1. IIT Delhi will open its international campus in Abu Dhabi (UAE) (July 11, 2023)

On 10 July 2023, Union Education Minister **Dharmendra Pradhan** informed that **IIT Delhi** is going to open its international campus in **Abu Dhabi (UAE)**.

An Overview of the news:

- After IIT Madras, now IIT Delhi is also going to open its international campus outside the country in Abu Dhabi (United Arab Emirates).
- Earlier, IIT Madras had announced to set up its campus in Zanzibar-Tanzania. Whose work is likely to start from October this year.

Relations between the two countries will be further strengthened:

- This initiative will further strengthen the relations between the two countries.
- Meanwhile, IIT Delhi has also announced the inclusion of UAE school students in its Summer Boot Camp, in which talented school students from there will be able to work on their research and other innovations in IIT Delhi's lab.
- Currently, IIT Delhi conducts such summer boot camps only for Indian school students.
- During the event, Pradhan also handed over a set of books (magic box) designed for school children up to class three under the new National Education Policy (NEP) to UAE Minister of Education Sarah Musallam.

First campus of IIT Madras in Zanzibar-Tanzania:

- Prior to this announcement, IIT Madras had decided to open its campus in Zanzibar-Tanzania. Which will also start there from October this year.
- Like IIT Madras and Delhi, some other IITs of the country may also decide to open their international campuses soon.

2. India and Panama agree on electoral cooperation (July 8, 2023)

India-and-Panama-agree-on-electoral-cooperation

On 7th July 2023, **The Election Commission of India (ECI)** and the **Electoral Tribunal (ET) of Panama** signed an MoU on **Electoral Cooperation**.

An Overview of the news:

- Under this agreement, both the countries will set up an institutional framework for ongoing cooperation in the field of election management and administration.
- A three-member Election Commission delegation led by Chief Election Commissioner of India **Rajeev Kumar** met with **Alfredo Junca Vendheke**, Presiding Magistrate of the Electoral Tribunal of Panama, to strengthen cooperation and exchange of knowledge between the Election Management Bodies (EMBs) of the two countries. discussed.
- This MoU reflects the commitment of the Election Commission to engage with election bodies around the world and strengthen democratic processes.
- The Election Commission is expanding its connectivity and collaboration with foreign Election Management Bodies (EMBs) through the 'International Cooperation Programme'.

Fourth agreement of ECI with Latin American countries:

- After signing MoUs with Mexico, Brazil and Chile in the past few years, this is the fourth MoU signed with an election management body in the Latin America region.
- ECI has so far signed a total of **31 MoUs** with election management bodies and international organizations across the globe.

Mutual cooperation by both the countries:

- Both the Election Commission of India and the Electoral Tribunal of Panama are members of the **Association of World Election Bodies (A-WEB)**.
- ET of Panama officials also participated in the International Conference on '**Inclusive Elections and Electoral Integrity**' organized by the ECI in March 2023.
- It was a part of the operation of '**Cohort on Elections Integrity**' under the aegis of '**Summit for Democracy**'.
- Officials from the Electoral Tribunal of Panama also participated in the '**International Election Visitors Program**' organized by the ECI during the state assembly elections in April 2021.

Association of World Election Bodies (A-WEB):

- A-WEB is the largest association of Election Management Bodies (EMBs) worldwide.
- A-WEB has 119 election management bodies as members and 20 regional associations/ organizations as associate members.
- The ECI delegation will participate in the 11th Executive Board Meeting of A-WEB and an International Conference in Cartagena, Colombia.

3. External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar's four-day visit to Tanzania (July 7, 2023)

Indian External Affairs Minister **S Jaishankar** went on a four-day official visit to **Tanzania** from 5 to 8 July 2023.

An Overview of the news:

- During his visit, External Affairs Minister Jaishankar attended the reception of **Indian Naval Ship Trishul**.
- Along with this, he also addressed the Indian expatriates and inaugurated the **statue of Swami Vivekananda**.
- In **Zanzibar**, he visited a water supply project funded by a line of credit from the Government of India.

10th India-Tanzania Joint Commission:

- The External Affairs Minister then visited the Tanzanian city of Dar-es-Salaam from 7-8 July 2023, where he co-chaired the 10th India-Tanzania Joint Commission Meeting with his counterpart.

IIT Madras at Zanzibar:

- To strengthen education ties between the two countries, the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) will open its first overseas campus in Zanzibar, Tanzania in October 2023.
- It will admit 50 undergraduate students and 20 master's students.
- The new IIT campus will be set up in Zanzibar under the name of **IIT Madras at Zanzibar**.
- Along with this, IIT will also open its other foreign campus in **Abu Dhabi and Kuala Lumpur**.

4. Member countries of the SCO should collaborate to fully capitalize on the potential of the Chabahar Port: PM Modi (July 5, 2023)

The Prime Minister has suggested that the member countries of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) should collaborate to fully capitalise on the potential of the Chabahar Port, especially with Iran's recent accession to this major regional organisation.

An Overview of the News

- During a virtual summit hosted by India, Iran was formally inducted as a full member of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO).
- The induction took place within the influential SCO, with the virtual summit serving as the forum for this announcement.

Chabahar Port:

- **Location and Access:** The Chabahar Port is located in Iran's Sistan-Balochistan province, at the mouth of the Strait of Hormuz.

- It provides direct access to the Indian Ocean and is situated outside the Hormuz Strait.
- **Importance and Potential:** As Iran's only seaport, the Chabahar Port has the potential to become a significant commercial hub in the region.
- Its strategic proximity to countries like Afghanistan, Pakistan, and India, along with its role in the International North-South Transport Corridor, contributes to its importance.

Chabahar Project:

- **Tripartite Agreement:** In May 2016, India, Iran, and Afghanistan signed a tripartite agreement to develop the Shahid Beheshti Terminal at Chabahar.
- This marked India's first foreign port project.
- **Objectives:** The agreement aimed to establish an International Transport and Transit Corridor at Chabahar.
- Key highlights of the project include the construction of the Chabahar Port and a rail line connecting it to Zahedan.
- **Bypassing Pakistan:** The Chabahar Port provides India with an alternative route to access Afghanistan and Central Asia, bypassing Pakistan.
- This offers increased trade and connectivity opportunities.

International North-South Transport Corridor (INSTC):

- **Description:** The INSTC is a multimodal transportation route that connects the Indian Ocean and the Persian Gulf to the Caspian Sea.
- It further extends to northern Europe through St. Petersburg, Russia.
- **Components:** The corridor encompasses seaports in the Persian Gulf and the Caspian region, as well as road and rail networks.
- **Objective:** The primary aim of the INSTC is to reduce transportation costs and transit time between India and Russia.
- Once fully functional, it is expected to significantly decrease transit time by nearly half.

5. Vietnam's Justice Minister Le Thanh Long's visit to India (July 5, 2023)

On July 2, 2023, a bilateral meeting between Union Minister of State for Law and Justice (Independent Charge) **Arjun Ram Meghwal** and **Vietnam's Justice Minister Le Thanh Long** was held in **New Delhi**.

An Overview of the news: -

- The meeting was also attended by a delegation from both sides, which included senior officials from the respective Ministries.
- Bilateral meeting between Minister of State for Law and Justice India and Vietnam

Opportunities for cooperation between the two countries:

- The Union Law Minister recalled the close friendly relations that the two countries have developed over the last more than 50 years.
- Appreciated Vietnam for being a key partner of India's '**Act East Policy**'.
- Both sides used the occasion to discuss measures for cooperation in various fields of law and justice.
- This will take bilateral relations to new heights commensurate with the status of a Comprehensive Strategic Partner.
- The meeting proved fruitful in efforts towards the possibility of signing an MoU to promote cooperation between the two countries in the field of law and justice.
- The two sides have also agreed to hold consultations at the official level to take forward discussions on wide-ranging areas of cooperation in the field of law and justice, including the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding.

- The interactions and discussions that took place in this provided a comprehensive understanding of the subject matter and paved the way for collaboration and exchange of ideas.
- During the workshop, both the countries expressed their commitment to establish stronger defense ties, conduct joint research, transfer technology and explore avenues for strategic partnership.

7. PM Modi conferred Egypt's highest state honour (June 26, 2023)

Prime Minister **Narendra Modi** was awarded the '**Order of the Nile,**' Egypt's highest honor, by President **Abdel Fattah El-Sisi** during a ceremony at the Presidential palace in Cairo on 25th June.

An overview of the news

- The '**Order of the Nile**' was established in **1915** and is bestowed upon **heads of states, crown princes, and vice presidents** who have rendered invaluable services to Egypt or humanity.
- This is the **13th highest state honor** conferred upon Prime Minister Modi.
- During the first bilateral visit by an Indian Prime Minister to Egypt in 26 years, India and Egypt elevated their relationship to a 'Strategic Partnership' following extensive discussions between Modi and El-Sisi.

Political and security cooperation

- The talks focused on enhancing **political and security cooperation.**
- Modi and El-Sisi signed a **strategic partnership document**, which encompassed various areas of collaboration such as political and security cooperation, defense collaboration, trade and investment ties, scientific and academic exchanges, and strengthening people-to-people contacts.
- The two countries signed three more pacts covering agriculture and allied sectors, **protection and preservation of monuments and archaeological sites, and competition law.**
- Modi and El-Sisi also discussed further cooperation within the G-20 framework, emphasizing issues such as **food and energy insecurity, climate change**, and the need for the **Global South** to have a unified voice.
- Modi extended an invitation to El-Sisi to attend the **G-20 Summit in New Delhi in September.**

Egypt's historic Al-Hakim Mosque

- Before returning to India, Modi visited Egypt's historic **Al-Hakim Mosque** in Cairo, which dates back to the **11th century.**

- The mosque has been restored with the assistance of India's **Dawoodi Bohra community**.
- Modi admired the intricate carved inscriptions on the walls and doorways of the mosque, which was **constructed in 1012**.
- Al-Hakim Mosque is the **fourth oldest mosque** in Cairo and the **second Fatimid mosque built in the city**.

8. India and UAE signed a Mutual Recognition Arrangement for Authorized Economic Operators (June 24, 2023)

India and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) on 23 June have signed a **Mutual Recognition Arrangement for Authorized Economic Operators**.

An overview of the news

- The agreement was formally signed during the **World Customs Organization's (WCO) Customs Co-operation Council meeting** held in **Brussels**.

Aim of Mutual Recognition Arrangement

- The Mutual Recognition Arrangement aims to **promote trade facilitation and ease of doing business** between the two countries.
- It establishes a framework for recognizing **Authorized Economic Operators (AEOs)** from both India and the UAE.

Significance

- The recognition of AEO status will streamline **customs procedures, reduce administrative burdens, and lower costs** for authorized businesses.
- This agreement signifies an important milestone in the **economic cooperation** between India and the UAE and is expected to **strengthen bilateral trade ties**.

- By leveraging the benefits of the Mutual Recognition Arrangement, both countries aim to
- enhance **trade facilitation, improve the ease of doing business, and encourage investments.**

India-UAE Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA)

- The signing of this arrangement is in line with the broader objective of the **India-UAE Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA)** signed in **February 2022.**
- CEPA aims to significantly **increase the total value of bilateral trade** in goods and services within five years.
- The Mutual Recognition Arrangement is expected to contribute to achieving the trade targets set under the CEPA, fostering **greater economic growth and cooperation** between India and the UAE.

9. India and US sign Artemis Accord to take Space cooperation to new heights (June 24, 2023)

Artemis Accords

During his state visit to the United States, Prime Minister **Narendra Modi signed the Artemis agreement** with the **US National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA)**, highlighting the growing importance of India's role as a global space power.

An overview of the news

- The agreement establishes the foundation for cooperation in space exploration and underlines India's commitment to peaceful space activities.

Joint Mission to the International Space Station (ISS)

- In addition to the Artemis agreement, NASA and the **Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO)** have agreed to launch a joint mission to the **International Space Station in 2024.**
- This collaborative effort will enable both countries to advance their space research and exploration efforts.

What is the Artemis Agreement?

- The Artemis Agreement outlines principles for international cooperation in **space exploration, particularly relating to the use of the Moon, Mars, comets and asteroids for peaceful purposes.**
- As non-binding multilateral arrangements, these agreements allow governments, including the United States and other participating nations, to contribute to NASA's Artemis program.

Significance of the Artemis Program

- NASA's Artemis program aims to **advance scientific discoveries and expand human exploration of the lunar surface.**
- By studying the **Moon**, researchers hope to make breakthroughs that could lead to advances in various fields such as **technology, medicine and our understanding of the universe.**
- The program focuses on sending astronauts to **Mars and exploring other planets and celestial bodies.**

Establishment of the Artemis Accord

- **In 2020, NASA** established the Artemis Agreement in collaboration with the **US State Department.**
- These agreements serve as agreements between the United States and the **seven other founding member states**, reinforcing commitment to international space treaties and agreements.
- These agreements promote best practices, including the **transparent sharing of scientific data with the public.**

Guiding principle of Accord

- The purpose of the Artemis Agreement is to create a framework for **peaceful and cooperative space exploration.**
- These principles facilitate progress while ensuring ethical and responsible practices in space.
- Since many countries and private companies are actively engaged in **lunar missions and operations, agreements establish shared principles governing civilian exploration and use of outer space.**
- Key principles include conducting all activities in space peacefully and with **full transparency, sharing research findings, registering space objects, and releasing scientific data.**

Nations Participating in the Artemis Accord

- The agreement was signed in **October 2020** by the directors of the national space agencies of the **United States, Australia, Canada, Japan, Luxembourg, Italy, the United Kingdom and the United Arab Emirates.**
- Ukraine joined the agreement a month later. Subsequently, in 2021 the agreement was extended to **South Korea, New Zealand, Brazil, Poland, Isle of Man and Mexico.**
- In 2022, **Israel, Romania, Bahrain, Singapore, Colombia, France, Saudi Arabia, Rwanda, Nigeria and the Czech Republic** also become signatories.

- **Spain, Ecuador and now India** have also joined it, taking the total number of participating countries to **28**.

10. India-United States Defence Acceleration Ecosystem (INDUS X) launched in Washington DC (June 22, 2023)

India-United-States-Defence-Acceleration-Ecosystem-(INDUS-X)

The **U.S. Department of Defense** and the **Indian Ministry of Defense** launched the **India-U S Defense Acceleration Ecosystem (INDUS-X)** on 21st June at an event hosted by the U S-India Business Council.

An overview of the news

- The launch of INDUS-X is a major milestone in promoting US-India **defense cooperation, innovation, and job creation**.
- The initiative seeks to enhance defense capabilities and contribute to global peace, security and prosperity while reaffirming commitment to a free and open **Indo-Pacific region**.

Significance of INDUS-X

- INDUS-X aims **to revitalize defense industrial cooperation** between the United States and India, promoting the development of new technologies and fostering collaboration in manufacturing.
- It represents a strategic effort to strengthen bilateral ties and unlock the potential for advancements in the defense sector.

Job Creation and Economic Growth

- INDUS-X holds the potential to **create job opportunities** for working families in both countries.
- By fostering collaboration between U S and Indian start-ups, the initiative aims **to generate employment and drive economic growth**, contributing to global peace, security, and prosperity.

Collaboration Agenda

- This agenda outlines various initiatives that INDUS-X stakeholders intend to pursue, complementing existing government-to-government collaboration.
- These initiatives include the formation of a **Senior Advisory Group for Start-ups**.

Indo-Pacific Defence Capabilities

- U S and Indian officials have affirmed that INDUS-X will act as a catalyst for innovation and contribute to equipping their armed forces with the necessary capabilities to ensure the defense of a free and open Indo-Pacific region.

- This emphasizes the shared commitment to regional security and stability.
