1. Civil Aviation Minister Inaugurates Utkela Airport and Direct Flight between Utkela and Bhubaneswar (Aug. 31, 2023)

Minister of Civil Aviation, Jyotiraditya M. Scindia and Minister of State, Ministry of Civil Aviation, General Vijay Kumar Singh (Retd) inaugurated the Utkela Airport and a new flight route connecting Utkela and Bhubaneswar through video conferencing.

An Overview of the News

- Utkela Airport, owned by the Government of Odisha, has been set up as a regional airport under the UDAN scheme of the Ministry of Civil Aviation with a project cost of Rs 31.07 crore.
- The airport has a 917-metre (2,995 ft) runway and a runway width of 30 metres, which contributes to better regional connectivity.
- This increases the number of airports in Odisha to five, underscoring efforts to boost transport infrastructure.

Increase in connectivity through Utkela-Bhubaneswar flight route

- The newly launched Utkela-Bhubaneswar flight route, operated by IndiaOne, is set to strengthen regional air connectivity and boost economic growth in the region.
- This route will be operated by 9-seater Cessna C-208 aircraft, which is a part of the UDAN scheme initiative.
- The travel time between Utkela and Bhubaneswar, which usually takes about 8 hours by road, will now be reduced to just one hour and twenty minutes by air.

Economic benefits and development for Kalahandi region

- The new Utkela-Bhubaneswar air connection is set to stimulate economic activities and create many employment opportunities in the Kalahandi region.
- Collaboration between the Central Government and the Government of Odisha in advancing civil aviation infrastructure was highlighted as an important step towards development.

2. Assam's Chokuwa rice gets GI tag (Aug. 31, 2023)

Chokuwa rice, popularly known as "magic rice", received the Geographical Indication (GI) tag.

An Overview of the News

- The GI tag recognizes its exceptional qualities and heritage.
- Chokuwa rice is closely linked to the history of Assam and has a historical connection with the **Ahom dynasty.**
- This variety of rice is specially cultivated in the **Brahmaputra river region.**
- Cultivation areas include **Tinsukia**, **Dhemaji**, and **Dibrugarh in Assam**.

Geographical Indication (GI) Tag:

- Geographical Indication (GI) is a label given to products from a **specific geographical** area.
- GIs confirm that products have unique properties or have been produced using traditional methods because of their **geographical origin**.
- Applicable to various products such as **food**, **handicrafts**, **and industrial goods**.
- GI tags ensure that only authorized producers can use the product name.

Who awards and regulates geographical indications?

- Geographical indications are a form of intellectual property rights (IPR) protected under the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property.
- The World Trade Organization (WTO) Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPS) establishes an international framework for GI protection.
- In India, GI registration and protection of goods is governed by the **Geographical Indications (Registration and Protection) Act, 1999.**
- This act came into effect in **September 2003.**

3. Bhaderwah Rajma and Ramban Sulai honey get GI tag in Jammu and Kashmir (Aug. 30, 2023)

Bhaderwah Rajma and Ramban Sulai honey of Jammu and Kashmir were granted Geographical Indication (GI) tag.

An Overview of the News

- Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Jammu started the GI tagging process for these products.
- GI tag provides exclusive use rights to authorized users while preventing unauthorized exploitation.
- This recognition is expected to increase exports, increase brand presence internationally and prevent misuse.
- The GI tag is set to benefit local economies and promote socioeconomic development for producers.

What is GI Tag?

- A geographical indication (GI) is a name or sign given to products coming from a specific geographical location.
- GIs certify that products are made using traditional methods or have specific qualities due to their origin.
- It is used for food, handicrafts and industrial products.
- The GI tag ensures that only authorized users can use the product name.

Who grants and regulates Geographical Indications?

- These are a type of Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs) recognized and protected under the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property.
- The World Trade Organization (WTO)'s Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPS) provides a framework for the protection of GIs at the international level.
- In India, registration and protection of GIs is governed by the Geographical Indications of Goods (Registration and Protection) Act, 1999, which came into effect in September 2003.

4. Kolkata becomes the third Indian city to adopt an Air Quality Early Warning System (AQEWS) (Aug. 28, 2023)

Kolkata became the third Indian city to adopt the **Air Quality Early Warning System** (**AQEWS**) to combat rising air pollution.

An Overview of the News

- The system, developed by the Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology (IITM) in Pune, aims to address rising air pollution levels in urban areas.
- AQEWS in Kolkata uses an advanced sensor network to provide real-time monitoring of the **Air Quality Index (AQI).**
- AQI is a standardized measure of the level of air pollution, with a value ranging from 0 to 500.
- The system focuses on PM2.5 (particles with a diameter of 2.5 micrometers or smaller) levels, which is a major contributor to health problems due to its ability to enter the lungs.

Air pollution status in Kolkata:

- Kolkata is facing severe air pollution, which is mainly driven by **pollutants like PM2.5.**
- Recent AQEWS measurements show that the AQI is 74, which is expected to rise above
 170 by 30 August.
- These forecasts highlight the urgency of tackling air pollution and emphasize the role of early warning systems.

Data Integration and Accuracy:

- AQEWS integrates data from the National Air Quality Network and satellite sources to generate accurate air pollution forecasts.
- The accuracy of the system was proved during the experimental phase that started in **September 2022.**
- The inclusion of data from 420 air quality monitoring stations across India ensures a comprehensive approach to the assessment of air quality.

5. Assam enforces ban on plastic water bottles of less than 1000ml (Aug. 26, 2023)

The Assam government implemented a ban on plastic water bottles of less than 1000 ml capacity with effect from October 2.

- Aims to ban plastic water bottles of less than 1000 ml capacity.

7. India launches first hydrogen fuel cell bus service in Leh (Aug. 22, 2023)

India's first hydrogen fuel cell bus service begins in Leh, marking the first commercial trial of this futuristic technology on public roads.

An Overview of the News

- Leh, located in the high-altitude cold desert of Ladakh, will host this innovative project.
- The venture is being executed by NTPC, India's largest power-generating company.
- NTPC is supplying five hydrogen fuel cell buses to Leh Administration for intra-city movement.
- The company has set up a fueling station and a 1.7 MW captive solar plant to generate green hydrogen, which will be used to power buses.
- 7.5 acres of land have been given on lease in Leh for infrastructure development.

Ashok Leyland Participation:

- Ashok Leyland is the supplier of the buses, each costing around Rs 2.5 crore.
- The purchase was made under a global expression of interest issued in April 2020.

Rent Equity and NTPC's Commitment:

- Passenger fares for using the hydrogen fuel cell buses will reflect the cost of travel on the 9-meter diesel buses currently in operation.
- According to a statement from a company official, NTPC has promised to meet any financial shortfall in case of losses.

Salient Features of the NTPC Project:

- NTPC's project assumes significance for two reasons. Firstly, it marks the debut of commercially deployed hydrogen fuel cell buses on Indian public roads.
- Second, it is an unprecedented test of technology at altitudes above 11,500 feet, where the atmosphere is thin and oxygen levels are low.

Funding and Technical Lead:

NTPC is funding the project through its CSR budget.

The driving force behind this initiative is Gurdeep Singh, Chairman, of NTPC, who is • committed to keeping NTPC at the forefront of energy transformation by adopting emerging technologies.

9. Major decisions of the Maharashtra cabinet meeting on August 18, 2023 (Aug. 19, 2023)

- The Maharashtra cabinet announced the launch of Bhagwan Birsa Munda Sadak Yojana on August 18, 2023.
- The primary objective of the scheme is to increase road connectivity in tribal areas of 17 districts of the state.
- The focus has been on connecting remote tribal areas to the main road network, improving accessibility and socio-economic development.

Repeal of the Maharashtra Casinos (Control and Tax) Act, 1976:

- This festive ration will be available at a nominal price of Rs 100, which will benefit more than 1 crore 65 lakh 60 thousand ration card holders.

Increase in Stipend for Government ITI Trainees:

- A remarkable decision to increase the stipend for trainees enrolled in Government Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) came to the fore.
- There will be a substantial increase in the stipend amount which was fixed at Rs.40 before 1983, which will reach up to Rs.500.
- The objective of the adjustment is to assist ITI trainees with educational expenses and other necessary costs and encourage skill development and vocational education.

10. Tamil Nadu government launches night street racing circuit in Chennai (Aug. 17, 2023)

Tamil Nadu Government and Racing Promotion Pvt Ltd (RRPL) launched a new street circuit in Chennai.

An Overview of the News

• The 3.5 km track around the Island Ground is set to become the first street circuit in India and South Asia to host a night race.

Challenging Circuit Features:

- The circuit will have elevation changes and will feature 19 corners, including several straights.
- Its location will offer picturesque views of Marina Beach Road and the Bay of Bengal.
