3. Five new countries elected as non-permanent members of the UN Security Council (June 7, 2023)

United Nations Security Council (UNSC)

Algeria, Guyana, the Republic of Korea, Sierra Leone and Slovenia were elected non-permanent members of the UN Security Council on 6 June for a two-year term.

An overview of the news

- The newly elected members will take up their new responsibilities on **January 1, 2024** and serve till **December 31, 2025**.
- Slovenia defeated Belarus by a vote of 153 to 38, while Algeria, Guyana, Sierra Leone and the Republic of Korea were elected unopposed.
- These new members will replace Albania, Brazil, Gabon, Ghana and the United Arab Emirates at present when their two-year term ends on 31 December 2023.

Election of non-permanent members

- Voting is done by secret ballot and candidates have to get a two-thirds majority, or 128 votes.
- In all, **192 countries** voted to fill five seats on the council allocated to the Africa and Asia-Pacific groups, and one each to Eastern Europe and Latin America and the Caribbean.

About United Nations Security Council (UNSC)

- It was established in 1945 by the United Nations Charter.
- It is one of the six major organs of the United Nations.
- The other 5 organs of the United Nations are the **United Nations General Assembly (UNGA), the Trusteeship Council, the Economic and Social Council, the International Court of Justice and the Secretariat.**
- It has five permanent members China, France, Russia, the United Kingdom, and the United States, collectively known as the P5.
- Any one of them can veto a resolution.

4. Oil tanker breaks down in Egypt's Suez Canal (June 6, 2023)

On 4 June, an oil tanker broke down in the Suez Canal, a major global waterway, disrupting traffic and temporarily halting the transit of other ships.

An overview of the news

- As a result of the breakdown, **eight other vessels in the convoy were affected by the disruption.**
- The Seavigour was part of the north convoy, which moves from the **Mediterranean**Sea to the Red Sea.
- The Suez Canal Authority deployed three **tugboats** to tow the stranded tanker away from the single-lane area.
- The goal was to move the tanker to a double-lane section at the **17 kilometer mark,** allowing other vessels to continue their transit.

About Seavigour

• According to MarineTraffic, the Seavigour is a tanker **built in 2016**, measuring 274 meters (899 ft) in length and 48.63 meters (159 ft) in width.

Previous Incidents in the Suez Canal

- The recent incident adds to a series of vessels encountering difficulties in the vital waterway.
- Notably, in **March 2021,** the Panama-flagged Ever Given, a massive container ship, blocked the canal for six days, causing significant disruptions to global trade.

About Suez Canal

- The Suez Canal, **operational since 1869**, serves as a **crucial link for oil, natural gas, and cargo transportation.**
- The Suez Canal is an artificial sea-level waterway running north to south from the Isthmus of Suez in Egypt to connect the Mediterranean Sea and the Red Sea.
- This canal separates the continent of **Africa from Asia.**
- It provides the shortest sea route between **Europe and the lands surrounding the Indian and Western Pacific Oceans.**
- The Suez Canal is one of the **busiest trade routes in the world**. About **12 percent of the world's total trade** passes through this canal daily.

5. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh holds talks with his US counterpart Lloyd Austin (June 6, 2023)

Defence-Minister-Rajnath-Singh

Defence Minister **Rajnath Singh**, held discussions with **US Defence Secretary Lloyd Austin** in New Delhi on 5th June.

An overview of the news

- The meeting focused on **strengthening defence cooperation** in various areas, including aligning strategic interests and enhancing security cooperation.
- During the talks, Minister Singh emphasized the significance of the **India-US partnership** in ensuring a free, open, and rules-based Indo-Pacific region.

- Facilitation to enhance cooperation between the **defense start-up ecosystems** of the two countries was also discussed.
- A roadmap for **US-India defense industrial cooperation** was agreed upon, which will shape their cooperation in the years to come.
- They welcomed the recent dialogues focused on **Defense Artificial Intelligence and Defense Space.**
- Regional security issues were also discussed, reflecting their shared interest in promoting **peace and stability in the Indo-Pacific region.**
- The meeting was attended by senior officials of the Ministry of Defense including Chief of Defense Staff General Anil Chauhan, Defense Secretary Giridhar Armane and DRDO Secretary and Chairman Dr Sameer V Kamat.

6. Bangladesh records highest inflation rate in over a decade (June 6, 2023)

Bangladesh-records-highest-inflation-rate-in-over-a-decade Bangladesh recently experienced its highest monthly inflation rate in over a decade, with inflation reaching 9.94 percent in May.

An overview of the news

- This rate is the **highest since 2010-11** when it was recorded at **10.11 percent.**
- The data was released by the **Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics (BBS).**
- The increase in inflation is primarily attributed to the rise in both **food and non-food prices during this period.**
- The average inflation rate for the period between June 2022 and May 2023 has risen to 8.84 percent, surpassing the budgetary target of 5.6 percent.
- In comparison, the inflation rate in April 2023 was reported at **9.24 percent, and in March, it was 9.33 percent.**
- These figures indicate higher inflation compared to the corresponding months in April 2022 (6.29 percent) and March 2022 (6.22 percent).

To calculate inflation, the BBS has changed the base index from 2005-06 to 2021-22 and adopted a revised methodology for the compilation of the **Consumer Price Index** (**CPI**) based on the latest 2020 CPI manual of the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

7. 1st India-Namibia Joint Commission of Cooperation (June 6, 2023)

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar recently co-chaired the first India-Namibia Joint Commission with Namibian Foreign Minister Netumbo Nandi-Ndaitwah in Windhoek.

An overview of the news

- In his opening remarks, Dr. Jaishankar highlighted the special place Namibia holds in the hearts of Indians.
- He emphasized that India supports Namibian independence and expressed happiness at Namibia's rightful place in the international community.
- Dr. Jaishankar underlined the strong bond between India and Namibia, which is characterized by developmental cooperation, capacity building programs and political solidarity.
- The Joint Commission will assess the progress of India-Namibia relations. In addition, high-level visits and ongoing interactions will strengthen the **India-Namibia** partnership in the future.
- During his visit, the External Affairs Minister inaugurated the **India-Namibia Center of Excellence in Information Technology** in Windhoek. The center will contribute to research, cyber security and good governance.

About Namibia

- Namibia is a country located in **southwestern Africa**, bordering the **Atlantic Ocean** to the west.

8. President Droupadi Murmu conferred with highest civilian honour of Suriname (June 6, 2023)

Suriname awarded President Draupadi Murmu its highest civilian honour, the Grand Order of the Chain of Yellow Star, on 5 June, making her the first Indian to receive the award.

An overview of the news

- President Murmu was presented with the award by **Chandrikaprasad Santokhi**, President of the Republic of Suriname.
- He dedicated the award to successive generations of the **Indian-Surinamese community**, in recognition of the important role of the Indian diaspora in strengthening the fraternal ties between the two countries.
- During her state visit to Serbia and Suriname, President Draupadi Murmu arrived in **Paramaribo, Suriname** on 4 June.
- In addition, India and Suriname signed four important Memorandum of Understandings (MoUs) in the fields of health, agriculture and capacity building.
- The agreements were finalized after delegation level talks between President Murmu and President Santokhi.

About Suriname

- Suriname is a country located on the **northern coast of South America**. It is one of the **smallest countries in South America**.
- Formerly known as **Dutch Guiana**, Suriname was a plantation colony of the **Netherlands** that gained its independence on November 25, 1975.

9. RBI Governor launches financial inclusion dashboard Antardrishti (June 6, 2023)

- The progress of financial inclusion will be assessed against set parameters through an **Antardrishti dashboard**. Along with this, it will also help in monitoring.
- With the help of the dashboard, the areas of lack of **financial services on a large scale** in the country can be detected and then work will be done on the basis of this.
- Currently, the Antardrishti Dashboard will be used internally by RBI.
- Multi stakeholder approach will be adopted for the Antardrishti Dashboard to enhance **financial inclusion in future.**

Financial Inclusion Index

- The **Financial Inclusion Index was launched in 2021** to measure financial inclusion.
- In this, financial inclusion is measured on the basis of access, utility and quality.
- This index also includes information related to **banking**, **investment**, **insurance and postal services** etc. of an area.
- This index ranges from 0 to 100.
- 0 indicates complete financial exclusion, while 100 indicates complete financial inclusion.

Reserve Bank of India (RBI)

- Reserve Bank of India was set up under the **Reserve Bank of India act 1934**. It started functioning from **1 April 1935**.
- It was **nationalized in 1949** and now the government of India is the owner of RBI.
- It has the power to regulate Banks under the Banking Regulation Act 1949.
- It has the power to regulate the **Non-Banking Financial Company (NBFC)** under the **RBI act 1934.**
- RBI is also the regulator of the digital payment system under the **Payment and** settlement act 2007.

• The meeting was attended by representatives of 19 G20 member states, 10 invited countries and 22 international organizations.

Proposed deliverables

- The HWG has proposed a number of deliverables, including a mapping of ongoing initiatives in **health emergencies**, **prevention**, **preparedness and response**.
- The launch of a **Climate Change and Health Centre**, regional networks for vaccines, therapeutics and diagnostics (VTD) research and development, and the creation of a global medical countermeasure coordination platform were also discussed.

Global Initiative on Digital Health

- Another proposed 'Global Initiative on Digital Health' was launched.
- The initiative aims to establish an institutional framework for convergence of existing digital health initiatives.

Past HWG Meetings

 Health priorities were introduced and discussed in detail during the HWG meetings held in **Thiruvananthapuram and Goa** earlier this year, emphasizing the importance of advancing health objectives.
