1. Muthamizh Selvi becomes first woman from Tamil Nadu to scale Mount Everest (June 8, 2023)

Muthamizh Selvi, 36, a resident of Johilpatti, Virudhunagar, became the first woman from Tamil Nadu to scale Mount Everest.

An Overview of the News

- Tamil Nadu Sports Development and Youth Welfare Minister **Udhayanidhi Stalin** felicitated Muthamizh Selvi for his remarkable achievement.
- Mount Everest is the highest peak of the Greater Himalayan mountain range located on the border of **Nepal and China (Tibet) in Asia.**
- Mount Everest is called **Devagiri in Sanskrit, Chomolungma in Tibetan,** Chu-mu-long-ma-feng in **Chinese and Sagarmatha in Nepali.**
- On 29 May **1953, Edmund Hillary of New Zealand and Tensingh Norgay Sherpa,** an Indian citizen of Nepali origin, climbed Mount Everest for the first time.
- **Junko Tabei (Japan)** is the first woman to reach the summit of Mount Everest, as well as the first woman to climb the highest peaks on each of the 7 continents.
- Bachendri Pal is the first Indian woman to climb **Mount Everest in 1984. Santosh Yadav** is the first Indian woman to climb Everest twice in a row.

About Tamil Nadu

- The state was formed on **26 January 1950** but its boundaries were redrawn on **14 January 1969.**

5. Dennis Francis elected 78th UNGA president (June 5, 2023)

first TT citizen to be elected as the President of the UN General Assembly (UNGA).

An overview of the news

- The election took place at the UN headquarters in **New York, US**, on 1 June.
- Francis, who has served in the diplomatic service for over 40 years, was nominated on April 1 and faced no opposition in the election.
- He will serve as the 78th President of the UNGA.
- He will enforce the rules of procedure, such as opening and closing debates, regulating speaking times for representatives, suspending or adjourning debates, and setting the agenda for the assembly.

United Nations General Assembly (UNGA)

- It is the **United Nation's chief policy-making** and representative organ and was **created in 1945.**
- It is one of the six principal organs of the United Nations (UN).
- It serves as the main deliberative, policy making and representative organ of the United Nations.
- Its powers, structure, functions and procedures are set out in **Chapter IV** of the **United**Nations Charter.
- Its main functions are to prepare the budget of the United Nations, appoint nonpermanent members to the Security Council, appoint the Secretary-General of the United Nations, receive reports from other parts of the **United Nations system, and make** recommendations through resolutions.

6. Shalini Singh becomes first woman NCC cadet to complete mountaineering course (June 3, 2023)

Shalini-Singh-becomes-first-woman-NCC

20-year-old **Shalini Singh from Lucknow** has become the **first woman NCC cadet in India to complete a mountaineering course in the Himalayan region of Uttarakhand.**

An Overview of the News

- Shalini Singh scaled the **15,400 ft peak in Dring Valley in Uttarkashi district** of Uttarakhand as part of the course.
- The training course took place at **Tekla, Uttarkashi from 26 April to 6 May.**

The training was conducted under tough conditions, with **subzero (-14°C)**

- * temperatures.
- Shalini was the only woman cadet in the team of 45 NCC cadets.
- This included training in rock climbing, rappelling, snow and ice climbing and camping.
- Shalini Singh was admitted as **Senior Wing NCC Cadet in 67 UP Battalion.**

National Cadet Corps (NCC):

- It is the youth wing of the Indian Armed Forces, **headquartered in New Delhi,** India.
- It has been active since **July 16, 1948** and is open to school and college students on a voluntary basis.
- The NCC functions as a tri-services organisation comprising the Army, Navy and Air Force.
- Its primary aim is to develop the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizens.
- The **Soldier Youth Foundation** in India is a voluntary organisation that recruits cadets from high schools, higher secondary schools, colleges and universities across the country.
- On completion of their course, officers and cadets in NCC and Soldier Youth Foundation are not bound to serve in active military duty.
- Its emblem comprises three colours: red representing the Indian Army, dark blue representing the Indian Navy and light blue representing the Indian Air Force.

7. Latvian parliament elects Edgars Rinkevics as new president (June 3, 2023)

Latvian-parliament-elects-Edgars-Rinkevics-as-new-president In 2011, Edgars Rinkevics, Latvia's foreign minister, was elected as the new president by the 100-seat Saimaa legislature.

An Overview of the News

- In a close vote, **Edgars Rinkevics** secured 52 votes, more than the minimum needed to win the election.
- Edgars Rinkevics, aged 49, has previously held positions such as State Secretary in the Ministry of Defense and worked as a journalist with Latvian Radio in the 1990s.

8. Argentina's Celeste Saulo becomes first female Secretary-General of World Meteorological Organization (June 2, 2023)

Celeste Saulo of Argentina has been appointed as the first female SecretaryGeneral of the World Meteorological Organization (WMO).

An overview of the news

- Saulo won a landslide victory at the Congress of the United Nations Climate and Weather Agency in Geneva.
- She will take over from the outgoing secretary-general **Petteri Taalas of Finland** on January 1.
- Saulo has served as director of Argentina's National Meteorological Service since 2014.
- He said that at a time when inequality and climate change are the biggest global threats, WMO should contribute to strengthening meteorological and hydrological services to protect populations and their economies.
- The leader of the World Meteorological Congress is **elected every four years.**
- The agency plays an important role in coordinating international meteorological operations.
- It relies on satellites and thousands of weather stations to measure key parameters of the **atmosphere**, **land and sea**.

World Meteorological Organization (WMO)

- It was established in 1873 by the International Meteorological Organization.
- Headquarters Geneva, Switzerland
- On March 23, 1950, the World Meteorological Organization became a specialised organisation of the United Nations.
- This organisation uses the latest information on meteorology, climatology, hydrology and related geophysical research to contribute to the safety and welfare of society.

9. Mission Olympic Cell approved Neeraj Chopra's proposal to train in Kuortane, Finland (June 2, 2023)

The Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS) Mission Olympic Cell (MOC) on 28th May approved Olympic Gold Medallist Neeraj Chopra's proposal to train in Kuortane, Finland.

An overview of the news

- Neeraj will train at the Kurtane Olympic Training Center in Finland.
- He is scheduled to compete in several **World Athletics events next month**.
- The MOC members also approved paddler **Payas Jain's** proposal for an advanced training camp in Taiwan.
- Proposals to get Indian table tennis stars Manika Batra and Sathiyan
 Gnanasekaran's personal trainers Aman Balgu and Raman Subramaniam for a number of events were also approved by the MOC.
- The ministry said that the financial assistance will cover air travel expenses of the players, camp expenses, boarding and lodging expenses, medical insurance and pocket money apart from other expenses.
- Neeraj, who recently became the first Indian Javelin thrower to become World Number One, followed a similar training plan in 2022 as well.

10. Amarendu Prakash takes charge as new SAIL chairman (June 2, 2023)

- Prakash is heading the Bokaro Steel Plant as Director-in-Charge from September 2020.
- Under Prakash's leadership, **Bokaro Steel Plant achieved remarkable** production records in FY22 and FY23.

Steel Authority of India Limited (SAIL):

- It is a leading steel making company in India.
- SAIL is a **Public Sector Undertaking (PSU)** under the **Ministry of Steel, Government of India.**

- SAIL aims to promote the development and production of steel in the country.
- The history of SAIL begins with India's First Five Year Plan (1951-1956).
- Hindustan Steel Limited (HSL) was established in 1954, which later became the flagship company of SAIL.
