The 53rd International Film Festival of India (IFFI) came to an end at a ceremony held at the Dr Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Stadium near **Panaji** on 28 November 2022. Union Information and Broadcasting Minister **Anurag Singh Thakur**, Goa Chief Minister **Pramod Sawant** and a host of film personalities including Akshay Kumar, Asha Parekh, Ayushman Khurana, Manushi Chhillar, Rana Duggubati, Sharman Joshi, and Khushbu Sundar were present.

Main Highlights of the 53rd International Film Festival of India (IFFI)

Opening and closing film of the Festival

The **opening film** of the festival was Austrian Director Dieter Berner's film **Alma and Oskar** and the closing film was the Polish film '**Perfect Number**', directed by Krzysztof Zanussi.

Awards

Celebrated Spanish film Director **Carlos Saura** was honoured with the prestigious **Satyajit Ray Lifetime Achievement award**.

Actor Producer **Chiranjeevi Konidela** was conferred with the **IFFI Indian Film Personality of the Year Award for 2022**.

Golden Peacock for the Best Film:

Spanish film Tengo **sueños eléctricos / I HAVE ELECTRIC DREAMS**. The film has been directed by Costa Rican film maker **Valentina Maurel**.

Silver Peacock for Best Director:

Iranian writer and director **Nader Saeivar** was awarded Silver Peacock for Best Director for his Turkish film **No End/ Bi Payan**.

Silver Peacock for Best Actor (Male)

Vahid Mobasser, lead actor of *No End*, was honoured with Silver Peacock for Best Actor (Male).

Silver Peacock for Best Actor (Female)

Daniela Marín Navarro, lead Actress of the Film '*I Have Electric Dreams*' was honoured with Silver Peacock for Best Actor (Female).

Special Jury Award

Lav Diaz of Philippines was chosen for the Special Jury Award for ***When the Waves are Gone / Kapag wala nang mga alon.***

Best Debut Feature Film of a Director

Asimina Proedrou of Greece was chosen for the Best Debut Feature Film of a Director. She got the award for her film **Behind the Haystacks.**

Special mention by Jury Award

Director, writer and cinematographer Praveen Kandregula received Special Mention by the Jury for his film **Cinema Bandi.** The film has been made in **Telugu**

The Feature Film Jury, comprising thirteen members, was headed by **Vinod Ganatra**, an illustrious Filmmaker and Editor and winner of 9 National and 36 International awards.

International Film Festival of India (IFFI)

The first International Film Festival of India (IFFI) was held in the cities of Bombay (now Mumbai), Delhi, Calcutta (now Kolkata), Madras (now Chennai) from 24 January to 1 February 1952.

The Delhi leg was inaugurated by Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru. It was later held in different cities of the country.

Since **2004, starting from the 35th edition, Goa** has become the permanent venue of the International Film Festival of India (IFFI).

It is held in the month of November -December every year.

The 5-day long Film Bazaar concluded at the 53rd [International Film Festival of India \(IFFI\)](#) in Goa with Bangladesh feature film '**Agantuk**' being named the winner of the **Prasad DI award.** The film has been directed by Biplob **Sarkar.**

The Film Bazaar section in the IFFI is a converging point for film buyers and sellers from all across the world with a focus on discovering, supporting, and showcasing **South Asian** content and talent in filmmaking, production, and distribution.

The Kannada film '**Mithya**' bagged the **Prasad Post-production award**, while the multilingual Nepali, Kumaoni, and Hindi film '**Bahadur**' won the **Moviebuff Appreciation Award.**

Two short movies, '**Perianayaki**' by Bala Murali Shingade and Suchana Saha's animated film '**Priyo Ami**', received the award under the "Film Bazaar Recommends (FBR)" category.

The French Institute Award by the French Embassy was given to '**Kissa - E - Circus**' by Savita Singh which was showcased in the co-production market.

His daughter Anna Saura accepted the award on behalf of the eminent filmmaker . He has received the **Golden Bear** for Best Director at the Berlin International Film Festival for *Deprisa Deprisa*, along with two Silver Bears for *La caza* and *Peppermint Frappe*, a BAFTA for *Carmen* and three awards at Cannes, among several others.

IFFI Indian Film Personality of the Year Award for 2022

Actor Producer **Chiranjeevi Konidela** has been chosen for the IFFI Indian Film Personality of the Year Award for 2022. Chiranjeevi has starred in more than 150 feature films in Telugu, as well as some films in Hindi, Tamil and Kannada.

He is regarded as one of the most successful and influential actors of Telugu cinema.

In 2006, he was honoured with the **Padma Bhushan**, India's third-highest civilian award, for his contributions to Indian cinema.

Waheeda Rahman, Rajinikanth, Ilaiyaraaja, S. P. Balasubrahmanyam, Amitabh Bachchan, Salim Khan, Biswajit Chatterjee, Hema Malini and Praseen Joshi have been honoured with this award in the past.
