1. Indian-American physician Dr. Siddhartha Mukherjee nominated for the Baillie Gifford Prize for non-fiction in London (Sept. 7, 2023)

Indian-American physician and cancer researcher Dr Siddhartha Mukherjee has been nominated for the Baillie Gifford Prize for Non-Fiction in London, a prestigious £50,000 prize.

An Overview of the News

- His book "The Song of the Cell: An Exploration of Medicine and the New Human" is one of 13 books selected for the long list.
- The six finalists for the prize are to be announced on 8 October and will be revealed during a live event at England's annual Cheltenham Literature Festival.
- The winner of the prize will be announced at a ceremony at the Science Museum in London on 16 November.
- Established in 1999, the award covers several categories of **English non-fiction**, including current affairs, history, politics, science, sport, travel, biography, autobiography, and art.
- Last year's recipient of the award was **Katherine Rundell**, who was recognized for her biography of the poet "**Super-Infinite**: **The Transformations of John Donne**".

Book focus and Mukherjee's background:

- The book highlights the transformative impact of cellular research on medicine, leading to breakthroughs in the treatment of diseases such as **Alzheimer's and AIDS.**
- Dr. Siddhartha Mukherjee, Associate Professor of Medicine at Columbia University and Rhodes Scholar, has authored bestsellers such as "The Gene" and "The Emperor of All Maladies" and has a strong academic and publishing background.

2. The 48th Toronto International Film Festival begins in Canada (Sept. 7, 2023)

The 48th Toronto International Film Festival (TIFF) began on 7 September in Canada.

An Overview of the News

- India will actively participate in the 48th TIFF, which will run from September 7 to September 17, and highlight its talent, content, and entertainment industry.
- The official Indian delegation participating in TIFF will be led by Prithul Kumar, Joint Secretary (Films), Ministry of Information and Broadcasting.
- India has a comprehensive plan for participation with the intention of showcasing its creative and technological strengths. The country aims to attract international collaboration to co-produce films in India and use Indian locations for shooting.

This year TIFF has selected six Indian films to be part of its official selection. These films

• include "Dear Jassi" directed by Tarsem Singh Dhandhwar, "Kill" directed by Nikhil Nagesh Bhatt, and "Thank You for Coming" directed by Karan Boolani.

About TIFF

- Established in 1976, TIFF is one of the world's most prestigious and largest publicly attended film festivals. It takes place annually in September in Toronto, Canada.
- It is headquartered at the TIFF Bell Lightbox Cultural Center in downtown Toronto.
- The People's Choice Award at TIFF, determined by audience voting, is considered a strong predictor of success during awards season, including the Academy Awards.
- Past recipients of the People's Choice Award include Oscar-winning films such as "Life Is Beautiful," "American Beauty," "Slumdog Millionaire," and "Nomadland."
- In 2022, the festival took place from 8 to 18 September, with Cameron Bailey as executive director.

3. Professor Satyajit Majumdar of TISS receives Dr. VG Patel Memorial Award 2023 (Sept. 6, 2023)

Professor Satyajit Majumdar, serving as the Dean of the School of Management and Labor Studies at the Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS) in Mumbai, was awarded the 'Dr V G Patel Memorial Award-2023'.

An Overview of the News

- He received this prestigious award in the category of 'Entrepreneurship Coach, Educator, and Mentor' for his outstanding contribution to promoting and strengthening entrepreneurship in India.
- Dr. V.G. Patel is widely recognized as a pioneer of the entrepreneurship movement in India, which makes this award particularly significant.
- Professor Satyajit Mazumdar was selected for this award from among 400 applicants from 26 different states. The selection was done by a jury appointed by the Indian Entrepreneurship Development Institute (EDII) in Ahmedabad.
- Over the past two decades, Professor Majumdar, who is 63, has played a key role in pioneering entrepreneurship.
- With his dedicated team, he has provided mentorship to over 350 startups, including 40 from the Jammu and Kashmir region, as well as cluster startups in Jhabua, West Bengal.
- Since his appointment at TISS in 2010, Professor Majumdar's primary focus has been on establishing a thriving ecosystem for entrepreneurship within the institute.

4. Kathmandu-Kalinga Literature Festival concludes in Lalitpur, Nepal (Sept. 4, 2023)

5. President of India to honor outstanding teachers with National Teacher Awards 2023 on 5th September (Sept. 2, 2023)

The President of India Draupadi Murmu will confer the National Awards to Teachers 2023 to 75 teachers on September 5, 2023, at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi.

An Overview of the News

- The event is organized annually on 5th September, the birthday of Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan, which is celebrated as National Teachers' Day in India.
- The objective of the National Teacher Awards is to acknowledge and celebrate the extraordinary contribution of teachers to education and the positive impact they have on the lives of students.

6. SVAMITVA Yojana of Ministry of Panchayati Raj gets National Award for e-Governance 2023 (Aug. 28, 2023)

In the 26th National Conference on e-Governance 2023, the National Award was given to the SVAMITVA (Survey of Villages Abadi and Mapping with Improvised Technology in Village Areas) scheme of the Ministry of Panchayati Raj.

An Overview of the News

- The objective of the SVAMITVA scheme is to survey the population of villages, map rural areas with advanced technology, and provide ownership rights of property to individuals living in rural areas.
- State-of-the-art technologies such as drones and Geographic Information Systems (GIS) are used for this initiative
- Property cards have been created, which enable rural property owners to leverage their property for financial benefits.

Significance of the Award:

- The National Award for e-Governance was given in the category "Application of emerging technology for providing citizen-centric services".
- It recognizes the innovative use of technology in the scheme to provide services that directly benefit citizens.

National Conference on e-Governance (NCeG):

- The 26th NCeG was held in Indore, Madhya Pradesh, and jointly organized by the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances (DARPG) and the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY).

7. PM Modi becomes the first Indian Prime Minister to receive the Grand Cross of the Order of Honor from Greece (Aug. 26, 2023)

An Overview of the News

- The award is the **highest civilian honor Greece** can bestow on a **foreign head of government.**
- The award recognizes PM Modi's outstanding contribution to strengthening bilateral relations between Greece and India.
- The citation given along with the award highlights PM Modi's commitment to enhancing political, economic, cultural, and people-to-people relations between the two countries.
- He is also the first foreign head of government to be honored with the award since 2017.
- The award reflects PM Modi's efforts to strengthen ties between India and Greece, which share a history of friendship and cooperation.

About the Grand Cross of the Order of Honor

- It is awarded by the **President of Greece.**
- Recipients include Prime Ministers and eminent personalities.
- Award winners are recognized for enhancing the prestige and status of Greece.
- The Order of Honor was established in 1975.
- The medallion depicts the Greek goddess Athena.
- Accompanying the image of Athena are the words "Only the righteous should be respected".
- Blue and white ribbons are used to wear the badge around the neck.

8. Maharashtra to confer first 'Udyog Ratna' award to Ratan Tata; Three more awards for entrepreneurs announced (Aug. 2, 2023)

Maharashtra Industries Minister Uday Samant will present the first 'Udyog Ratna' award to veteran industrialist and Tata Sons Chairman Emeritus Ratan Tata.

An Overview of the News

 Along with the Udyog Ratna award, the Maharashtra government will introduce three other awards. One award will be given to a woman entrepreneur, second to a Marathi entrepreneur and third to a young entrepreneur from the state.

- The Udyog Ratna Award is equivalent to the prestigious Maharashtra Bhushan Award and will be given to Ratan Tata for the first time.
- The main objective behind the Maharashtra Udyog Ratna Awards is to acknowledge and honour individuals and organisations that have made noteworthy contributions to various sectors, such as business, industry, education, real estate, tourism, financial services, fashion, electronics, agriculture, banking, IT, food items, and health, within the state of Maharashtra.

Ratan Tata has been honoured with several prestigious awards for his contributions:

- He was awarded the Padma Vibhushan in 2008 and the Padma Bhushan in 2000, both of which are India's highest civilian awards.
- In a recent remarkable achievement, Ratan Tata was conferred with the 'Order of Australia' award, Australia's highest civilian honour.

9. Shankari Chandran honoured with Miles Franklin Literary Award for novel "Tea Time at Cinnamon Gardens" (July 28, 2023)

Sri Lankan-born Australian author Shankari Chandran has been awarded the prestigious Miles Franklin Literary Prize in 2023 for the novel "Tea Time at Cinnamon Gardens".

An Overview of the News

- Ten years earlier, he had encountered difficulty publishing his first book, as publishers doubted its appeal to the local Australian market, as it was not "Australian" enough.
- Chandran's award-winning novel, titled 'Tea Time at Cinnamon Gardens', revolves around themes of family, memories, community, race and highlights Australia's complex relationship with multiculturalism and the consequences of colonialism.
- The novel has been hailed as an inter-generational epic that explores the complexities of Australia's multicultural society and the miseries of post-colonialism.
- Chandran's story emphasises that our personal stories play an important role in shaping us as individuals and the fabric of society.

Remarkably, 'Tea Time at Cinnamon Gardens' is Chandran's third published novel, which

• shows his growth and dedication as a writer.
