairs the 3rd meeting of the steering committee of National Skill Development Mission (Jan. 5, 2023)

Dharmendra Pradhan chairs the 3rd meeting of the steering committee of National Skill Development Mission

Dharmendra Pradhan, Minister of Education and Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, chaired the third meeting of the **Steering Committee of the National Skill Development Mission** in New Delhi on 4 January.

An overview of the news

- The progress made in the skill development efforts and the **road map ahead** were discussed in the meeting.
- The minister also discussed **various issues** such as convergence of skill development schemes, skill gap analysis and skill mapping, connecting Indian youth to global opportunities, developing a curriculum to reflect emerging trends, etc.
- He also called for greater convergence between skill development schemes of all ministries and spending on skill development by all stakeholders.

National Skill Development Mission

- It was launched in 2015 to provide a strong institutional framework to implement skill development efforts across the country and provide training to one crore youth every year.
- It has been developed to create convergence across regions and states in terms of skill training activities.
- **Objective** To provide a strong institutional framework at the Center and in all States for the implementation of skilling activities in the country.
- **Ministry**: Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship

8. Health Minister chairs a high level meeting to eliminate Kala-azar from the country by 2023 (Jan. 5, 2023)

Health and Family Welfare Minister **Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya** on 4 January **chaired a high-level meeting** with four states of **Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand and West Bengal governments** to review the elimination of **Kala-Azar** from the country by the year 2023.

An overview of the news

- Health ministers of **Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand** and senior officials of West Bengal were present during the meeting.
- India is committed to eliminate Kala-azar from the country by 2023.
- **632 endemic blocks** have already achieved elimination status with less than one case of Kala-azar **per ten thousand population.**
- Only one block (**Littipara**) in **Pakur district of Jharkhand** is in the endemic category with 1.23 cases per 10,000 population.
- The Central Government is working holistically with the State Government and other stakeholders for the eradication of Kala-azar in Jharkhand.
- **Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal** have achieved the Kala-azar elimination targets at the block level.

Global status of Kala-Azar

- About 90 percent of global cases of kala-azar in the year 2021 were found in eight countries - Brazil, Eritrea, Ethiopia, India, Kenya, Somalia, South Sudan and Sudan.
- India accounts for **11.5 per cent** of the total cases reported globally.
- Bihar and Jharkhand currently account for more than 90 percent of Kala-azar cases.

What is Kala-azar?

- It is also known as **Visceral leishmaniasis (VL)**, black fever and Dumdum fever.
- The disease is the **second largest parasite killer** in the world after Malaria.
- It is a **Neglected Tropical Disease** affecting about 100 countries including India.

Symptoms

- Fever, weight loss, fatigue, anaemia, and swelling of the liver and spleen.
- Transmission
- It is caused by protozoan parasites of the Leishmania genus.

- It migrates to the internal organs such as the liver, spleen and bone marrow.
- The study warns that kala-azar patients can infect others even after treatment.

National Kala-azar Eradication Program

- India's **National Health Policy, 2002**, set a target of eliminating Kala-azar by 2010, which was revised in 2015.
- Under Kala-azar eradication in India, a target of 1 case per 10,000 population was set at the sub-district level.
- All the activities related to this program are being implemented through the National Vector Borne Disease Control Program.
- India signed a tripartite Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Bangladesh and Nepal to eliminate Kala-azar from the South-East Asia region.

9. Government approves Rs 28.11 crore to provide relief to tobacco farmers of Andhra affected by Cyclone Mandus (Jan. 5, 2023)

Commerce and Industry, Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution and Textiles Minister **Piyush Goyal** has approved **Rs 28.11 crore** for giving a special interest-free loan of **Rs 10,000** to each member of **Tobacco Board's Grower Welfare Schemes** under southern regions.

An overview of the news

- This will directly benefit over **28,000 tobacco farmers** affected by **Cyclone Mandus** in Andhra Pradesh.
- The interest-free loan to eligible FCV tobacco farmers will be administered by the Tobacco Board, a statutory body under the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.
- This measure will help FCV tobacco farmers to recover from the damage caused by **Mandus cyclonic rains** and will greatly help the growers to take immediate damage reduction measures.

About FCV Tobacco

- FCV (Flu Cured Virginia) tobacco is a major commercial crop grown in 10 districts of Andhra Pradesh with an annual production of 121 million kg (2021-22) in an area of 66,000 hectares.
- It is a major **exportable tobacco** variety of the total unmanufactured tobacco exports from India.
- Of the total unmanufactured tobacco exports (excluding tobacco waste) during FY 2021-22, FCV tobacco exports constituted 53.62% in volume terms and 68.47% in value terms.

Tobacco farmers sell their produce through an e-auction platform developed and

• operated by the **Tobacco Board** through a transparent process that ensures fair and remunerative prices.

Cyclone Mandous

- Mandus is a slow moving cyclone.
- It often absorbs a lot of **moisture**, **rains** heavily and is powerful with wind speed.
- The name of Mandous has been suggested by the **United Arab Emirates.**
- This cyclone affected a large number of tobacco farmers in Andhra Pradesh in early December 2022.

10. PM to chair second National Conference of Chief Secretaries in Delhi (Jan. 5, 2023)

PM to chair second National Conference of Chief Secretaries in Delhi

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will chair the 2nd National Conference of Chief Secretaries on January 6 and 7, 2023 in Delhi.

An overview of the news

- This will be an important step towards further enhancing the partnership between the Central and State Governments.
- The **first conference** of Chief Secretaries was to be held in **Dharamshala in June** 2022.
- The conference will focus on achieving rapid and sustained economic growth in partnership with the states.
- It will see participation from representatives of the Central Government, Chief Secretaries and senior officers from all States/UTs and more than **200 domain experts.**
- The conference will lay the groundwork for achieving a developed India with emphasis on growth and employment generation and inclusive human development.
- The best practices of the States/UTs under each theme will also be presented in the conference so that the States can learn from each other.

Six identified themes of the conference

- Thrust on MSMEs
- Infrastructure and Investments
- Minimising Compliances
- Women's Empowerment

- Health and Nutrition
- Skill Development

Three special sessions

- Viksit Bharat: Reaching the Last Mile

- Besides, focused deliberations would be held on four topics, viz Vocal for Local, International Year of Millets, G20: Role of States and Emerging Technologies.
