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1. 76th World Health Assembly held in Geneva (May 26, 2023)

The **76th World Health Assembly** was inaugurated by the World Health Organization (WHO) on 21 May 2023 in **Geneva, Switzerland**.

An Overview of the News:

- This ten-day 76th World Health Assembly is being organized from 21 to 30 May 2023.
- In this, India is being represented by Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya.
- It serves as a platform for representatives of all WHO member states to come together and address health issues affecting people around the world.
- Appreciating India's health priorities, **Dr. Tedros Ghebreyesus**, Director-General of the World Health Organisation, praised India's progress in chairing the G20 as well as its efforts to advance digital health and traditional medicine.
- Theme of the 76th World Health Assembly: **WHO at 75: Saving Lives, Driving Health for All.**

World Health Assembly:

- The World Health Assembly serves as the decision-making body of the WHO.
- Its primary functions include key aspects of the organization's operations.
- These set policies that guide global health initiatives. Along with this, it also appoints the Director General.

World Health Organization (WHO):

- It is an inter-governmental organization and works in collaboration with the Ministries of Health of its member states.
- Establishment : 1948
- Headquarters: Geneva, Switzerland
- Members: 194 countries
- WHO started functioning from 7th April, 1948.
- World Health Day is celebrated every year on 7th April.
- WHO has offices in 150 countries as well as six regional offices.

2. Third advance estimate of production of major crops for 2022-23 (May 26, 2023)

Union Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Minister **Narendra Singh Tomar** released the **third advance estimates of production of major crops** for the **agricultural year 2022-23**. In which food grains production has been estimated at **3305.34 lakh tonnes** in the current agricultural year.

An overview of the news:

• In this, record production of rice, wheat, maize, soybean, rapeseed and mustard and sugarcane has been estimated.

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- As per the 3rd Advance Estimates for 2022-23, the estimated production of major crops is as follows:
- Total food grain production: 3305.34 lakh tonnes (record). This is 149.18 lakh tonnes more than the previous year 2021-22.

Main food grains:

• Rice: 1355.42 lakh tonnes, which is 60.71 lakh tonnes more than last year.

Wheat: 1127.43 lakh tonnesBaira: 111.66 lakh tonnes

• Nutri/Coarse Cereals (Shri Anna): 547.48 Lakh Tonnes

• Maize: 359.13 lakh tonnes

• Total pulses: 275.04 lakh tonnes

3. INSV Tarini crew back home after 188 days (May 25, 2023)

- Lt Cdr Dilna is a Logistics Officer in the Navy.
- Roopa, who hails from Puducherry, has graduated in **Aeronautical Engineering from Chenna**i. He is a Naval Armament Inspection Officer.
- Both Dilna and Roopa are currently posted at INS Mandovi in Goa.
- The historic voyage from **Goa to Rio de Janeiro to Cape Town was completed by INSV Tarini in 188 days.**
- It reflects an exemplary display of gallantry, courage and tenacity by the crew and highlights the role of the Indian Navy as a pioneer in the country in ocean sailing.

4. Union AYUSH Minister inaugurates PCIM&H 'e-office' and online portal (May 25. 2023)

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6. Ministry of Civil Aviation launches UDAN 5.1 (May 25, 2023)

Ministry-of-Civil-Aviation-launches-UDAN-5.1

The **Ministry of Civil Aviation** in India has **launched UDAN 5.1** on 24 May, a special edition of the **UDAN (Ude Desh ka Aam Nagrik) scheme**, with a special focus on **helicopter routes.**

The main features of UDAN 5.1

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- For the first time under Regional Connectivity Scheme RCS-UDAN, this round is designed specifically for helicopter routes.
- There will be an increase in the **scope of operations for the operators**, which will now also allow routes where one of the origin or destination points is in the priority zone.
- The **airfare ceiling has been reduced by 25%** to make flying in helicopters more affordable for passengers.
- The **Viability Gap Funding (VGF) cap** for single and twin-engine helicopter operators has been substantially increased to enhance the financial viability for operating the routes.
- So far **46** helicopter routes have been operationalized under the scheme, benefitting many hilly and North East states and UDAN **5.1** is targeting coverage of a much larger number of routes.

About UDAN Scheme

- Ude Desh Ka Aam Nagrik (UDAN) was launched in 2016 as a Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS) under the Ministry of Civil Aviation.
- Its objective is to make **affordable**, **economically viable and profitable air travel** on regional routes available to the common man even in small towns.
- It seeks to improve air connectivity to **tier-2 and tier-3 cities** through revival of unused and underused airports.
- The scheme will be jointly funded by the **central government and state governments.**
- The scheme will run for **10 years** and can be extended thereafter.

7. More than 90% of funds allocated under Smart Cities Mission utilised (May 25, 2023)

Smart Cities Mission

Union Housing and Urban Affairs Minister **Hardeep Singh Puri** has announced that **more than 90%** of the funds allocated under the **Smart Cities Mission** are being **utilized and 73%** of the projects have already been completed.

An overview of the news

- The smart city project was to be completed within five years of the selection of the city.
- However, in 2021, the ministry changed the **deadline to June 2023** for all cities.

About Smart Cities Mission

• Smart Cities Mission is an initiative of the Union Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs which was launched in 2015.

It aims to transform urban areas into sustainable, citizen-friendly and

- technologically advanced cities.
- The mission's primary objective is to enhance the quality of life for citizens by providing them with improved infrastructure, better governance, and increased economic opportunities.
- Between **January 2016 and June 2018** (when the last city, Shillong, was selected), the ministry selected 100 cities for the mission in five rounds.

Selection Process

- The mission follows a competitive approach where cities submit proposals based on specific criteria, including the adoption of smart solutions, citizen engagement, and sustainable development.
- The selected cities undergo redevelopment in a phased manner.

Core components

- **Infrastructure development:** Emphasis is placed on developing physical infrastructure such as transportation systems, water supply, sanitation, and affordable housing to meet the needs of the urban population.
- **Technology integration**: The mission integrates technology to improve service delivery, including data analytics and smart grids devices for efficient resource management and real-time monitoring.
- **Citizen engagement:** The mission focuses on citizen participation and engagement through mobile applications and feedback mechanisms, empowering them to contribute to decision-making processes and hold authorities accountable.
- **Sustainable practices:** The mission promotes sustainable development by encouraging the use of renewable energy sources, green building practices, waste management systems, and efficient urban planning.

Funds Utilisation

- Till 1 May 2023, a total of **Rs 38,400 crore** was released for the Smart Cities Mission.
- Out of this amount, ₹35,261 crore has already been utilized for various projects.

Project Completion

- The Smart Cities Mission includes around **7,800 projects worth Rs 1.8 lakh crore.**
- Of these projects, more than **5,700 projects worth Rs 1.1 lakh crore** have been completed.
- The remaining projects are expected to be completed by **June 30, 2024.**
- Currently, only 22 out of 100 designated cities have successfully completed all the projects under the mission.

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9. Ministry of Education and PARAKH organise the 1st National level workshop (May 24, 2023)

1st-National-level-workshop

Recently, the Ministry of Education organized a workshop in New Delhi to discuss the integration of 60 school examination boards operating in different states and union territories.

An overview of the news

- The key component of the scheme is **PARAKH**, a National Assessment Center set up under the **National Council of Educational Research and Training.**
- The central government is planning for uniformity of boards to facilitate seamless transition for students in different boards or regions.
- It aims to align curriculum standards, grading system and evaluation methods so as to enhance the credibility and recognition of certificates and grades obtained across all boards.
- The workshop highlighted the **need to re-evaluate the rote-examination culture prevalent** in the education system.

What is PARAKH?

- PARAKH full name is -**Performance Assessment, Review and Analysis of Knowledge for Holistic Development.**
- It will act as a constituent unit of the NCERT.

- It will also be tasked with conducting **periodic learning outcome tests like**
- * National Achievement Survey (NAS) and State Achievement Survey.
- This framework will seek to curb the emphasis on rote learning as envisaged by the **National Policy on Education (NEP) 2020.**
- It will be the proposed implementing agency and also will be part of the **NEP proposal.**
- Its team will consist of leading assessment experts with a deep understanding of the education system in India and internationally.

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
