1. India bags 16 gold medals at the South Asian Youth Table Tennis Championship 2023 (May 18, 2023)

The three-day international event **South Asian Youth Table Tennis Championship 2023** concluded in **Itanagar on May 17**.

An overview of the news

- In this event more than 100 athletes from six countries **Bhutan, Bangladesh, India, Maldives, Sri Lanka and Nepal** participated.
- **Arunachal Pradesh Governor, Lt. General KT Parnaik, (Retd.)** attended the closing ceremony as Chief Guest at **Dorjee Khandu Indoor Stadium, Itanagar**.
- The hosts India won all the gold medals on offer on the last day at the Dorjee Khandu Indoor Stadium on 17th May.
- Besides, the Indians also bagged four silver medals in the singles.
- **Sri Lanka, Bangladesh and Maldives** were also among the medals, while Bhutan, who participated only in the singles events, drew a blank.
- On the second day of the championships, the Indians won three gold medals in the U-15 Boys, U-19 Girls and U15 Girls, while Nepal claimed the U-19 Boys gold.
- In the Under-19 Boys singles, Ankur Bhattacharjee defeated Payas Jain 4-2 to claim the gold.
