1. Indian shooters Ganemat Sekhon, Darshna Rathore create history (May 24, 2023)

Indian-shooters

India for the first time on 24 May won two senior individual medals in women's skeet at International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) World Cup stage in Almaty, Kazakhstan.

An overview of the news

- Ganemat Sekhon won the silver, his second ever individual World Cup medal.
- Making her first appearance at the senior level, **Darshana Rathore won the bronze medal** and this was her debut performance.
- Asem Orinbay of Kazakhstan won the gold medal via shoot-off.
- Mairaj Khan, Gurjot Khangura and Anantjit Singh Naruka participated in the men's skit but none made it to the finals.

ISSF World Championship

- The championship is administered by the **International Shooting Sport Federation** (ISSF).
- These championships, including all shooting events of the ISSF, have been held every four years since 1954.

2. Shirgaonkar elected as India Taekwondo Chief (May 24, 2023)

Namdev Shirgaonkar was elected unopposed as the **President of the executive** committee of India Taekwondo on 23 May.

- The election was held at **2 Hotel Sun City Residency, Andheri (East**) in which 25 affiliated State Associations duly participated.
- With all the office bearers being elected unopposed, the entire election process was completed without any hitch.
- Sharad D Madakare (retd. Deputy Charity Commissioner) along with Bhagwatrao Gaikwad (retd. Judge) served as the Returning Officer.
- Namdev Shirgaonkar, President, India Taekwondo, who holds a black belt in Taekwondo, has accepted to be elected unopposed as the head of India Taekwondo.
- Kiyarash Bahri (Coordinator World Taekwondo WT) and Wanyoung Lee (Observer Asian Taekwondo Union ATU) and Prashant Desai (Observer Paralympic Committee of India PCI) moderated the election process.

3. BCCI ropes in Adidas as new kit sponsor of Indian cricket team (May 23, 2023)

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) announced Adidas as the new kit sponsor of the Indian cricket team, replacing interim sponsor Kewal Kiran Clothing Limited.

4. Kabaddi competition begins in Uttar Pradesh, Khelo India University Games (May 23, 2023)

Khelo-India-University-Games

The third Khelo India University Games will begin with a Kabaddi event on May 23 in Gautam Budh Nagar district of Uttar Pradesh.

- 15 teams representing different universities are participating in the Kabaddi competition.
- The matches will be held at the Shaheed Vijay Singh Pathik Stadium in Gautam Budh Nagar district.

The official opening ceremony of the Khelo India University Games will take place on May

25 in Lucknow and will continue till June 3.

- The Khelo India University Games will be held in four cities: Gautam Buddha Nagar, Lucknow, Gorakhpur and Varanasi and the closing ceremony of the Games will be held in Varanasi.
- Wrestling and Yogasana (yoga postures) events will be organised in Varanasi during the Khelo India University Games.
- A total of 240 players will participate in wrestling events, while 96 players will participate in Yogasana events.

5. Neeraj Chopra makes history, becomes World No 1 in men's javelin throw (May 23, 2023)

Tokyo Olympics gold medalist Neeraj Chopra on May 22 achieved the **number one ranking in men's javelin throw** for the first time. This is a major milestone in his career.

- Neeraj Chopra is **on top with 1455 points**, 22 ahead of Anderson Peters of Granada.
- Chopra rose to world No. 2 on August 30, 2022, but has since been overtaken by the defending world champion, Peters.
- In 2022, **Neeraj won the Diamond League 2022 final in Zurich** in September, making him the first Indian athlete to do so.
- Tokyo Olympics silver medallist **Jakub Vadlejch of Czech Republic was third** with 1416 points.
- The Indian national record holder in men's javelin throw, took part in the season-opening **Doha Diamond League** on May 5 and finished first with a throw of 88.67m.

Anderson Peters finished third in Doha with a throw of 85.88m.

6. Young long jumper Shaili Singh finishes third in Japan in her first senior outdoor competition (May 22, 2023)

Young-long-jumper-Shaili-Singh-finishes

In her first major senior outdoor international event, long jumper Shaili Singh won a bronze at the Seiko Golden Grand Prix in Yokohama on 21st May.

An overview of the news

- She finished third in the women's long jump with a creditable effort of 6.65m.
- Shelly's first round jump of 6.65 m was the best ever at a **World Athletics Continental Tour Gold level event**, although it was 11 cm below her personal best.
- Her attempt also saw a wind speed of +2.1 m/s, which is above the permissible limit of +2.0 m/s.
- Maryse Luzolo of Germany took the gold with a jump of 6.79m, while **Brooke**Buschkuel of Australia was second with an effort of 6.77m.
- Shelly won the **silver medal** in the 2021 **World Under-20 Athletics Championships** with a jump of 6.59 meters.
- In April, Shelly had a jump of 6.76 meters, the **second highest long jump** after **Anju Bobby George**, who had won the gold medal at the Indian Grand Prix.
- In February, she finished fifth at the **Asian Indoor Athletics Championships in Nur-Sultan** with a jump of 6.27m.

7. Italian Open: Daniil Medvedev defeats Rune, wins maiden clay court title (May 22, 2023)

Italian-Open-Daniil-Medvedev-defeats-Rune,-wins
In the Italian Open final, world number three tennis star Daniil Medvedev defeated
Holger Roon on 21 May to win his first claycourt title.

- In the men's singles final, the Russian player defeated the 20-year-old Danish player 7-5, 7-5.
- This is **Medvedev's fifth title of 2023** and the win has lifted him above Novak Djokovic to the **second spot in the world rankings.**
- He won his **20th career title.** He will also be seeded second in the French Open, which begins on 28th of this month at Roland Garros.
- Hugo Nieves and Jan Zielinski have captured the men's doubles title in Rome. The Monegasque-Polish pair won their first ATP Masters 1000 title by defeating Robin Haase and Bottic van de Zandschulp 7-5, 6-1 in the men's doubles final.
- The Australian-Belgian pair of Storm Hunter and Elise Mertens defeated topseeded Americans Coco Gauff and Jessica Pegula 6-4 6-4 to become the women's doubles champions.
- Earlier, Kazakhstan's Elena Rybakina won her fourth WTA title with a win in the **women's** singles final.

In Italian Open Tennis, Elena Rybakina of Kazakhstan won the women's singles title defeating Ukraine's Anhelina Kalinina 6-4, 1-0, on 20th May at the Internazionali BNL d'Italia in Rome.

- It was Rybakina's **second title** of the year.
- With this, Rybakina won the **fifth singles title of her career.**
- 7th seed Rybakina defeated 30th seed Kalinina to win the trophy.
- Kalinina was ruled out of the final due to a left thigh injury.
- The men's singles final of the tournament will be played between **Denmark's Holger**Rune and Russia's Daniil Medvedev in Rome.

9. India bags 16 gold medals at the South Asian Youth Table Tennis Championship 2023 (May 18, 2023)

The three-day international event **South Asian Youth Table Tennis Championship 2023** concluded in **Itanagar on May 17.**

An overview of the news

- In this event more than 100 athletes from six countries **Bhutan**, **Bangladesh**, **India**, **Maldives**, **Sri Lanka and Nepal** participated.
- Arunachal Pradesh Governor, Lt. General KT Parnaik, (Retd.) attended the closing ceremony as Chief Guest at Dorjee Khandu Indoor Stadium, Itanagar.
- The hosts India won all the gold medals on offer on the last day at the Dorjee Khandu Indoor Stadium on 17th May.
- Besides, the Indians also bagged four silver medals in the singles.
- **Sri Lanka, Bangladesh and Maldives** were also among the medals, while Bhutan, who participated only in the singles events, drew a blank.
- On the second day of the championships, the Indians won three gold medals in the U-15 Boys, U-19 Girls and U15 Girls, while Nepal claimed the U-19 Boys gold.
- In the Under-19 Boys singles, Ankur Bhattacharjee defeated Payas Jain 4-2 to claim the gold.

10. Vuppala Praneeth becomes India's 82nd Grandmaster (May 16, 2023)

Vuppala-Praneeth-becomes-India's-82nd-Grandmaster
15-year-old **chess player Vuppala Praneeth** from **Telangana** has become the **82nd Grandmaster of India.**

An Overview of the News

- Vuppala Praneeth defeated GM Hans Niem of USA during the final round of Baku
 Open 2023 to clinch the Grandmaster title.
- Praneeth clinched his first GM-norm and International Master (IM) title at the tournament in March 2022.
- He earned his second **GM-norm at the Biel MTO in July 2022,** followed by his final GM-norm nine months later at the **second Chessable Sunway Formentera Open 2023.**
- The first Indian Grandmaster was Viswanathan Anand, who held the title in 1988.
- Anand is a five-time world champion and is considered one of the greatest chess players of all time.

Important Points:

- 16-year-old chess player **Pranesh M became India's 79th Grandmaster** after winning the **Rilton Cup in Stockholm**, **Sweden**.
- Chennai-based chess player **Vignesh NR became India's 80th Grandmaster** after winning the **24th Nordwest Cup 2023** held at **Bad Zwischenahn, Germany.**
- Sayantan Das became India's 81st Grandmaster after his victory at the International Festival des Jeux in Cannes, France.

About Telangana
