1. Olympic silver medalist Nigel Amos banned (May 5, 2023)

Olympic silver medalist Nigel Amos banned

Nigel Amos, the Olympic silver medalist in the men's 800 metres at the 2012 Olympics, received a three-year ban for doping by the Athletics Integrity Unit.

- An Overview of the News
- Nigel Amos, from Botswana, tested positive for the banned substance GW1516 in the lead-up to last year's track world championships, which is known to cause cancer in rodent tests.
- The ban has been reverted to his provisional suspension in July 2020 and will last until 2025, meaning he will not be able to participate in the 2024 Paris Olympics.

Athletics Integrity Unit (AIU):

- It was established in April 2017 by the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF).
- The primary objective of the AIU is to prevent, detect and investigate doping in athletics.
- The AIU operates independently of the IAAF to ensure fairness and transparency in its work.
- The AIU is responsible for enforcing the World Anti-Doping Code in Athletics and has the authority to ban athletes who violate the code.

2. Olympic and world title winning star athlete 'Tori Bowie' passes away (May 5, 2023)

Olympic and world title winning star athlete 'Tori Bowie' passes away

Star athlete **Tori Bowie's** management company informed on 3 May 2023 that the **US sprinter and long jumper**, who won three **Olympic medals and two world titles**, died at the age of 32.

An Overview of the News

- For the past few days neither Tory was seen anywhere in public nor there was any news of her. Later, when police officers went to his **Orlando (Florida) residence** to inquire about her news, Bowie was found dead.
- The sheriff's department informed that Bowie's death was not being investigated as a suspicious death. That is, the officials are considering Tori's death as a natural death.

Career of Tori Bowie

- Bowie was raised by her grandmother in the rural environment of **Mississippi (USA)**. She **switched to long jump in 2014** and became the fastest woman in the world that year.
- Bowie also took silver in the **100m, bronze in the 4x100m relay and gold in the 200m at the 2016 Rio Olympics**.
- Bowie became **world champion in 2017** by winning the **world 100m title in London**.
- She finished fourth at the **2019 World Long Jump Championships in Doha**, her last major competition.
- President of the International Olympic Committee (IOC): **Thomas Bach**.

3. Ajay Banga appointed as new President of World Bank (May 4, 2023)

Ajay Banga appointed as new President of World Bank

Indian-origin Ajay Banga has been officially elected as the **new President of the World Bank**.

An Overview of the News

- Ajay Banga was nominated for this post by **US President Joe Biden in February**.
- The **25-member Executive Board of the World Bank** elected Ajay Banga, who previously served as the CEO of Mastercard, to hold the position for a period of five years from June 2.
- The World Bank provides loans and grants to low- and middle-income countries for capital projects.
- It is made up of two institutions: the **International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD)** and the International Development Association (IDA).
- The World Bank was **established in 1944** at the **Bretton Woods Conference** along with the **International Monetary Fund (IMF)**.
- Its lending strategy is guided by the **United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals and environmental and social safeguards**.

About the United States

- It is primarily a country **located in North America**.

4. Vanessa Hudson appointed as the new CEO of Qantas Airways Ltd (May 4, 2023)

Vanessa Hudson has been named as the **new CEO of Qantas Airways Ltd**, becoming the **first woman to hold the position in the airline's history**.

An Overview of the News

- Hudson's appointment was announced on May 2, and she will officially take over from outgoing CEO **Alan Joyce** when he retires in November.
- Hudson has had an impressive 28-year career at Qantas, during which he has held a number of senior positions, including Chief Customer Officer and Senior Vice President for the Americas and New Zealand.

About Qantas Airways Ltd.

5. Samajwadi Pandit Ramkishan becomes "centenary man" at the age of 97 (May 3, 2023)

Pandit Ramkishan, a famous **socialist leader**, was honoured with the title of "**Shatabdi Purush**" (**Man of the Century**) in New Delhi for his contribution to Indian socialism.

An Overview of the News

- The award was presented to him during the birth centenary celebrations of renowned socialist thinker and **parliamentarian Madhu Limaye**.
- Ramkishan is considered the most senior and **distinguished figure in Indian socialism** and has been recognized as the "**Socialist Centenary Man**".
- The event was attended by several senior politicians including former Jammu and Kashmir Governor **Satya Pal Malik**, CPI(M) general secretary **Sitaram Yechury**, INLD leader **Abhay Singh Chautala** and **JDU leader KC Tyagi**.
- Ramkishan took an active part in socialist movements led by other prominent leaders like **Jayaprakash Narayan and Lohia** and was jailed several times, including during the **Emergency period**.
- He served as a **member of the Lok Sabha once in 1977** and was elected to the **Rajasthan Legislative Assembly four times in 1962, 1967, 1974 and 1990**.
- Ramkishan fought for the rights of tribals, Dalits and the poor and was arrested several times.

About Madhu Limaye

- Madhu Limaye was a **prominent Indian socialist essayist and activist in the 1970s**.

- She was a follower of **Ram Manohar Lohia** and a close associate of **George Fernandes**, and played a key role in building the socialist movement in India.
- She actively participated in the **movement against the Emergency** imposed by the **Indira Gandhi government in 1975** and was involved in the formation of the Janata Party, which came to power at the Center after the Emergency was lifted.
- During his time in the **Janata government**, Limaye worked towards promoting socialist policies and ensuring social justice for all.

6. Paraguay's Colorado Party's Santiago Peña wins presidential election (May 3, 2023)

Paraguay's Colorado Party's Santiago Peña wins presidential election

Santiago Peña, an economist from **Paraguay's ruling conservative Colorado party**, won the **country's presidential election**.

An Overview of the News

- The election was decided in a single round of voting, and with nearly all ballots counted, **Santiago Peña received over 42% of the vote**.
- His main challenger, **Efraín Alegre**, who represented the **Concertación Nacional coalition**, received about **28% of the vote**.
- The Colorado Party has been the dominant political force in Paraguay for more than 70 years, and Santiago Peña's victory solidified its hold on power.
- Despite an expected economic growth of more than 4% this year, Paraguay still struggles with high levels of poverty and corruption.

About Paraguay

7. Air Marshal Balakrishnan Manikantan takes over as AOC-in-C Southern Air Command (May 3, 2023)

Air Marshal Balakrishnan Manikantan took over as the Air Officer Commanding-in-Chief (AOC-in-C) of the Southern Air Command on May 1, 2023.

An Overview of the News

- He is an **alumnus of Sainik School Kazhakootam** and National Defense Academy, and was commissioned into the Indian Air Force on June 7, 1986.
- **Manikantan has flown over 5400 hours** on various types of helicopters and fixed-wing aircraft, and is a Helicopter Combat Leader and a Type Qualified Flying Instructor.
- He has completed instructional tenure at **National Defense Academy and Tactics and Air Combat Development Establishment (TACDE)**.
- He has commanded a frontline helicopter unit and two major IAF stations, and has held the appointments of Senior Air and Administrative Staff Officer (SAASO) at HQ Maintenance Command and ACIDS Int-C at HQ IDS, responsible for international defence cooperation .
- Prior to assuming the present appointment, he was the Senior Air Force Officer handling Air Operations at the Eastern Air Command.
- The Air Marshal is a recipient of the Presidential Awards of **Ati Vishisht Seva Medal (AVSM) and Vayu Sena Medal (VM)**.

About Indian Air Force

- It is a branch of the **Indian Armed Forces** responsible for **defending Indian airspace and conducting air operations in times of war**.

An Overview of the News

- Mohanty is a **renowned physicist** and is currently serving as the **Director of Bhabha Atomic Research Center (BARC)**.
- He will be responsible for overseeing **India's nuclear program** and **exploring the use of nuclear energy for non-military purposes**.
- **Mohanty will replace KN Vyas**.
- The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet has approved the appointment of Mohanty till the age of 66 years i.e. up to 10.10.2025 or until further orders, whichever is earlier.
- Mohanty was appointed as **BARC director in March 2019**.

Bhabha Atomic Research Center (BARC):

- It is a **nuclear research centre located in Trombay, Mumbai**.
- It was **established in 1954** by a renowned physicist **Dr. Homi J. Bhabha**, who served as the founding director of the institute.
- BARC primarily focuses on **nuclear energy research including design and development of nuclear reactors, fuel cycle technologies and radiation processing**.

- The organisation also conducts **basic and applied research** in areas such as **physics, chemistry and biology**.
- BARC operates several nuclear facilities, including the **Dhruv, Cirrus and Poornima-II reactors**.
- The **Department of Atomic Energy (DAE)** controls BARC, and the DAE reports directly to the **Prime Minister's Office**.

10. King Charles III confers Britain's Honorary MBE on Dr. M.N. Nandakumar (May 2, 2023)

King Charles III confers Britain's Honorary MBE on Dr. M.N. Nandakumar

King Charles III awarded an Honorary MBE to Dr MN Nandakumar, a renowned Sanskrit scholar and executive director of the **Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan Center in London**, for his contribution to Indian classical arts in Britain.

- Dr. M.N. Nandakumar has been associated with the **Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan Center in London** for 46 years and has hosted Prince Charles on several occasions at the centre, which promotes Indian culture.
- **Britain's Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office** confirmed the award.
- The Honorary MBE award is given to foreign nationals for their services in public life.
- Dr. Nandakumar originally **hails from Mattur village in Karnataka** and joined Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan Kendra as a Sanskrit teacher while completing his PhD at the School of Oriental and African Studies (SOAS) in London in the 1970s.
- He has been the executive director of the building since 1995.
