1. Indian-American physician honoured with young urologist of the year award (April 6, 2023)

Dr. Nitya Abraham, an **Indian-American physician and professor**, has been honored with the **Young Urologist of the Year Award** by the American Urological Association (AUA).

An overview of the news

- She is an Associate Professor at Albert Einstein College of Medicine and Program Director for the Montefiore Urology residency programme.
- Abraham has been chosen from the **New York region** for her accomplishments and contributions.
- Abraham has done remarkable work for countless students, residents, fellows and junior faculty in the New York area and at his institution.
- She is serving as the Chair of the Executive Curriculum Committee for the Albert Einstein College of Medicine.
- She is a member of the Society for Urodynamics, Female Pelvic Medicine, and Urogenital Reconstruction (SUFU) Young Urologists Committee and Social Media Committee.
- The award committee described her as a prolific researcher with clinical research on the impact of social determinants of **pelvic floor health.**

Young Urologist of the Year Award

- The **American Urological Association** recognizes the hard work of young urologists across the country.
- The award was established by Dr. Michael C. Ost, 2012-2013 AUA Young Urologist Committee (YUC) Chair.
- The **Young Urologist of the Year Award is presented annually** to early-career members of the AUA for their progress in their field and commitment to furthering their efforts.

2. Sprinter Lashinda Demus was awarded the Olympic gold medal after a decade (April 1, 2023)

More than a decade after the 2012 London Games, Lashinda Demus, a sprinter from the United States, was awarded an Olympic gold medal at the age of 40, Czechia's Zuzana Hejnova a silver and Jamaica's Kalisz Spencer a bronze. Medal awarded.

An Overview of the News

- The International Olympic Committee stripped Natalya Antyukh, the original gold medalist in the 400 metres hurdles, of her title due to her involvement in the Russian doping scandal.
- Antyukh beat Demus by just 0.07 seconds at the London track.
- Historical evidence recovered from the Moscow testing laboratory database allowed the Athletics Integrity Unit to disqualify Antyukh's results from July 2012 to June 2013.

About London Olympics 2012

- Held in **London, UK** from 27 July to 12 August 2012.
- Over 10,000 athletes from **204 National Olympic Committees (NOCs**) participated and competed in 26 sports.
- The United States topped the medal table with 104 medals, including 46 gold.
- China finished second with 88 medals, including 38 gold.
- Great Britain finished third with 65 medals, including 29 gold.

3. Assam's Tapoban NGO honoured with Children's Champion Award (March 29, 2023)

Luis Caffarelli of Argentina has been awarded the 2023 Abel Prize.

An overview of the news

• The 74-year-old **Caffarell**i has been awarded the prize for **his contributions to the field of nonlinear partial equations and free-boundary problems in mathematics.** Caffarelli was **born and raised in Buenos Aires, Argentina**, making him the **first** • Abel Prize laureate from South America.

• Currently, he is a professor at the **University of Texas, Austin.**

About Abel Prize

- First awarded in 2003, the Abel prize "recognises pioneering scientific achievements in mathematics".
- It is named after **Norwegian mathematician Niels Henrik Abel (1802-29**), who in his short life made pioneering contributions in a multitude of fields.
- It is often considered to be an equivalent of the Nobel prize.
- The award carries a monetary prize of 7.5 million kronor (about \$720,000) and a glass plaque designed by Norwegian artist Henrik Haugen.
- The prize is awarded by the **Norwegian Academy of Science and Letters** on behalf of the Ministry of Education.

9. Nepali wicketkeeper-batsman Asif Sheikh wins 2022 Christopher Martin-Jenkins Spirit of Cricket Award (March 21, 2023)

An Overview of the News

- The award is presented annually by the Marylebone Cricket Club (MCC), UK in association with the BBC.
- The award was **created in 2013 by the MCC and the BBC** in memory of former MCC President and BBC Test Match Special Commentator **Christopher Martin-Jenkins (CMJ**), who was passionate about promoting the spirit of the game.
- Sheikh was awarded for his sportsmanship shown in the **men's T20 International** between Nepal and Ireland in February 2022.
- It is the first time in the award's history that the MCC and the BBC have invited public nominations for the award.
- Sheikh's conduct was declared the winning entry.
- Sheikh was also honoured with the **ICC Spirit of Cricket Award in January 2022** for his works.
