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1. CCI imposes penalty of over Rs 392 crore on online travel firms (Oct. 20, 2022)

CCI imposes penalty

The <u>Competition Commission of India</u> (CCI) on 19 October, 2022 slapped penalties totalling more than **Rs 392 crore** on online travel firms **MakeMyTrip**, **Goibibo and hospitality services** provider OYO for unfair business practices.

Important facts

- A fine of **Rs 223.48 crore** has been slapped on Make My Trip-Goibibo (MMT-Go) and Rs 168.88 crore on OYO.
- MMT-Go was alleged to have enforced price parity in its agreements with hotel partners.
- Under such agreements, hotel partners were not allowed to sell their rooms on any other platform or on their online portal at a price lower than the price at which it was being offered on the platforms of the two other entities.
- It was also alleged that MMT preferred OYO on its platform, thereby denying market access to other players.
- The CCI had ordered a detailed inquiry into the matter in **October 2019.**
- MakeMyTrip (MMT) acquired Ibibo Group Holding in 2017.

Competition Commission of India (CCI)

- The Competition Commission of India (CCI) is the chief national competition regulator in India.
- It was set up under the Competition Act, 2002.

3. Barauni Plant of HURL commences Urea production (Oct. 20, 2022)

HURL commences Urea production

Barauni Plant of Hindustan Urvarak and Rasayan Limited (HURL) commenced urea production on 19 October, 2022.

Important facts

- The country has achieved another milestone by setting up a new **Ammonia Urea Plant** at Barauni, Bihar which started urea production.
- The gas-based Barauni plant is part of the government's initiative to revive the closed urea units of Fertilizer Corporation of India Limited (FCIL) and Hindustan Fertilizers Corporation Limited (HFCL) to achieve self-reliance in the urea sector.
- Revival of closed units of FCIL and HFCL has been the top priority of the Government to increase the availability of domestically produced urea.
- The government has approved an estimated investment of **Rs 8,387** for the revival of the Barauni unit of Hindustan Fertilizers and Rasayan Limited (HURL).
- The plant will have a urea production capacity of 12.7 LMTPA.

About Hindustan Urvarak and Rasayan Limited (HURL)

- It is a Joint Venture Company authorised with effect from **15th June**, **2016**.
- It has been authorised to revive Gorakhpur, Sindri and Barauni units in association with Coal India Limited (CIL), NTPC Limited (NTPC), Indian Oil Corporation Limited (IOCL) and FCIL/HFCL.
- An investment of **Rs 25,000 crore** has been made for this work.
- The commissioning of all three HURL plants will increase indigenous urea production to 38.1 LMTPA in the country and help make India 'self-reliant' in urea production.
- It is one of the largest fertilizer manufacturing units in India, the foundation stone of which was laid by Prime Minister **Narendra Modi.**

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5. 14th World Spice Congress to be held on 16-18 February in Maharashtra (Oct. 19, 2022)

14th World Spice Congress

The 14th World Spice Congress (WSC), organised by Spices Board India in association with various trade and export farmers will be held on 16-18 February at CIDCO Exhibition and Convention Centre, Navi Mumbai, Maharashtra.

Important facts

- Organised by Spice Board India, this biennial event is the premier forum that brings together the global spice industry to deliberate on the problems and prospects in the spice sector.
- The event will deliberate on aspects such as production, processing, value addition, quality and safety, trade and supply chain management of spices in the new normalcy.
- The Spice Board is organising the World Spice Congress as G20 during India's G20 Presidency for the period from December 2022 to November 2023, with a greater focus on further strengthening India's trade ties with the G20 countries.

Urban Housing Conclave 2022

Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated 'Indian Urban Housing Conclave-2022' (IUHC2022) a three-day event being organised by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), Government of India from 19-21 October 2022 at Rajkot, Gujarat.

Important facts

- Union Minister of Housing and Urban Affairs and Petroleum and Natural Gas, Hardeep Singh Puri and Minister of State for Housing and Urban Affairs Kaushal Kishor were present on the occasion.
- The objective of the conclave is to showcase the achievements of other urban missions of MoHUA along with the successful implementation of PMAY-U by the States/UTs and their roadmap/action plan for promoting economic development and improving the quality of life of the people.
- In this Swachh Bharat Mission, **Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT),** Smart City Mission, Urban Transport, Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana, National Urban Livelihoods Mission, SWANIDHI etc. Other urban missions will participate in this event.

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8. World Bank appoints neutral expert and chairman of Court of Arbitration for 'Kishanganga' and 'Ratle' hydroelectric project (Oct. 18, 2022)

The World Bank has appointed a "neutral expert" and a chairman of the Court of Arbitration regarding the **Kishanganga** and **Ratle** hydroelectric power plants, in view of disagreements and differences between India and Pakistan over the 1960 Indus Water Treaty.

Under the Indus water treaty if there is a dispute between India and Pakistan on the provisions of the treaty then the World Bank will mediate between the two.

Michel Lino, Chairman of the International Large Dam Commission has been appointed as the Neutral Expert and **Sean Murphy** has been appointed as Chairman of the Court of Arbitration.

Pakistan asked the World Bank to facilitate the establishment of a Court of Arbitration to consider its concerns about the designs of the two hydroelectric power projects, while **India** asked for the appointment of a Neutral Expert to consider similar concerns over the two projects.

What is the Indus Waters Treaty?

The 1960 Indus Waters Treaty was mediated by the World Bank and signed by the then prime minister Jawaharlal Nehru and Pakistan's president Ayub Khan.

- It has allotted western rivers; **Indus, Jhelum and Chenab to Pakistan** and Eastern flowing rivers; **Sutlej, Ravi and Beas** to India.
- Under the treaty India will not restrict the flow of the river which is assigned to Pakistan but it can use the river for hydroelectric purposes on the condition that the flow of water to Pakistan is not affected significantly.
- Due to this provision of the Indus water treaty, India has designed the Rattle and the Kishanganga project as **run of the river** project.

Run of the River project

In the run of the river project, reservoirs are not built for water storage purposes and the natural flow of water from a height is used to run micro turbines to produce electricity.

According to India such hydel projects do not contravene the Indus Water Treaty as river waters are not stored.

Dispute over Kishanganga and Ratle project

Kishanganga or Neelum (for Pakistan) is a tributary of river **Jhelum**. India has constructed a run of the river hydroelectric projects with a capacity of 330 MW in Jammu and Kashmir.

The project was inaugurated by PM Modi in 2018. Pakistan argues that the flow of the river which enters Pakistan has been affected due to the faulty design of the project.

Ratle Hydroelectric Project

It is also a run of the river hydroelectric project being built on the **Chenab river** in Kishtwar district of Jammu and Kashmir. In 2013 Pakistan government objected to the project as it was a violation of the Indus water treaty. In 2017 the World Bank allowed India to start the project which was opposed by Pakistan. After fresh objections from Pakistan, both countries approached the World Bank.

9. India and France adopts a joint roadmap on Hydrogen partnership (Oct. 18, 2022)

The visiting French Minister of State for Development, Francophonie and International Partnerships **Chrysoula Zacharopoulou** and Union Power and New & Renewable Energy Minister **R K Singh** adopted the "Indo-French Roadmap on the Development of <u>Green Hydrogen</u>" on 18 October 2022, in a meeting in **New Delhi**.

The French embassy said the roadmap aims at bringing the French and Indian hydrogen ecosystems together in order to establish a reliable and sustainable value chain for decarbonised hydrogen.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the French President Emmanuel Macron in a meeting on 4 May, gave a clear mandate to foster bilateral cooperation on hydrogen. This agreement is a step in that direction.

10. Jyotiraditya Scindia chairs the Conference of the Ministers of Civil Aviation of States and Union Territories (Oct. 18, 2022)

The Union Minister for Civil Aviation **Jyotiraditya Scindia** chaired the two-day (17-18 October 2022) Conference of the Ministers of Civil Aviation on 18 October 2022. The conference was and co-chaired by Minister of State, Ministry of Civil Aviation, Gen. (Rtd.) Vijay Kumar Singh.

The Conference of the Ministers of Civil Aviation has been organised by the **Union Ministry** of Civil Aviation in New Delhi.

The objective of the two day conference series was to promote greater collaboration and synergy between State Civil Aviation departments and Ministry of Civil Aviation to augment and develop the civil aviation sector.

Speaking on the occasion Scindia stated that the cost of Aviation Turbine Fuel (ATF) remains a challenge as it constitutes 45-50% cost in airline operations. He thanked 28 States, which have brought down Value Added Tax (VAT) on ATF to 1-4%. He also urged the remaining 8 States to bring down the VAT so that the barriers to growth are removed.

Expansion of Airports

On the issue of airports, the Minister said that in next four years, about Rs 95,000 crore are likely to be invested by the Government and the private sector, which includes greenfield as well as brownfield airports.

The Airports Authority of India is working on expansion of about 40 airports and setting up of 3-4 new Greenfield airports. Similarly, private sector is also working on 60 brownfield and 3 Greenfield airports.

In last 8 years, the number of airports has gone up from 74 to 141 (including helipads and waterdromes) and the number is likely to cross 200 in next 4-5 years.
