1. UAE to Host World's Largest IUCN World Conservation Congress 2025 (June 5, 2023)

International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN)

The next International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) World Conservation Congress will be held from 9 to 15 October 2025 in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates.

An overview of the news

- The United Arab Emirates was selected as the host country based on a **rigorous evaluation process** of its candidature.
- The United Arab Emirates has a long-standing collaboration with IUCN, with seven IUCN Member organizations and the National Committee based there.
- The country is home to **50 scientific and policy experts** who are members of IUCN Commissions.
- The selection of the Abu Dhabi National Exhibition Center (ADNEC) as the venue was supported by a broad range of governmental authorities and civil society organizations.

About IUCN World Conservation Congress

- The IUCN Congress is the world's largest conservation event, held every four years.
- The Congress brings together leaders from government, civil society, Indigenous peoples' organizations, business, and academia.
- Its purpose is to determine the **world's most pressing environmental and development challenges** and develop actions to address them.
- The Congress will focus on delivering the **Global Biodiversity Framework** adopted by over **190 countries** in December.
- The Framework includes targets to enhance the **conservation of ecosystems**, species, and genetic diversity.

Previous IUCN World Conservation Congress

- The previous IUCN World Conservation Congress was held in 2021 in Marseille,
 France.
- It had almost 6,000 people attending on-site and over 3,500 participants online.
- During the congress, **148 resolutions and recommendations were adopted,** including calls to protect 80% of the Amazon by 2025 and halt deep-sea mining across the oceans.
- The global community was urged to adopt an ambitious One Health approach.

The IUCN Climate Crisis Commission was established during the congress.

About International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN)

- It is an international organization that works towards the conservation and sustainable use of nature and natural resources.
- It was **established in 1948** and is the world's largest and most diverse environmental network.
- It brings together governments, non-governmental organizations, scientists, and experts from around the world.
- The primary mission of the IUCN is **to encourage, and assist societies** throughout the world to conserve the integrity and diversity of nature.
- It strives to promote the sustainable use of natural resources and support actions that tackle pressing environmental challenges.

2. NIPCCD organized a Refresher Training Programme on Mission Vatsalya (June 4, 2023)

About Mission Vatsalya

- It promotes **family-based non-institutional care of children** in difficult situations based on the '**principle of institutionalization** of children' as a last resort.
- Before the year 2009, three schemes were implemented by the **Ministry of Women** and **Child Development** for children in need of protection -
- 1. Juvenile justice programs for children as well as children in need of care and protection
- 2. Integrated Program for Street Children
- 3. Child Home Assistance Scheme
 - In the **year 2010**, these three schemes were merged into a single scheme which is known as **Integrated Child Protection Scheme**.

- In the year 2017 its name was changed to "Child Protection Services Scheme"
- and in the year 2021-22 it was also changed to Mission Vatsalya.
- It aims to ensure a healthy and happy childhood for every child in the country.

National Institute of Public Cooperation and Child Development (NIPCCD)

- It is an autonomous organisation and its Headquarter is in New Delhi.
- It functions under the aegis of the **Ministry of Women and Child Development.**
- Its objective is to take a comprehensive view of child development and develop and promote programmes in pursuance of the National Policy for Children.

3. IRDAI issues draft Bima Vahaks guidelines (June 4, 2023)

IRDAI recently came out with draft guidelines for 'Bima Vahaks (BV)'.

An overview of the news

- It seeks to establish a **dedicated distribution channel** at the level of **Gram Panchayats.**
- The guidelines propose **Corporate Bima Vahaks and Individual Bima Vahaks** for the **distribution channel.**
- Corporate Bima Vahak would be **legal persons** registered in accordance with the respective laws and engaged by an insurer. Individual Bima Vahak could be any individual **appointed by an insurer or appointed by a Corporate Bima Vahak.**
- The BVs, both corporate and individual, would be authorised to undertake activities like the collection of proposal information, and KYC documents and coordinate claims-related services.
- As per the draft, every insurer will have to provide alternative mode for payment of premium by prospects or policyholders.

Objective of the guidelines

• This initiative aims to improve accessibility and availability of insurance in every nook and corner of the country.

Insurance Regulatory Development Authority of India (IRDAI)

- IRDAI is the **regulatory body** responsible for overseeing and regulating the insurance industry in India.
- It was set up to promote and regulate the insurance sector in India.
- It was **established on April 1, 2000**, under the provisions of the **Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority Act, 1999**.

The primary role of the IRDAI is to **regulate and promote the insurance industry**• in India.

6. NATO Launches Arctic exercise (June 3, 2023)

NATO countries have started military exercises in the Arctic region.

An Overview of the News

- The exercise involves approximately **1,000 allied forces from Norway,** the United Kingdom and the United States, along with NATO applicant Sweden.
- **Finland, NATO's newest member**, is hosting its first joint training in the Arctic region since joining the **Western alliance** in April.
- The exercise took place at **Rovajärvi in northern Finland**, near the Russian border, at one of Europe's largest artillery training grounds.

Oath to defend Finland:

- NATO has pledged to protect its newest member, Finland.
- The decision to join NATO was influenced by Russia's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022, which raised tensions between **Moscow and the West.**

Participation and Scope of Practice:

- About **6,500 Finnish soldiers and 1,000 vehicles** are participating in the exercise.
- The Arctic Challenge 2023 exercise also includes **150 aircraft from 14 NATO members** and partner countries.

- The objective of the exercise is to enhance military cooperation and
- preparedness in the Arctic region.
- Joint training reinforces NATO's commitment to collective defence and regional security.

North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO):

- It is a military alliance between North American and European countries formed in 1949 and headquartered in Brussels, Belgium.
- It was created during the Cold War as a defense pact to prevent Soviet expansion and protect member states from possible aggression.
- The founding members of NATO were the **United States, Canada, and ten European countries, including Belgium, Denmark, France, Iceland, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, and the United Kingdom.**
