1. 'Nepal International Tourism Expo' Kick Starts in Kathmandu (June 15, 2024)

The two-day 'Nepal International Tourism Expo (NITE)' kicked off in Kathmandu on June 14 to promote Nepal's tourism globally.

An Overview of the News

- Held from June 14-15, 2024 at Bhrikutimandap Exhibition Hall.
- Organised in collaboration with Kathmandu Metropolitan City in collaboration with Nepal Tourism Board and other associations.

Inauguration and Goals

- Inaugurated by Culture, Tourism and Civil Aviation Minister Hit Bahadur Tamang.
- Minister Tamang emphasised the event's potential to boost Nepal's international tourism presence.
- Minister Tamang noted ongoing efforts to meet the government's target of 1.6 million tourists this year, including resolving tourism sector issues and waiving VAT and unnecessary taxes on air tickets.

Participation and Networking

- It aims to unite tourism related businesses such as hotels, resorts, homestays, travel/ tour/trekking/mountaineering agencies, airlines and stakeholders from both domestic and international sectors.
- Participating countries include Nepal, India, Korea, Taiwan, Singapore, Maldives, USA, Netherlands, Sri Lanka, China, Thailand, UAE, Bangladesh, Vietnam, Malaysia and Bhutan, with a total of 155 entrepreneurs.
- Government of Bihar participated to promote tourism opportunities in ecotourism in Guru Circuit, Jain Circuit, Ramayana Circuit, Buddhist Circuit and Valmiki Tiger Reserve.
- Provides a two-day networking opportunity for national and international tourism stakeholders to foster collaboration and lasting partnerships.

2. Cyril Ramaphosa Re-Elected South African President (June 15, 2024)

Cyril Ramaphosa has been re-elected as the President of South Africa.

An Overview of the News

- This follows a landmark coalition deal between his African National Congress (ANC) and opposition parties.
- The new government combines Ramaphosa's ANC, the centre-right Democratic Alliance, and other smaller parties.

Parliament Vote

- Ramaphosa won convincingly in a Parliament vote.
- He received 283 votes against Julius Malema's 44 in the 400-member house.
- Malema is the leader of the far-left Economic Freedom Fighters.

Crucial Agreement

- Ramaphosa secured his second term after an agreement with the Democratic Alliance.

- The ANC lost its 30-year majority in Africa's national assembly.

Election Results

- In the recent elections, the ANC's vote share dropped to 40%.

- This marks the first national coalition where no party has a majority.

4. India Sends Humanitarian Aid to Papua New Guinea (June 13, 2024)

India dispatched a flight with 19 tons of humanitarian assistance and disaster relief supplies to Papua New Guinea.

An Overview of the News

• Response to Disaster: The aid is in response to a devastating landslide in Enga province, Papua New Guinea.

Aid Details

- Disaster Relief Material: 13 tons of supplies, including temporary shelters, water tanks, hygiene kits, and ready-to-eat meals.
- Medical Supplies: 6 tons of emergency use medicine and medical equipment, including dengue and malaria diagnostic kits and baby food.

Geographical Background Of Papua New Guinea:

- New Guinea, the world's second-largest island, covers an area of 785,753 km2.
- Situated in Oceania, it lies in the southwestern Pacific Ocean, adjacent to Australia, separated by the Torres Strait.
- The island is surrounded by numerous smaller islands to the west and east.

India-Papua New Guinea Relations:

- Diplomatic ties between India and Papua New Guinea were established in 1975 upon PNG's independence from Australia.
- India opened its resident mission in Port Moresby in 1996, reciprocated by PNG with a resident mission in New Delhi in 2006.
- Both nations, being Commonwealth countries, share warm relations, aligning closely on various global issues.
- Collaboration extends to international forums like the Commonwealth, Non-Aligned Movement, and the United Nations Organization.

Humanitarian Aid and Assistance:

- India extends humanitarian aid and disaster relief to PNG periodically.
- In 2023, assistance included drugs for HIV/AIDS patients.

- A grant-in-aid totaling US \$760,000 provided computers and peripherals to PNG in 2017-18.
- Capacity-building efforts involve training through programs like Indian Technical & Economic Cooperation Programme (ITEC) and the Colombo Plan.
- Ongoing implementation of aid proposals in various fields submitted by PNG under the annual grant-in-aid.
- A Centre of Excellence in Information Technology was established at the University of PNG with Indian financial and technical assistance.
- In 2018, Government of India provided assistance of US\$1 million for earthquake relief in areas affected by the PNG earthquake.

5. NCB Commences 'Nasha Mukth Bharat Pakhwada' to Fight Drug Abuse (June 12, 2024)

The Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) launched 'Nasha Mukt Bharat Pakhwada' to fight against drug abuse and illicit trafficking across the country.

An Overview of the News

- This observance runs from June 12th to the 26th of the month, coinciding with the International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking.
- The goal is to raise public awareness about the harmful effects of drug abuse.
- NCB aims to encourage widespread participation in an 'e-pledge' against drug abuse.
- The Indian government has reiterated its commitment to achieving a 'Drug Free India'.
- The International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking is recognized annually on June 26th by the United Nations General Assembly.

About Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB)

- NCB is an Indian central law enforcement and intelligence agency.
- It works under the Ministry of Home Affairs.
- It helps in combating drug trafficking as well as use of illegal substances as per the provisions of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act.
- It coordinates drug-related matters with state governments and other central departments in India.
- Established:- 1986

6. Harsh Malhotra Takes Charge as Minister of State for Corporate Affairs in New Delhi (June 12, 2024)

Harsh Malhotra has taken up the role of Minister of State for Corporate Affairs in New Delhi on June 12.

7. Prime Minister releases 17th installment of PM-Kisan Samman Nidhi (June 10, 2024)

Narendra Modi started his third term as Prime Minister. Immediately after taking office, the Prime Minister approved the release of the 17th installment of PM-Kisan Samman Nidhi.

An Overview of the News

• Rs 20,000 crore has been allocated in this installment, which will benefit about 9.3 crore farmers. This reflects the government's unwavering dedication towards farmer welfare.

Prime Minister's commitment:

- Prime Minister Modi reaffirmed his government's pledge to give priority to farmers and agriculture.

PM-KISAN Scheme Overview:

- Over the last ten years, 4.21 crore houses have been completed under the scheme for eligible poor families.
- Houses constructed under the scheme include basic amenities such as household toilets, LPG connections, electricity connections, and functional household tap connections.
- These amenities are provided through convergence with other schemes of the Central Government and State Governments.

About NDA

- The National Defence Academy (NDA) is the joint training institute for the Indian Armed Forces.
- Cadets from the Indian Army, Navy, and Air Force train together at the NDA.
- After NDA, cadets proceed to their respective service academies for further training before commissioning.
- Established:- 7 December 1949
- Commandant:- Vice Admiral Ajay Kochhar, AVSM, NM

9. Supreme Court of India Revamps Gender Sensitization Committee (June 3, 2024)

The Supreme Court of India has restructured its Gender Sensitization and Internal Complaints Committee (GSICC) to align with the 2013 regulations on Gender Sensitization and Sexual Harassment.
