1. The new Parliament House was inaugurated by the Prime Minister (May 28, 2023)

On May 28, 2023, **Prime Minister Narendra Modi** officially inaugurated the new **Parliament House**.

An Overview of the News

- The New Parliament House is located in the **Central Vista area** of New Delhi.
- It has been designed to accommodate the growing size and needs of the Indian Parliament.
- The building has seating arrangements for 888 members of the Lok Sabha and 384 members of the Rajya Sabha.
- It also includes six committee rooms equipped with state-of-the-art audio-visual systems.
- Covering an area of approximately **65,000 square metres**, the new building **has a triangular shape to optimise space utilisation**.
- It is a four storied building constructed at an estimated cost of Rs 970 crore.
- The building was designed by Ahmedabad-based HCP Design, Planning and Management and constructed by **Tata Projects Limited.**
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi also installed **"Sengol"** in a dedicated enclosure to the right of the Speaker's chair in the Lok Sabha chamber.

About Sengol:

- Sengol is made of silver and gold.
- It is a five feet long sceptre which was given by **Lord Mountbatte**n to **Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru** on August 14, 1947 as a symbol of the transfer of power.
- Sengol is a symbol of rule in the **Tamil kingdoms** of the past.
- It was earlier displayed in the **Allahabad Museum**.

2. Defense Minister Rajnath Singh's visit to Nigeria (May 28, 2023)

Union Defense Minister **Rajnath Singh** left for a three-day (May 28 to 30, 2023) official visit to the **West African country of Nigeria.**

An Overview of the News:

- Rajnath Singh will attend the swearing-in ceremony of newly elected President **Bola Ahmed Tinubu** at **Eagle Square in Abuja** on May 29.
- He will also meet outgoing Nigerian President **Muhammadu Buhari** during a reception hosted for him on May 28.
- This is the first visit by an Indian Defense Minister to Nigeria.
- There are about 50,000 Indian communities in Nigeria. During the visit, the Raksha Mantri will also address the Indian diaspora in Abuja.
- He will hold meetings with representatives of Nigerian industry and the armed forces to identify equipment and platforms through which the Indian defense industry can support the needs of that country.
- This visit of the Indian Defense Minister will prove to be an important milestone in building strong bonds of friendship between the two countries.

6. World Meteorological Congress approves a global tracker for greenhouse gas emissions (May 27, 2023)

According to the **World Meteorological Organization (WMO)**, the **World Meteorological Congress** approved a new **greenhouse gas** (GHG) monitoring initiative.

An Overview of the News

- The initiative aims to support urgent action in reducing heat-trapping gases that contribute to global temperature rise.
- The newly established Global Greenhouse Gas Watch integrates observational systems, modelling capabilities and data assimilation.
- The initiative addresses critical information gaps in GHG monitoring.
- The unanimous support of the 193 members of the WMO highlights the importance of greenhouse gas monitoring.
- The initiative strengthens the scientific basis for climate change mitigation efforts.

World Meteorological Organization (WMO)

- It was established in 1873 by the International Meteorological Organization.
- Headquarters Geneva, Switzerland
- On March 23, 1950, the World Meteorological Organization became a specialised organisation of the United Nations.
- This organisation uses the latest information on meteorology, climatology, hydrology and related geophysical research to contribute to the safety and welfare of society.

About Greenhouse Gases

- **Greenhouse gas definition:** A greenhouse gas absorbs and emits thermal infrared radiation, causing the greenhouse effect.
- **Primary Greenhouse Gases:** The main greenhouse gases in the Earth's atmosphere are **water vapour, carbon dioxide, methane, nitrous oxide, and ozone.**
- **Water vapour:** It is the most abundant greenhouse gas and contributes to the natural greenhouse effect.
- Carbon Dioxide (CO2): Released by human activities such as burning of fossil fuels and deforestation, it is a major cause of global warming.
- **Methane (CH4):** Produced during coal, oil and gas production as well as livestock farming, it is a potent greenhouse gas.
- **Nitrous Oxide (N2O):** Emitted from agricultural and industrial activities, it contributes to both global warming and ozone depletion.
- Ozone (O3): While beneficial in the stratosphere, at lower levels, it acts as a greenhouse gas.

7. Finance Ministry announces launch of Rs 75 special coin (May 27, 2023)

The Center will launch a new ₹75 coin on May 28 to mark the inauguration of the new Parliament.

An Overview of the News

- The coin is being issued to commemorate the inauguration of the new Parliament House of India.
- The coin will be unveiled by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on May 28 and coincides with the celebration of 75 years of India's independence.
- The obverse of this coin has the Lion Capital of Ashoka Pillar and the words "Satyamev Jayate" below it.
- The coin also bears the inscription "Bharat" in Devanagari script on the left and "India" in English on the right.
- It displays the rupee symbol below the Lion Capital and the denomination value of 75 in International Numerals.
- The obverse of the coin depicts the image of the Parliament Complex and the reverse bears the inscription "Sansad Sankul" in Devanagari script on the upper periphery and "Parliament Complex" in English on the lower periphery.

About Rs. 75 Coin

- **Diameter:** A coin with a diameter of 44 millimetres and 200 serrations for added aesthetics.
- Weight: Weighing in at 35 grams, a coin that offers a solid and substantial feel.
- **Alloy Composition:** A four-part alloy composition of 50% silver, 40% copper, 5% nickel, and 5% zinc for durability and value.

8. NTCA forms new committee to oversee Cheetah project (May 27, 2023)

The National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) set up an 11-member Cheetah Project Steering Committee.

An Overview of the News

- The committee works under the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change.
- Rajesh Gopal, general secretary of the Global Tiger Forum, has been appointed as the chairman of the committee.
- The decision to form the committee was taken after the death of six cheetahs involved in the translocation project.
- The objective of the committee is to address the challenges and issues related to the Cheetah Translocation Project.
- The committee includes 10 other members with diverse backgrounds and expertise.

National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA):

- It was established in December 2005.
- The establishment of NTCA was based on the recommendation made by the Tiger Task Force.
- The primary objective of the NTCA is to reorganise the management of Project Tiger and India's many tiger reserves.
- NTCA plays a key role in formulating policies and guidelines for the conservation of tigers, their habitats and prey species.
- NTCA oversees the management and administration of various tiger reserves located across India.

9. Mega 'Yoga Festival' in Hyderabad (May 27, 2023)

On May 27, 2023, Morarji Desai National Institute of Yoga (MDNIY) under the Union Ministry of AYUSH organized a mega 'Yoga Festival' at NCC Parade Ground, Hyderabad.

An Overview of the News:

- Telangana Governor **Dr. Tamilisai Soundararajan** was the **chief guest** at the Yoga Festival being organized at NCC Parade Ground, Hyderabad on May 27.
- This event was organized 25 days before the Yoga Festival to be held in Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh on the occasion of 'International Yoga Day' on June 21, 2023.
- Union Minister for Ports, Shipping and Waterways and AYUSH Sarbananda
 Sonowal announced the theme of International Day of Yoga this year as 'Yoga for Vasudhaiya Kutumbakam'.

- According to Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal, on June 21, the ocean will become
 a ring of yoga when yoga exercises will be carried out on several ports and ships by
 the Ministry of Defence, Ministry of External Affairs and Ministry of Ports,
 Shipping and Waterways.
- Yoga will also be done in the region from **Arctic to Antarctica**, in which countries on or near the **Prime Meridian line** will also participate in Yoga.
- Many other countries are also likely to join the programme. Yoga practice will also take place in the North and South Pole regions.
- **Himadri Svalbard**, the Indian research station in the **Arctic** and **Bharti** the third Indian research station in **Antarctica** are also expected to join the celebration along with millions of others across the world.

International Day of Yoga (IDY):

- The idea of IDY was proposed by India during the 69th session of the **United Nations General Assembly (UNGA)** in 2014.
- The UNGA, in December 2014, passed a resolution declaring June 21 as the International Day of Yoga.
- The first 'IDY' was organized in the year 2015 at Rajpath in New Delhi.

10. India will open its new consulate in Brisbane (May 26, 2023)

India-will-open-its-new-consulate-in-Brisbane

Prime Minister **Narendra Modi** in his address at the community event in **Sydney** during his Australian visit informed that a **new consulate** will be constructed in **Brisbane**.

An Overview of the News:

- The main objective of setting up the **Consulate in Brisbane** is to fulfill the long standing demand of Indian expatriates in Australia.
- This was announced during Prime Minister Modi's address at the **Kudos Bank Arena** in Sydney, which was attended by over 21,000 people across Australia, along with Australian Prime Minister **Anthony Albanese**.
- Meanwhile, Prime Minister Albanese also declared **Harris Park** as "**Little India**" during the reception for Prime Minister Modi.
- Harris Park is a center in western **Sydney** where the Indian community celebrates Indian festivals and events including Diwali and Australia Day.

India-Australia business partnership:

- Australia was the 17th largest trading partner of India in the year 2022 and India is the 9th largest trading partner of Australia.
- Bilateral trade between the two countries stood at US\$ 27.5 billion in the year 2021, which is likely to reach around US\$ 50 billion in the next five years.
- In this context, both the countries are moving fast in the field of concluding a free trade agreement.
