What is in the proposed PM PRANAM scheme?

During his India visit he also participated in the first **India-Singapore Ministerial Roundtable (ISMR)** held on 17 September in New Delhi with Nirmala Sitharaman. The ISMR is a new mechanism between the two countries to boost economic cooperation between the two countries.

The Deputy Prime Minister Wong also visited Gujarat during his India visit.
