1. Neeraj Chopra makes history, becomes World No 1 in men's javelin throw (May 23, 2023)

Tokyo Olympics gold medalist Neeraj Chopra on May 22 achieved the **number one ranking in men's javelin throw** for the first time. This is a major milestone in his career.

An overview of the news

- Neeraj Chopra is on top with 1455 points, 22 ahead of Anderson Peters of Granada.
- Chopra rose to world No. 2 on August 30, 2022, but has since been overtaken by the defending world champion, Peters.
- In 2022, **Neeraj won the Diamond League 2022 final in Zurich** in September, making him the first Indian athlete to do so.
- Tokyo Olympics silver medallist **Jakub Vadlejch of Czech Republic was third** with 1416 points.
- The Indian national record holder in men's javelin throw, took part in the season-opening **Doha Diamond League** on May 5 and finished first with a throw of 88.67m.
- Anderson Peters finished third in Doha with a throw of 85.88m.

- Several Congress MLAs including Dr G Parameshwara, KH Muniyappa, KJ George, MB Patil, Satish Jarkiholi, Priyank Kharge, Ramalinga Reddy and BZ Zameer Ahmed Khan took oath as ministers in the state cabinet.
- The ceremony was attended by Congress leaders Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi and chief ministers of Tamil Nadu, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan and Himachal Pradesh, as well as other political leaders.
- The Congress government in Karnataka is now officially established.

- PNGRB is responsible for promoting competitive markets and addressing matters related to the petroleum and natural gas sectors.
- One of the major objectives of PNGRB is to ensure uninterrupted and adequate supply of petroleum, petroleum products and natural gas throughout the country.

6. Dr. Manoj Soni took the Oath of Office and Secrecy as the Chairman of UPSC (May 18, 2023)

- He served as Vice-Chancellor of MS University of Baroda for one term and Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Open University, Gujarat for two terms, making him the youngest Vice-Chancellor in independent India.

UPSC:

- It is a **constitutional body** established under **Articles 315-323 Part XIV Chapter** II of the **Constitution of India**.
- It discharges its duties, functions and obligations assigned under Article 320.
- It is responsible for conducting examinations and interviews for the appointment of civil servants in the Central Government.

- Junko Tabei (Japan) is the first woman to reach the summit of Mount Everest, as well as the first woman to climb the highest peaks on each of the 7 continents.
- Bachendri Pal is the first Indian woman to climb Mount Everest in 1984.
- Santosh Yadav is the first Indian woman to climb Everest twice in a row.

10. Govt appoints Ravneet Kaur as CCI Chairperson (May 16, 2023)

The government has appointed **Ravneet Kaur** as the **new chairperson of the Competition Commission of India (CCI).**

An overview of the news

- Since the departure of **Ashok Kumar Gupta** in October 2022, there is no full-time chairman in the CCI for the last seven months.
- She will replace CCI member **Sangeeta Verma** who has been serving as the interim chairperson since October last year after Ashok Kumar Gupta stepped down.

- Kaur, a 1988 IAS officer of Punjab cadre, will be appointed for a period of five
- **years** from the date of assuming charge or till the date of attaining the age of 65 years or until further orders, whichever is earlier.
- Kaur has held several positions in the government over the past two decades, besides serving as the chairperson of the India Tourism Development Corporation between 2017 and 2019.

Competition Commission of India (CCI)

- It is the **chief national competition regulator** in India.
- It was set up under the Competition Act, 2002.
- It comes under the **Ministry of Corporate Affairs.**
- It **promotes healthy market competition** and prevents activities that have an adverse effect on competition in India.
- CCI also approves merger and acquisitions of companies in India so that the two merging entities do not dominate the market unfairly.
