1. Kerala launched the Kerala Fibre Optical Network (KFON) (June 9, 2023)

Kerala-Fibre-Optic-Network-(KFON)

The **Kerala government** June 5 officially launched the **Kerala Fibre Optical Network (KFON)**, one of its flagship projects envisaged during the first term of Chief Minister **Pinarayi Vijayan**.

An overview of the news

- Through KFON, Kerala, which is the first state to declare the right to internet as a **fundamental right**, aims to bridge the digital divide by ensuring high-speed broadband internet access to all households and government offices.
- It also aims to promote e-governance and accelerate **Kerala's journey towards becoming a knowledge-based economy**.

What is Kerala Fibre Optic Network (KFON)?

- In the first phase of KFON, the government will provide connectivity to **30,000 government offices and 14,000 BPL households** in the state.
- Till June 5, connectivity has been provided to 17,412 government offices and 2,105 households and a cable network has been laid to provide connections to 9,000 households.
- Kerala Vision Broadband, an initiative of cable TV operators, is providing internet service in many districts of Kerala.
- Private service providers will also benefit from KFON's infrastructure as they can use its cable network.
- Internet connectivity to the households will be provided by the local ISP/TSP/Cable TV providers.

Stakeholders of KFON

- The Rs 1,611-crore KFON project is a joint venture between the **Kerala State Electricity Board (KSEB)** and the **Kerala State IIT Infrastructure Limited**.
- The project was announced in 2017 but work **started in 2019**.
- The project implementation was done by a consortium led by **Central PSU Bharat Electronics Limited**.
- **PricewaterhouseCoopers** is the advisor to the project.
- **Kerala State Information Technology Infrastructure Ltd (KSITIL)** would be responsible for the operations and maintenance of the project.
- **Bharat Electronics (BEL)** is the system integrator for the KFON project.

- The project is fully funded by **Kerala Infrastructure Investment Fund Board (KIIFB)**.

2. Uttar Pradesh government launches Nand Baba Milk Mission scheme (June 8, 2023)

In a bid to make Uttar Pradesh a leading state in the field of milk development and milk production, the state government has launched the **Nand Baba Milk Mission scheme** on 6th June at a cost of **Rs 1,000 crore**.

An overview of the news

- The mission is implemented to facilitate milk producers to sell their milk at reasonable prices in villages through **dairy cooperatives**.
- Under this mission, it is proposed to form a **Dairy farmer producer organisation (Dairy FPO)** in order to facilitate sale of milk in producers' villages itself.
- There is a plan to set up **five dairy FPOs** in five districts of the state as a pilot project in the financial year 2023-24, in which women will also play a major role.
- Besides the opening of office of the Nand Baba Milk Mission at **Gomtinagar**, a '**Dairy Development Portal**' and **logo of Nand Baba Mission** has also been unveiled by Cabinet Minister, Livestock and Dairy Development Department, **Dharampal Singh**.

Indian Dairy Sector

- **India ranks first in milk production** and contributes **24% to global milk production**.
- The top 5 milk producing states are: **Uttar Pradesh (14.9%), Rajasthan (14.6%), Madhya Pradesh (8.6%), Gujarat (7.6%) and Andhra Pradesh (7.0%)**.
- Dairy is the single largest agricultural item **contributing 5% to the national economy**, which has been **6.4% in the last 5 years**.
- About **8 crore people** are directly or indirectly employed in the dairy industry.

Some important facts related to milk and milk products

- **India is the world's largest milk producer**, accounting for **23 percent of global production**. It is followed by the **United States, China, Pakistan and Brazil**.
- **Uttar Pradesh is the largest milk producing state** in India and accounts for more than **17% of the total milk production in India**.
- The per capita availability of milk in India is **406 grams per day**.
- Ordinary milk contains **85 percent water** and the remaining part consists of solid elements ie minerals and fat.
- Milk contains **protein, calcium and riboflavin (vitamin B-2)**.

- Milk also contains **vitamins A, D, K and E** including **phosphorus, magnesium, iodine** and many minerals and fat and energy.
- The purity of milk is measured by **lactometer**.
- National Milk Research Institute is located at **Karnal (Haryana)**.
- An organic compound called **lactose** is found in milk.
- The **pH value of fresh milk is 6**. When milk changes into curd, its **pH value becomes less than 6**.
- **Lactobacillus bacteria** help in curdling of milk.

3. MP Govt to launch CM Learn and Earn scheme (June 7, 2023)

In **Madhya Pradesh**, the **Chief Minister's Learn and Earn scheme** is set to be launched with the aim of providing employable skills to the youth.

An overview of the news

- Chief Minister's Learn and Earn scheme in Madhya Pradesh focuses on providing **training, financial support, and employment opportunities to the youth**.
- By identifying numerous work areas and involving various industries, the scheme aims to equip the young workforce with the necessary skills to enhance their employability and contribute to the state's development.

Salient Features of the Scheme

Work Areas Identification

- A total of **703 work areas** have been identified for training purposes under this scheme.
- These work areas cover a wide range of industries and sectors, ensuring diverse opportunities for skill development.

Allowance Provision

- A significant aspect of the Learn and Earn scheme is that it not only focuses on skill acquisition but also provides financial support to the youth.
- Participants in the scheme will receive a monthly allowance ranging from **Rs 8,000 to 10,000**.
- This allowance aims to assist the youth in meeting their financial needs while they learn and work.

Government's Commitment

- Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan has expressed the government's continuous efforts to bridge the gap between youth and employment.
- The Learn and Earn scheme is a proactive measure taken by the government to address the issue of unemployment by equipping young individuals with necessary skills.

Training Opportunities

- The scheme targets the training of **at least one lakh youth**.
- To facilitate this, the registration process will commence for establishments providing **training to the youth, starting today**.
- Simultaneously, registration for the youth interested in acquiring work-related skills will commence from 15th June.
- The selected youth will commence their work from 1st August, thereby creating a structured timeline for skill development and subsequent employment.

4. KFON internet connectivity launched by Kerala government (June 7, 2023)

Kerala Fiber Optical Network (KFON)

- It is an **optical fibre cable network** spanning **30,000 km with 375 Points-of-Presence (PoPs) across Kerala.**
- The KFON infrastructure is shared with cable operators and all service providers.
- KFON services will be provided through **local ISPs, Telecom Service Providers (TSPs) and Cable TV providers.**

5. UP govt launches 'Elder Line' service to give shelter to elderly homeless (June 6, 2023)

Uttar Pradesh Social Welfare Department.

The '**Elder Line**' **14567** service was recently **launched by the Uttar Pradesh Social Welfare Department.**

An overview of the news

- The initiative is the brainchild of Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Social Welfare **Aseem Arun**, who earlier headed the emergency **helpline 112.**

Objective of the initiative

- The objective of the helpline is to rescue destitute old persons and provide them **shelter in old age homes**.
- 'Elder Line' 14567 service has been activated, actively responding to **distress related to older persons**.

Reporting destitute elderly

- Citizens can report about destitute elderly persons on **roadsides, bus stations, railway stations, or similar places**.
- The team of the Social Welfare Department immediately responds to the reports and ensures that the elderly person is shifted safely to the old age home with dignity.

Availability of Old Age Homes

- Uttar Pradesh currently has **75 old age homes**, one in each district.
- These homes accommodate both **male and female residents**, providing them with necessary amenities and care.

Facilities and Services

- Inmates of the old age homes receive **free food, healthcare facilities, and entertainment options**.
- Health check-ups are conducted **every 15 days** by doctors from the Chief Medical Officer's office.
- Each old age home is equipped with an ambulance to address emergency medical needs.

Enriching Lives

- Old age homes organize outings and recreational activities for the residents.
- Trips to places like Akshardham temple in Delhi are arranged, providing a refreshing experience for the elderly.
- Such initiatives enhance their quality of life and create opportunities for enjoyment.

Benefits and Allowances

- The state government has increased the **breakfast allowance** for elderly individuals in old age homes from **Rs 75 to Rs 114 per day**.
- Inmates also receive an annual amount of **Rs 2,500** for new clothes, **Rs 200 per month** for additional medicines, and **Rs 150** for entertainment purposes.

Pension Scheme Integration

- The social welfare department plans to link the over **6,000 elderly individuals** residing in old age homes to the 'Rashtriya Vridhavastha Pension' scheme.
- This integration aims to provide additional financial support to the elderly, offering them some extra pocket money.

6. SBI launches Project Kuber in Bengaluru (June 5, 2023)

An overview of the news

- The government is actively working towards developing a **carbon-neutral village in Bhiwandi Taluka, Thane district.**

An overview of the news

- The announcement was made during a ceremony commemorating Ahilya Devi's 298th birth anniversary in Ahmednagar.
- The decision came in the wake of a controversy surrounding the temporary removal of statues of Ahilya Devi and social reformer Savitribai Phule from Maharashtra Sadan.

About Ahilya Devi Holkar

- **Born on May 31, 1725,** in the **village of Chondi in Jamkhed, Ahmednagar,** Maharani Ahilya Devi Holkar is recognized as one of the **most accomplished female rulers in Indian history.**
- As a prominent ruler of the **Malwa kingdom** and a member of the **Maratha Holkar clan,** she championed the principles of dharma and promoted industrialization during the 18th century.
- She encouraged **trade and commerce, improved infrastructure,** and supported the growth of industries.
- Her efforts played a crucial role in fostering **economic development and prosperity in the region.**

- As a tribute to her legacy, **Indore's domestic airport** has already been named **Devi Ahilyabai Holkar Airport**, and the **Indore university** has been renamed **Devi Ahilya Vishwavidyalaya**.

9. Two-day lavender festival inaugurated in Bhaderwah (June 5, 2023)

Two-day lavender festival inaugurated in Bhaderwah
Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh inaugurated the two-day lavender festival at Bhaderwah in Jammu on 4th June.

An overview of the news

- He said Bhaderwah has emerged as the Lavender capital of India and Agri StartUp destination.
- CSIR-Indian Institute of Integrative Medicine, Jammu organized the event as part of its 'One Week One Laboratory' campaign.
- Dr Jitendra Singh described Bhaderwah as the birthplace of India's 'Purple Revolution' and a destination for agri-startups.

CSIR-Aroma Mission

- This is a flagship project of CSIR, under which lavender cultivation is being promoted in the temperate regions of Jammu and Kashmir region.
- The objective of this project is to increase the income of small and marginal farmers and to develop agri-based startups.
- The project is being directly monitored by the Union Minister of State for Science & Technology (Independent Charge) Dr. Jitendra Singh.
- Under his directions, lavender cultivation is being promoted at CSIR-IIIM Bhaderwah and other parts of J&K.

A specific species of lavender, RRL-12

- CSIR-IIIM has developed its own unique species of lavender (RRL-12) and cultivation technology of lavender.
- This species of lavender has proved very suitable for lavender cultivation in rainfed temperate regions of India.
- CSIR-IIIM initiated lavender cultivation under CSIR-Aroma Mission and provided more than 30 lakh lavender plants free of cost to the farmers of different districts of J&K.

What is lavender cultivation?

- Lavender is a popular **aromatic herb** known for its beautiful flowers and soothing fragrance.
- It is widely cultivated for various purposes, including **ornamental, culinary, and therapeutic uses**.

- It belongs to the **Lamiaceae family**.
- Lavender flowers are used to flavor various **dishes, desserts and beverages**.
- It is also a popular ingredient in **teas and herbal infusions**.
- Lavender oil is widely used in **aromatherapy, perfumes, soaps, candles, and cosmetics**.
- Some popular lavender varieties include **English lavender, French lavender and Spanish lavender**.

10. J&K's Kishtwar will become north India's major 'power hub' (June 4, 2023)

Union Minister of State for Personnel, **Jitendra Singh**, announced that **Jammu and Kashmir's Kishtwar** will become **North India's major "power hub"** generating approximately **6,000 MW** of power upon the completion of ongoing power projects.

An overview of the news

- The minister held a meeting to review the progress of various hydroelectric power projects in the **Kishtwar and Doda districts** of Jammu and Kashmir.
- NHPC chairman Rajiv Vishnoi, Deputy Commissioner Kishtwar Devansh Yadav, and officials provided updates on the projects during the meeting.
- The surplus power generated in Kishtwar will not only be utilized within the Union Territory but can also be availed by other states.
- He assured 100% reservation for locals in unskilled jobs and pledged to prioritize local talent for skilled manpower requirements in these projects.
- Singh highlighted the improvement in connectivity, stating that road travel time from Jammu to Kishtwar has reduced from over seven hours in 2014 to less than five hours currently.
- Kishtwar has been included in the aviation map of India and a sanctioned airport under the Centre's UDAAN scheme.
- Modi government aims to bring underdeveloped regions like Kishtwar, northeastern states, and hilly areas at par with more developed regions of the country.
