1. EPFO adds 1.39 crore members during financial year 2022-23 (May 22, 2023)

Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO)

The Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) has added 1.39 crore members during the financial year 2022-23.

An overview of the news

- Provisional payroll data of EPFO highlights that it added over 13 lakh members in March 2023.
- According to the **Ministry of Labor and Employment**, out of the 13.40 lakh members added during March, over **seven lakh new members** have come under the EPFO ambit for the first time.
- Among newly joined members, the highest enrollment is in the age group of 18
 to 21 years with 2.35 lakh members, followed by about two lakh members in
 the age group of 22 to 25 years.
- The data also highlights that **more than 10 lakh members** rejoined the EPFO. These members changed their jobs and rejoined the establishments covered under EPFO.

About EPFO

- Employees Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) is a statutory organisation set up under the Union ministry of Labour and Employment was set up in 1951 by an Ordinance issued by the President.
- Later Parliament passed the Employees' Provident Funds Scheme, act 1952.
- It is the country's largest social security organisation.
- EPFO assists the **Central Board of Trustees** in the administration of a provident fund scheme, pension scheme and an insurance scheme for the registered establishments in India.

2. Meri LiFE, Mera Swachh Shahar' mega campaign launched by Union Minister Hardeep S Puri (May 22, 2023)

Meri-LiFE,-Mera-Swachh-Shahar Union Minister **Hardeep S Puri** launched the campaign '**Meri LiFE, Mera Swachh Shahar' in New Delhi.**

An Overview of the News

 The campaign promotes the Reduce, Reuse and Recycle (RRR) concept of waste management.

- This campaign will strengthen the resolve of the citizens under SBM-U 2.0 and also promote the purpose of Mission Life.
- RRR centres or one-stop collection centres were set up across the country on May 20.
- The centres will accept unused or used plastic items, clothing, shoes, books and toys.
- Citizens can donate used clothes, shoes, books, toys and plastic at RRR centres.
- The collected items will be recycled for reuse or turned into new products.
- The campaign will culminate with the resolution of LiFE on 5 June.

Mission LiFE:

- The mission was launched by the Prime Minister on October 20, 2022 at Kevadia, Gujarat.
- It aims to bring about behaviour change in individuals through simple, actionable steps.
- It aims to discourage mindless and wasteful consumption patterns and promote conscious and planned usage.
- The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change is the nodal ministry responsible for national level coordination and implementation of Mission LiFE.

Swachh Bharat Mission-Urban 2.0 (SBM-U 2.0)

- It was **launched on 1 October 2021** to achieve the vision of '**Garbage Free Cities'**.
- It aims to achieve safe sanitation in urban areas.
- **SBM-U 2.0** focuses on making all cities **'garbage free**' and ensuring proper grey and black water management.
- The mission emphasises source segregation of solid waste, 3R principles (reduce, reuse, recycle), scientific processing of municipal solid waste, and remediation of heritage dumpsites.

3. PM Modi conferred with highest civilian honours by Fiji, Papua New Guinea (May 22, 2023)

Prime MinisterNarendra Modi was conferred with the highest honor by Fiji and Papua New Guinea on 21 May.

An overview of the news

- PM Modi was honored with the island nation's highest civilian award during his visit to Papua New Guinea to attend the 3rd India-Pacific Islands Cooperation (FIPIC) summit.
- PM Modi was awarded "The Companion of the Order of Fiji" by his Fijian counterpart Sitweni Rabuka for his global leadership, a rare honor for a non-Fijian.

4. Supreme Court appointed Sapre Committee submits report on Adani-Hindenburg issue (May 22, 2023)

Sapre Committee

The **Supreme Court** on May 19 made public the report of the court-appointed expert panel in the **Hindenburg-Adani row case**.

An overview of the news

- American short-selling firm **Hindenburg issued** a report on January 24, 2023, calling Adani Group companies overvalued and alleging **manipulation of accounts.**
- However, Hindenburg's allegations were rejected by the Adani Group.
- But the opposition created a ruckus about this issue and when the matter reached the Supreme Court, the **Supreme Court had constituted a special committee to investigate.**

Highlights of the report

- The report states that the Adani group has disclosed all beneficial owners.
- There is no allegation that SEBI is rejecting the declaration of beneficial owners of Adani.
- Adani's retail stake has increased after the Hindenburg report.
- The report clearly states that prima facie **no violation of existing rules or laws** has been found.

8. Centre promulgates ordinance to constitute National Capital Civil Services Authority (May 20, 2023)

Centre-promulgates-ordinance-to-constitute-National-Capital-Civil-Services-Authority

Centre on 19th May promulgated an ordinance to create a National Capital Civil Service Authority that will have the power to recommend the transfer and posting of all Group A officers serving in Delhi.

An overview of the news

- The Ordinance, 2023 is being seen as an attempt to nullify last week's judgment by a constitution bench of the Supreme Court, which had handed over the reins of "services" to the Delhi government.
- The court then underlined the importance of the mandate of the people in a democracy expressed through an elected government.
- With a view to constitute this Authority for transfer of 'Group-A' officers of 'DANICS' (Delhi, Andaman-Nicobar, Lakshadweep, Daman and Diu, Dadra and Nagar Haveli (Civil) Services) Cadre, the Central Government has issued thisOrdinance.
- The Authority will be **headed by the Chief Minister** of Delhi and will include the **Chief Secretary and Principal Secretary, Home.**
- All matters to be decided by the Authority shall be decided by a majority of the members present and voting.
- The **Aam Aadmi Party (AAP)** has alleged that the Centre's ordinance on transfer of bureaucrats in Delhi is "unconstitutional" and a move to usurp the powers given to the Delhi government by the Supreme Court in service matters.
- This, effectively, means two bureaucrats, appointed by the Centre, could over-rule the elected CM.

9. Department of Pharmaceuticals to organise International Conference on 'India Pharma and India Medical Devices' (May 20, 2023)

10. India Achieves 47 % growth in Coal Production during last Nine Years (May 20, 2023)

Coal-Production

During the last nine years, India's total coal production has increased by 47 percent to 893.08 million tonnes (MT) and supply has reached 877.74 million tonnes, registering a growth of 45.37 percent.

An overview of the news

- In FY2023, the country has made a huge jump in the history of **coal production with 893.08 MT.**
- As per the action plan for 2023-24 of the Ministry of Coal, there is a **target of 1012** million tonnes of coal production in the financial year 2023-24 by increasing overall production, efficiency, stability and adoption of new technologies.

- During the financial year 2022-23, the Ministry of Coal has signed agreements for a total
- of 23 coal mines with a cumulative peak rated capacity (PRC) of **33.224 MT per annum.**
- It is expected that 25 coal blocks will be allotted for commercial mining during the **financial year 2023-24.**

Mission 'Coking Coal'

- Mission 'Coking Coal' has been launched by the government in August 2021 with a roadmap that will suggest ways to increase production and utilization of domestic coking coal in India by 2030.
- In this mission, mainly recommendations related to new **exploration**, **increasing production**, **increasing washing capacity**, **auction of new coking coal mines** have been made.

Objective of Mission 'Coking Coal'

- To increase coking coal production from 52 million tonnes (MT) in FY2022 to 140 MT in FY2030.
- To increase coking coal washing capacity from 23 MT in FY2022 to 61 MT in FY2023.

Use of Coking Coal

- It is mainly used in the manufacture of steel through the **blast furnace route.**
- Domestic coking coal generates very **high ash content (mostly between 18%-49%)** which is not suitable for direct use in blast furnaces.
- To reduce the ash percentage, the coking coal is washed and Indian prime and medium coking coal (<18% ash) is blended with imported coking coal (<9% ash) before use in the blast furnace.
