1. World Vape Day (WVD) - 30 May (May 31, 2024)

World Vape Day (WVD) is observed globally on 30th May each year.

An Overview of the News

- The purpose of WVD is to raise awareness about alternatives to tobacco products and to emphasize the safety of e-cigarettes and vaping as harm reduction tools for smokers.
- The theme for World Vape Day 2024 is "Misperception Epidemic".
- WVD is observed a day before "World No Tobacco Day" on 31st May, proclaimed by the World Health Organisation (WHO).
- Vaping involves inhaling an aerosol (vapour) created by an electronic cigarette (ecigarette).

Significance of World Vape Day (WVD) 2024:

- Misinformation: Highlights how misinformation is preventing smokers from switching to safer alternatives.
- Empowerment: Empowers individuals with evidence-based knowledge.
- Discussions: Encourages discussions about how vaping can contribute to a **smoke-free** world.

Background of WVD:

- Initiation: Initiated by the World Vapers' Alliance (WVA).
- Advocacy: WVA amplifies the voices of passionate vapers globally, empowering them to make a difference in their communities.
- Funding: WVA was first launched as an independent 501(c)(3) organization and is now partially funded by the Consumer Choice Center, a consumer advocacy group.

2. International Day of Action for Women's Health - 28th May (May 28, 2024)

Annually recognized worldwide on May 28, the International Day of Action for Women's Health aims **to promote women's health and well-being globally.**

- Its primary focus lies in advocating for Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) for women across the globe.
- The day serves as a platform to raise awareness and mobilize action to address the diverse health needs of women worldwide.

4. Indian Commonwealth Day - 24 May 2024 (May 25, 2024)

Commonwealth Day, formerly known as Empire Day, is annually observed by people across the Commonwealth.

An Overview of the News

 The date of observance varies among Commonwealth nations. Majority of Commonwealth nations observe it on the 2nd Monday of March. However, India and certain other nations observe it on 24th May.

In 2024:

- Indian Commonwealth Day was observed on 24th May 2024.
- Commonwealth Day was observed on 11th March 2024.

Significance and Themes:

- Commonwealth Day honors shared values such as democracy, human rights, and sustainable development.
- The theme for Commonwealth Day 2024 is 'One Resilient Common Future: Transforming our Common Wealth'.
- This theme is also adopted for the 27th Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) scheduled in Samoa from 21-26 October 2024.

Head of the Commonwealth:

- The British monarch is considered the symbolic head of the Commonwealth of Nations.
- His Majesty King Charles III is the current Head of the Commonwealth.

Historical Background:

- Commonwealth Day was initially celebrated as Empire Day on 24 May 1902, in honor of Queen Victoria following her demise in 1901.
- It was officially recognized as an annual event in 1916.
- The choice of 24 May coincides with the birth anniversary of Queen Victoria on 24 May 1819.
- In 1958, the then-Prime Minister (PM) of the United Kingdom (UK), Harold Macmillan, rebranded Empire Day as British Commonwealth Day, which later in 1966 became known as Commonwealth Day.

Date Changes:

- The date of observance of Commonwealth Day was changed multiple times:
 - Initially on June 10 and later, it was changed to the second Monday of March in 1977.
 - Since then, Commonwealth Day has been celebrated on the 2nd Monday in March every year.

5. International Day to End Obstetric Fistula - 23 May 2024 (May 24, 2024)

Every year on May 23rd, the world observes the United Nations International Day to End Obstetric Fistula.

- This day aims to raise awareness about obstetric fistula, a severe childbirth injury impacting both mothers and children.
- 2024 Theme: The theme for the 2024 International Day to End Obstetric Fistula is "Breaking the Cycle: Preventing Fistula Worldwide."

UNGA Resolution:

- On **20 December 2012**, the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) adopted resolution **A/RES/67/147**.
- This resolution designated 23 May as the International Day to End Fistula.
- First Observation: The first International Day to End Fistula was marked on 23 May 2013.

Threats to Biodiversity:

- In recent decades, biodiversity has faced numerous threats, including habitat loss, overexploitation of natural resources, pollution, invasive species, and climate change.
- These threats are driven by human activities, leading to species extinction and ecosystem degradation worldwide.

Establishment of International Day for Biological Diversity:

- The United Nations established the International Day for Biological Diversity to address the pressing issue of biodiversity loss and raise awareness about its importance.
- Originally observed on December 29th, it was shifted to May 22nd in 2000 to commemorate the adoption of the Convention on Biological Diversity and the Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro in 1992.
- It aims to champion the preservation and sustainable utilization of the diverse array of life on Earth.

Role of the Celebration:

- The annual celebration serves as a platform to highlight the critical role of biodiversity in maintaining ecosystems' delicate equilibrium.
- By emphasizing the importance of united conservation efforts, it motivates individuals, communities, and nations to protect the rich tapestry of life sustaining our planet.

8. National Anti-Terrorism Day - 21 May (May 21, 2024)

Annually commemorated on May 21, National Anti-Terrorism Day in India serves to heighten awareness regarding the perils posed by terrorism.

An Overview of the News

- Devoted to emphasizing the significance of solidarity in confronting this widespread threat.
- Aimed at fostering a greater understanding of the detrimental effects of terrorism on society and promoting collective action against it.

Background to Anti-Terrorism Day:

- Instituted in India on May 21 to commemorate the assassination of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi by an LTTE suicide bomber in 1991.
- This day was established after the 1991 elections by P.V. Narasimha Rao led Congress government.
- Its purpose was to pay tribute to Rajiv Gandhi and educate the public about the consequences of terrorist activities.
- National Anti-Terrorism Day was celebrated for the first time on 21 May 1992.

About Rajiv Gandhi:

- Sixth Prime Minister of India (1984-1989), taking office at the age of 40 following the assassination of his mother, Indira Gandhi.
- Achieved a historic victory in the 1984 elections, with the Congress party securing over 400 seats in the Lok Sabha.
- Pioneered the introduction of computers in Indian schools, laying the groundwork for the country's IT prowess.

India-Sri Lanka Peace Accord:

- Signed in 1987 between Rajiv Gandhi and Sri Lankan President Jaywardene to address the ethnic conflict in Sri Lanka.
- Aimed to end the civil war between Sri Lanka's Tamil minority and Sinhala majority, with the LTTE seeking an independent Tamil state.

- The agreement required the LTTE to disarm in exchange for substantial autonomy for
- Tamil regions, overseen by Indian Peace Keeping Force (IPKF).
- LTTE's refusal to disarm led to clashes with the IPKF, culminating in Rajiv Gandhi's assassination in 1991.

9. International Day of Light - 16 May (May 17, 2024)

The International Day of Light is observed annually on May 16 to recognize the significant role of light in science, culture, art, education, and sustainable development.

An Overview of the News

- It also highlights its impact on fields such as medicine, communications, and energy.
- 2024 Edition: May 16, 2024, marks the 7th edition of UNESCO's International Day of Light.

Significance of May 16

• Historical Event: May 16 commemorates the anniversary of the first successful laser operation in 1960 by American physicist and engineer Theodore Harold Maiman.

Background of International Day of Light

- UNESCO Resolution: On November 7, 2017, the UNESCO General Conference adopted a resolution (39 C/Resolution 16) officially proclaiming May 16 as the International Day of Light.
- Inaugural Observance: The first International Day of Light was observed on May 16, 2018.

About UNESCO

- The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) is a specialised agency of the United Nations (UN).
- It is also a member of the United Nations Sustainable Development Group (UN SDG), a coalition of United Nations agencies and organisations that aims to meet the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

10. National Dengue Day - 16 May (May 17, 2024)

National Dengue Day is observed annually across India on May 16 to raise awareness about Dengue, a mosquito-borne viral infectious disease, and to promote preventive measures.

An Overview of the News

- The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoH&FW) leads the observance of National Dengue Day.
- The 2024 theme for National Dengue Day is "Connect with Community, Control Dengue."

Background of National Dengue Day:

- The MoH&FW, Government of India (GoI) observes National Dengue Day on May 16 to initiate pre-monsoon activities and community sensitization.
- Anti Dengue Month is observed in July to raise community awareness and encourage keeping homes and surroundings free from mosquito breeding.

Dengue Management in India

- Program Management: Dengue and Dengue Hemorrhagic Fever (DHF) are managed under the National Vector Borne Disease Control Programme (NVBDCP).
- Nodal Agency: The National Centre for Vector Borne Diseases Control (NCVBDC) administers NVBDCP and oversees prevention and control strategies for vector-borne diseases, including Dengue.
- Other Diseases Covered: NVBDCP also addresses Malaria, Japanese Encephalitis (JE), Chikungunya, Kala-azar, and Lymphatic Filariasis.
- 2023 Dengue Cases: As of November 30, 2023, NCVBDC reported 2,34,427 cases of dengue fever in India.

Related Observances

- ASEAN Dengue Day: The Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) observes June 15th as ASEAN Dengue Day to raise awareness about Dengue.
 - Conception: The event was conceived in 2010 during the 10th ASEAN Health Ministers Meeting in Singapore.
 - First Launch: Indonesia hosted the inaugural ASEAN Dengue Day in Jakarta in 2011.
- WHO Involvement: In 2012, the World Health Organization (WHO) joined ASEAN in marking ASEAN Dengue Day on June 15th.
